On the proposal of Cllr McEniff, seconded by Cllr Campbell the Minutes of the Workshop of the Municipal District of Donegal held on the 1st February 2016 were confirmed.

Corporate Services

Request to re-name "The Mall", Ballyshannon to the "James White Mall"

Ms. B McBrearty advised Members this matter would be placed on the Agenda for the April meeting of the Plenary Council.

Ballintra Sewerage Scheme – Irish Water

Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that the reply to Cllr McEniff in relation to the Ballintra Sewerage Scheme as he had previously requested had issued to him from Irish water.

Office for Members' Use

Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that there is an office available to them for use on the second floor in the Donegal Public Services Centre. In addition she confirmed that any Member wishing to avail of this facility should book it in advance through the Council's Reception on 0749724402. In terms of Fire Safety the Member is required to both sign in / out the Visitors Book for Fire Register purposes.

Housing Services

Progress reports on Grants, Loans, Casual Vacancies, and Social Housing Support Programme

Members noted the update reports on Grants, Loans, and Casual Vacancies, Housing Assistance Payments and Social Housing Support Programme as circulated with the Agenda and presented by Ms. B McBrearty.

Casual Vacancies

In relation to No. 93 Conlin Road, Killybegs, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that this property has been let since the reports had been prepared and also that 56 St. Cummins Hill, Killybegs is ready for letting.

In relation to 3 units in this Municipal District for which there is currently no demand i.e. Carrick, Pettigo and in Dunkineely Ms.

McBrearty informed Members she intended to advertise these as Choice Based Lettings next month.

Grants

Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that the grants are as per report circulated.

Loans

Ms. McBrearty informed Members that no housing loan applications have been received to-date this year and although there have been some enquiries, potential applicants did not meet the minimum income requirements. She also advised that with the new Tenant Incremental Purchase Scheme it is anticipated there will be more interest in loans.

Tenant Incremental Purchase Scheme

In relation to the new Tenant Incremental Purchase Scheme, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that the Council would be writing out to Tenants during mid April advising them of the scheme. In the meanwhile, Ms. McBrearty advised that if Members have any queries in relation to the Tenant Purchase scheme, these can be directed to the Housing Office.

Social Housing Support Programme

In relation to the Building Programme for Donegal Town Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that the project is still with the Department for Stage 2 approval following which it would be ready to move to Part VIII for planning permission.

She also informed Members that the CAS project in Donegal Town will move to Part VIII along with the Donegal Town new builds as referred to above.

In relation to the 22 Units in Ballyshannon, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that another Approved Housing Body is working with a developer in the area and is hopeful that the project will go ahead with approximately.

Ms. B McBrearty updated Members in relation to the house purchases.

Ms. McBrearty also informed Members that developers are engaging with the Approved Housing Bodies in relation to providing social housing in the Municipal District.

Housing Assistance Payments

In relation to HAP, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that there are 750 payments being made under the HAP scheme in the County at present.

In relation to the property inspections, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members that inspections had commenced and any due have been completed. The issues arising to-date from the inspections are Fire Blankets and smoke alarms and these are been addressed by the Landlords.

In response to a query from Cllr Campbell if energy rating forms part of the inspection criteria, Ms. B McBrearty informed Members it does not and that the inspections criteria are based on the Private Rented Tenancies Board rules which are set out in legislation and are available on the PRTB website.

2016 Surface Dressing

Mr. M Sweeney referred to the workshop held on the 1st March 2016 at which the 2016 Surface Dressing Programme was discussed. Members noted the draft programme circulated with the Agenda. On the proposal of Cllr Campbell, seconded by Cllr McEniff, Members confirmed their agreement to the programme as circulated.

2016 Regional and Local Road Improvements Works

Mr. M Sweeney referred to the workshop held on the 1st March 2016 at which the 2016 Regional and Local Improvements Works Programme was discussed. Members noted the draft programme circulated with the Agenda. On the proposal of Cllr Kennedy, seconded by Cllr Campbell, Members confirmed their agreement to the programme as circulated. Members noted an amount of €12,000.00 had to be taken out of the programme due to an amendment in Budgets and that this matter would be discussed with Members in due course.

On the proposal of Cllr Campbell, seconded by Cllr Conaghan, Members confirmed their agreement to the Bridge Strengthening Programme for 2016 as circulated at the workshop.

Mr. M Sweeney confirmed to Members he had circulated an e-mail to Members reporting on the matters raised at the previous meeting.

Members noted the update reports circulated with the Agenda and presented by Mr. Killian Smith, Executive Planner on the following matters:

Mr. K Smith also advised Members in regard to the suggestion that pre-treatment of waste water in Mountcharles in advance of the town being connected to the treatment plant would more or likely not be

Mr. K Smith also referred to the issue raised at the previous meeting in relation to a recent European Commission Direction regarding discharges into Lough Foyle and any impact same would have on this Municipal District. He advised Members the Planning Department had not yet disseminated the information in relation to this Direction and therefore the impact of same if any is not yet determined.

