#### Housing Services

Progress reports on Grants, Loans, Casual Vacancies, and Housing Capital Programme, Tenant Purchase Scheme 2016, Housing Assistance Payments/Private Rented Inspections and Lease & Repair Scheme and Housing Need

Members noted the update reports on Grants, Loans, and Casual Vacancies, Tenant Purchase Scheme, Housing Assistance Payments, Private Rented Inspections, Housing Capital Programme, Housing Need in the MD, and Leasing & Repair Scheme as circulated with the Agenda and presented by Mr. P Sheerin.

#### **Casual Vacancies and Maintenance Repairs**

Cllr McMahon, Cllr Sweeny and Cllr Kennedy queried the number of vacancies within the Ballyshannon area and the refurbishment turnaround times. P Sheerin advised that there is a number of vacant properties in Ballyshannon that require substantial work and funding is targeted appropriately to ensure the houses are brought up to current standards. In terms of maintenance repairs, P Sheerin informed Members that unfortunately there is a shortage of contractors within this area, however, an additional contractor with good capacity has been appointed recently and the Donegal MD has a member of staff who is currently servicing heating systems as part of a pilot project within the Municipal District.

#### Housing Assistance Payment (HAP)

Cllr Kennedy queried if the standards Landlords are required to adhere to when renting property under the HAP Scheme could be relaxed and noted that Donegal's average payments under the HAP Scheme is €395, which is somewhat lower than other counties. P Sheerin advised that Local Authorities and Landlords are obliged to adhere to the Housing (Standards for Rented Houses) Regulations 2019. Within 8 months of a tenant taking up a HAP property the Local Authority is required to carry out an inspection of the property to ensure it is fully compliant. P Sheerin further advised the HAP rent limits are set nationally for each county and these differ from County to County and would be higher in the more urban areas.

#### Phase III Housing Development in Donegal Town

Cllr N Jordan welcomed Phase III of the housing development in Donegal Town reaching preliminary design stage. Cllr N Jordan recommended utilising derelict properties in towns and villages to facilitate social housing requirements.

#### Christmas Lights – Donegal Town & Bundoran

The members agreed to allocate €6,000 from the Donegal Town Pay & Display fund to towards the Donegal Town Christmas lights and €1,500 from the Bundoran Pay & Display fund for the Bundoran Christmas lights.

Mr. M Sweeney presented the details of a Proposed Section 183 – Disposal of Lands at Séne Lane, Donegal Town, Co. Following a discussion, on the proposal of Cllr Conaghan, seconded by Cllr Naughton, Members confirmed their agreement to the proposed Section 183 and noted the matter would be on the Agenda for the Plenary Council meeting in the New Year.

#### Proposed One Way Systems for Killybegs & Donegal Town

On the proposal of Cllr McMahon and seconded by Cllr Naughton it was agreed to proceed with the proposed one way system for Killybegs. The Members agreed to revise the proposed one way system for Donegal Town and that the Part VIII for the full one way system when prepared could go to the Plenary Council to initiate the Public Consultation.

#### Bundoran Signage

Cllr McMahon advised that signage repair was required at the Finner Road roundabout in Bundoran and at the Astoria junction. M Sweeney advised signage on the National routes are dealt with by the NRO office and undertook to refer same to the National Roads Office.

#### Steps at Ballyshannon Port

Cllr McMahon advised that the steps at the Port in Ballyshannon require upgrading as they are currently a potential slip hazard. M Sweeney agreed to review same with the landowner.

#### Flooding at Creevy

Cllr McMahon advised that due to flooding a bridge at Creevy requires piping. The adjacent landowner is willing to assist with the repair works. M Sweeney agreed to review same with the landowner.

#### **Bundoran Golf Club - Signage**

Cllr Naughton queried if the Roads Section could erect signage for the Golf Club in Bundoran. M Sweeney advised as this was a private enterprise, a Section 254 application should be independently submitted to the Planning Department by the Golf Club.

#### Junction at Cavangarden, Ballyshannon

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the discussion held with the Gardai and Bus Eireann regarding the safety concerns at the Cavangarden junction however noted that the vision lines may require review. Mr M Sweeney advised the TII are aware of this junction and are currently considering options.

#### Irish Water works on the Rossnowlagh Road

Cllr Sweeny advised the recent works carried out by Irish Water on the Rossnowlagh Road has resulted in water pooling on the road surface. M Sweeney advised the current work is temporary and will discuss same with the Irish Water to ascertain the timeframe for the permanent works.

#### Signage at Abbey Graveyard

Cllr Sweeny queried if the position of the signage at the junction adjacent to the Abbey Graveyard could be reviewed as they are currently creating visibility issues. M Sweeney agreed to review the position of the signage.

