Sale of Food and Drugs acts

a letter from the County auditor explaining cause of delay in forwarding Certificates in connection with adulterated samples to certain Food and Drugs Inspectors was read and considered satisfactory.

Road Contractors' Books

a letter dated 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1916 from the D.C. to the Co. Council enclosing forms of Contractors' Books to which he has added the words "and any two or more of us immediately before we jointly and severally meet" having been read, it was unanimously resolved on the motion of Councillor Dunlop, seconded by Councillor Doherty that the recommendation

Copy resolution of Buncrana R.D. Council requesting the Co. Council to rescind the Contract on road No. 29, in the name of Charles Stewart of Foyles, Ballymore, entered into Nov. 1915, having been read, Councillor Dunlop moved that we refuse to cancel said Contract Councillor Clarke seconded and the matter was unanimously agreed to.

re Erection of Barbed-Wire Fences

Copy resolution of Glenties R.D. Council that this Council is satisfied that a Barbed-Wire Fence on portions of the Co. road, Fintra to Ballyard Bog, is a nuisance and dangerous to persons, animals, or things using the said public road, and we ask the Co. Council to use their powers to have the said Barbed-Wire fence removed, and thus prevent injury to cattle, &c. having been read, it was decided that legal action could be taken against the person who put up the fence by those having cattle, &c. injured.