In response to a query from Cllr Campbell, Mr. K Smith confirmed that Mr. Denis Kelly's vacancy has not as yet been filled.

Playgrounds in Bundoran

In response to a request form Cllr McEniff for the Council to inspect the childrens playgrounds in Bundoran with a view to carrying out any necessary repair works, Mr. B McLaughlin informed Members he would investigate this matter and revert to Members at a later date.

ESB, Ballyshannon

Cllr O'Neill made a lengthy submission in relation to specific conditions that had been attached to the planning permission granted to the ESB which he considered had not been met. He expressed his extreme dissatisfaction and asked that the Community & Enterprise Section write to the ESB in Ballyshannon with a view to having this matter address. Mr. B McLaughlin advised that he would have the matter followed up through the Planning Section.

Development Fund Initiative

In response to a query from Cllr Kennedy if the Development Fund Initiative had been advertised, Mr. B McLaughlin informed Members that it had.

Old Railway Tracks

Cllr Kennedy queried if development is allowable on old Railway Tracks but noted that Mr. K Smith had left the meeting owing to other commitments and confirmed she would check the matter with directly with the Planning Office.

MDD/040/16 SCHEDULE OF MUNICIPAL DISTRICT WORKS

Mr. G Martin outlined the background in relation to the preparation of a Schedule of Municipal District Works in respect of maintenance and repair for each MD in accordance with Section 58 of the Local Government Reform Act 2014 which amended Section 103 of the Local Government Act 2001 by inserting a new Section - 103A.

Circular LG27/2014/Fin/21/2014 dated 31st December 2014, provided further detail in relation to the operational application of this relatively new principle within the Municipal District.

Ms. B McBrearty presented the detail of Housing – Appendix 1, Mr. Martin presented Water and Environment - Appendix 2 and Mr. M Sweeney the detail on Roads - Appendix 3 as circulated and attached hereto. Details of the Development Fund for 2016 were provided for information only as this does not form part of the Schedule - See Appendix 4. Following discussion the following resolution was passed by Members:

On the proposal of Cllr Campbell, seconded by Cllr McEniff the Municipal District Members resolved that the Municipal District of Donegal hereby adopt for the financial year ended 31st December 2016, the Schedule of Municipal District Works as set out in Appendices 1(Housing), 2 (Environment), and 3 (Roads), as required by Section 103A of the Local Government Act 2001 (as amended) and in line with the requirements of Circular LG27/2014/Fin21/2014.

Water Services

Following a lengthy submission in relation to Water Services Cllr O'Neill proposed that his request for Water Staff to be in attendance at MD meetings to deal with water queries be conveyed to the Chief Executive. This was seconded by Cllr Jordan.

MDD/041/16 DISCUSSION ON TOWN CLOCK IN BALLYSHANNON

On the proposal of Cllr McEniff, seconded by Cllr Conaghan the following motion was adopted;-

"That this Municipal District discuss the up to date position re the repair of the clock in Ballyshannon".

Members were advised;-

"Council Staff met with the Property owner on February 16th at the request of Cllr Mc Eniff and provided the owner with information on funding sources that may be available for them to apply to This included the Heritage Council Management Grant Scheme closing on March 7th, with a view to engaging in a phased programme of works to restore the face of the clock. The property

owner considered the potential grant support under this scheme unsatisfactory.

The property owner did not apply for the Conservation Grant Scheme advertised in October 2015 for an allocation in 2016, administered through Donegal County Council. A total of €50,000 was allocated across the county to 8 successful applicants.

The Property owner may consider preparing an application for the next round of the Rural Development Programme and could seek to make this through Donegal Local Development Company Ltd."

Mr. Martin advised that the response reflected the fact that there has been engagement with the property owner. However the difficulty is that there are no budgets available for this type of work to private property and that he should therefore examine funding avenues available to him through the different programmes e.g. Rural Development Programme. Cllr McEniff undertook to discuss the matter with the owner again.

MDD/042/16 DISCUSSION ON ACCESS TO TULLAN STRAND, BUNDORAN

On the proposal of Cllr O'Neill, seconded by Cllr McEniff the following motion was adopted;-

"That this Municipal District immediately address the development of a proper access to Tullan Strand in Bundoran ahead of the Summer season for the general public and for the Bundoran Surf Industry and that the Municipal District hold a Special Meeting with the Surf Industry Representatives to discuss a development plan for same."

Members were advised;-

"The proposition to develop a sustainable long term access to Tullan Strand is progressing at present with a range of landowners and other stakeholders having being consulted already and with a number of additional stakeholders due to be consulted in the coming weeks.

This will include ongoing engagement with the surfing industry, one of the relevant stakeholders in question.

Funding that was ring-fenced by the former Bundoran Town Council remains in place to facilitate the completion of any works on the appropriate conclusion of discussions with interested parties.

It should be noted that these works in any event will not be completed in advance of the 2016 Summer season."

Cllr O'Neill contended that it was disappointing that another season would pass without work to complete the access issue at Tullan

Strand. He appealed to the Council to have another meeting with the relevant stakeholders to provide short term measure to this issue. A lengthy discussion took place in relation to the matter. Members noted that there are a lot of complexities, sensitivities and stakeholders affected by the matter and that a long term sustainable solution is what is required which is safe for users. In conclusion, Mr. Martin confirmed to Members he would be available to meet with the Surf Industry again and it was intention to work transparently and openly with all stakeholders to have the matter resolved satisfactorily.

MEMBERS NOTED THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:-

MDD/043/16 Old Millstone Hotel Site in Ballyshannon

The following question was submitted by Cllr O'Neill;-

"Will this Municipal District seek a meeting with the owners of the old Millstone Hotel site on Main Street in Ballyshannon to see what plans are being considered for the Town Centre site as it's too long derelict for a prime location?"-

Cllr O'Neill was informed that:-

"Yes, contact will be made with Apex and a report will be provided to each member thereafter"

MDD/044/16 Portnason Industrial Park, Ballyshannon

The following question was submitted by Cllr O'Neill;-

"What are both the Council and the Local Enterprise Office doing to encourage business and further development at the Portnason Industrial Park?"-

Cllr O'Neill was informed that:-

"Donegal County Council are actively promoting and developing all sites with Economic Development potential owned by Donegal County Council including Portnason Industrial Park, Ballyshannon. The sites are advertised on all Donegal County Councils related websites under the heading of Economic Development lands.websites. Donegal County Council are currently working on a brouchure to promote all Economic Development sites within the County.

The Design team are currently working on options to improve the entrance to the Portnason Industrial Park which will include

enhancement works and works are planned to be carried out in 2016. Servicing of additional sites within the park will be progressed as and when the market demands.

Background

The table above details clean –ups and beach maintenance with the various distributions per each MD.

In both cases it is proposed that these will be centrally managed to give maximum flexibility to respond to priorities in a county wide context. An example would be instances of large scale dumping being more prevalent in one area than another and similarly with unexpected maintenance/repair work at beaches. As a consequence it is difficult to suggest that an MD has discretion for the spend. However, we do clearly provide for indicative expenditure on an area by area basis as set out in the schedule circulated.

- 1 TII allocations must be spent in accordance with the NRA Memorandum on Road Grants.
- 2 TII allocations announced to date do not contain any allocation for HD 28, High Collision Locations or Crash Barrier repairs. It is expected that funding under these headings will be announced by TII aimed at specific locations on the national road network in the coming months.
- 3 DTTAS allocations must be spent in compliance with DTTAS Circular RW1/2016 and the Memorandum on Nonnational Road Grants.
- 4 Winter maintenance budget is weather dependent and will be supplemented as necessary from the OR Contingency Reserve.
- 5 DTTAS Circular RW1/2016 permits LAs to use up to 15% of their Discretionary Grant for Local Improvement Schemes (LIS). Elected Members at Municipal District level may provide for an LIS programme in their SMDW on this basis if they wish.
- 6 DTTAS Circular RW1/2016 permits LAs to use up to 7.5% of their Restoration Improvement (RI) and Restoration Maintenance (RM) funding for Community Involvement Schemes (CIS). Elected Members at Municipal District level may provide for a CIS programme in their SMDW on this basis however it is recommended that RM monies are not used for this purpose.
- 7 As per 2015 €657,000 has been allocated to those MDs now incorporating former Town Councils (FTC) to replace the FTC OR allocations made previously. This has been distributed according to the amounts of OR allocated by the TCs in 2014
- As per 2015 specific provision has again been made in the Council's Budget 2016 for Street Sweeping. In previous years street sweeping was funded from roads general maintenance monies and only the former Town Councils made specific allocation. As such Donegal, Inishowen & Letterkeny MDs have received a specific amount for street sweeping and the remainder has been included in Roads OR. MDs may provide for street sweeping from their Roads OR as normal in accordance with their individual preferences.
- 9 Parks and Open Spaces budget provision for 2016 has been distributed in the same manner as 2015 which was based on 2013 expenditure under this heading.
- 10 Moville Green has been separately budgeted as per historic commitments.
- 11 It is expected that Roads Own Resources funds will continue to be spent as normal as per the following breakdown:

Note to Municipal District Workshops (April 2016)

RE: Preparation of Tier 2 LAP

To further inform the preparation of the draft Tier 2 Local Area Plan, and as an output of the report on the preliminary consultation period during August/ September 2015 already considered by Members, a further and 2nd preliminary consultation period commenced on 27th January 2016 through to 29th February 2016. The period provided for written submissions and was also facilitated through a series of public drop- in events held in each town.

ENVIRONMENT SECTION REPORT APRIL 2016.

Big Donegal Clean Up'16

This years campaign was successfully launched by Donegal Footballer Neil Gallagher and Cathaoirleach Cllr Ciaran Brogan. A number of clean ups have already taken place with Easter being a busy weekend for clean ups across the County. Promotion of the clean up will continue through the use of social media, online advertising and local radio and press.

Spring Anti - Litter awareness campaign

Over the month of April the Council's promotional activities will focus on an anti -litter message targeting roadside litter, dog fouling and promoting community clean ups. This is carried out by advertising on local radio, online advertising, print media and using social media.

Dog Fouling

Free poop scoops are now available at all Council Public Service Centres and we would encourage dog owners to avail of the free poop scoop bags or use any bag and dispose of the dog mess in the appropriate manner. An advertising campaign is also underway with this message.

Home Composting

Home compost bins are available from all Council Public Services Centres for only $\in 13$. 1/3 of all waste can be composted such as fruit and vegetable peelings. By composting these types of waste we reduce the waste in our bins and we make our own compost which is a wonderful resource for our gardens. A book on home composting will be given out with every bin sold.

Recycling.

Donegal County Council continues expand its Bring Bank sites across the county, with new site been identified in Letterkenny and Stranorlar. Additionally the Council is conducting a process of renewing old and damaged banks with new stock on an ongoing basis. The Council is actively looking for new sites and any assistance in this search would be appreciated.

Priority Beach Works

A list of beach priority works has been drafted following direction of An Taisce re Criteria Compliance to retain Blue Flag and Green Coast status and recent Irish Water Safety beach risk assessment recommendations. Immediate works are pending for Dooey, Killahoey and Drumnatinney.

Downings beach access was improved ahead of the Easter holidays as the access path was badly choked with sand.

Designated Bathing Areas

The EPA has just awarded Donegal County Council two additional Designated Bathing Area status for Dooey and Magheroarty beaches. This brings our total to 21 (or 15%) of the total 140 beaches Nationally.

Coastal Erosion

- A very productive meeting was held with An Mhacháire le Chéile Teo to address erosion issues affecting the <u>Maghery</u> area. Coastal Officer is progressing the issues agreed.
- An application is in Preparation to the NPWS to address the erosion issue on <u>Magherawarden</u> beach by the local river. Work is necessary to divert the river flow toward the sea. The erosion has an obvious impact re land loss but also potential deterioration in water quality.
- A meeting was held with management of <u>Carrickfinn</u> Airport re accretion issues affecting the airport and locality. With their input, an application can be made to the OPW for funding to assess the situation.
- Approval was received from the OPW to progress and seek an appropriate contractor to assess the coastal erosion issues in Inishowen from Clonmany to Malin Head.

Beach Sea Mammals

Under the Wildlife (Amendment) Act 1976-2005, all cetaceans and seals are protected species listed on the 5th Schedule. There is an obligation to protect these animals should they arrive on our shores (alive or dead). Also, there is a scientific interest to record the details of such events to track and monitor trends. Such recording can allow the introduction of measures to reduce/prevent deaths. Again, this is an obligation under the Wildlife (Amendment) Act 1976-2005.

A very productive meeting was held with the County Vet where a draft policy policy on dealing with beached sea mammals (dead or alive) was presented. The Litter Wardens, Mobile Litter Units, etc, were supportive of the policy. This policy is the first developed in the country with input from all relevant agencies.

Beach Lifequards

Interviews are being held to appoint seasonal beach lifeguards for 14 beaches across the County. Supporting infrastructure (Lifeguard Stations, ringbuoys, toilets, uniforms, etc) is also currently being procured.

Access for All

A Loughs Agency sponsored beach wheelchair will be delivered this week to Rathmullan Water Sports and Sailing School for use by them over the 2016 season. This will enable access to the water and beach by the group's members of all abilities. This will be a valuable pilot project.

DCC is making arrangements for a long term loan of our Loughs Agency sponsored pontoon hoist to Gartan Outdoor Centre. This hoist is used to transfer disabled water enthusiasts from land to vessel safely. It was previously used in the Greencastle Marina but has been replaced with a permanent hoist.

Public Conveniences

PC Assessment

An assessment is nearing completion on the Public Convenience status at each of the 24 locations county wide. There are additional portaloo services provided both seasonally and annually. These have been excluded from this initial assessment.

These services are being reviewed in consultation with Michael Hanley re the Health and Safety of the facilities as a place of work for our staff.

Initial costs have been sought for improvement works at Bundoran, Dungloe, Arranmore Island, Ballywhoriskey, Dunfanaghy, Downings and Moville.