#### EuroVelo Signage

Cllr Sweeny advised that in some areas around Ballyshannon the EuroVelo signage are pointing in the wrong direction. M Sweeney advised these signs were erected recently. B McLaughlin advised the position of the signs will be considered; however, the Trails Officer position is vacant, at present.

#### **Coastal Erosion at Kildoney**

Cllr Sweeny advised that coastal erosion is occurring at Kildoney. M Sweeney agreed to discuss this further with Cllr Sweeney.

#### Bruckless Road Markings & St John's Point Road Lining

Cllr Kennedy queried if the red road markings could be laid again in Bruckless and the road lining be completed at St John's Point. M Sweeney advised these road markings will be renewed as part of the next surfacing works.

#### Killaghtee Junction (Dunkineely)

Cllr Kennedy advised that the Gardai have provided a report on the Killaghtee junction and will forward a copy of same to the Roads Section.

#### Fintra Bridge

Cllr Kennedy emphasised the importance of moving the Fintra Bridge project forward.

#### Laghey Junction

Cllr Jordan thanked the work of the Roads Team and advised as a result of a Parliamentary Question by Deputy Pearse Doherty, the Council is required to prepare a report on previous collisions and proposed design solutions. M Sweeney advised that the Road Design office is currently reviewing this junction. Based on their findings, the report will then be submitted to the NRO. Cllr Sweeny advised he had raised this junction at the TII meeting last week.

#### Lough Eske Junction

Cllr Jordan advised that he understood the TII are considering not closing the Birchhill junction and that the options at this location will go to public consultation. M Sweeney advised that proposals for the junction are with the TII and three options are currently being considered.

Cllr Kennedy requested the Group be invited to the next Municipal District meeting in January and to also display their winning entry in the Public Service Centre and this was agreed.

#### **Air Pollution**

Cllr Naughton referred to the smoky coal report and noted whilst it is extremely important to ensure our air quality is of the highest standards, here in Donegal the majority of houses are heated using peat and turf. There is a need to ensure the proper infrastructure is in place before certain bans are implemented. F Kelly advised that there is national talks being held however new policies may be held up for legal reasons.

#### **Recycling Facilities & Cameras**

Cllr Sweeny thanked the Environment Team for their work throughout the year. Cllr Sweeny noted the value for money that can be obtained by dropping off paper and cardboard at local recycling centres. Cllr Sweeny and Cllr McMahon sought an update on the security cameras adjacent to the waste collection banks in Ballyshannon and Bundoran and suggested a workshop is arranged to discuss further. Cllr Sweeny further advised that the site at Ballyshannon requires maintenance as there is a tree growing out of a wall adjacent to the collection banks. F Kelly advised that replacement cameras are erected when a camera has been taken away for analysis. Cllr Jordan suggested that covert cameras would be preferable at these locations and Ms Kelly advised that covert cameras are used at more remote locations and Ms Kelly also advised that the Senior Engineer is currently scoping out the current procedures and will report back early next year. F Kelly agreed to highlight the need for maintenance at the Ballyshannon site.

In response to a request from Cllr Jordan for an update on the Rezoning request received, and if the matter could be dealt with, as it may require a variation on the Donegal Town Local Area Plan, Ms. A Greene informed Members that the Senior Planner would be in contact with Members in due course to discuss this matter.

# MDD/160/19 DISCUSSION ON A REQUEST TO SEEK FUNDING FOR 'HALLS JUNCTION', KILCAR

On the proposal of Cllr Kennedy, seconded by Cllr Jordan the following motion was adopted;-

" That this MD of Donegal takes action and urgently seeks road safety funding for the dangerous junction known as Halls Junction, Kilcar."

Members were given a response to the motion by the Area Manager, Roads / Transportation

In proposing her motion, Cllr Kennedy referred to the incidents that have occurred at this junction in recent years and also referred to the requests from An Garda Siochana, Kilcar Parish Council and others to have safety works carried out on this Junction. She also referred to the steep incline at this junction. Cllr Kennedy referred to the increase in traffic in this area with the Wild Atlantic Way etc. and stressed the importance of improving this junction in the interests of safety.

In seconding the motion, Cllr Jordan submitted that he was fully supportive of the motion and that the junction is probably the biggest roads issue in the Municipal District after Fintra Bridge and that it will take substantial funding to carry out the necessary works.

Mr. M Sweeney also submitted it is anticipated that the Director of Roads will be convening a county-wide workshop to discuss prioritising such projects in each Municipal District in the New Year. He further informed Members that the Road Design Section has already commenced on preparatory design works on Halls Junction and agreed that this is a necessary priority for the MD which would require a major scheme and associated funding.

#### MDD/161/19 DISCUSSION ON UNFINISHED HOUSING ESTATES IN THE SOUTHWEST CONSTITUENCY

On the proposal of Cllr McMahon, seconded by Cllr Naughton the following motion was adopted;-

"That this M.D make known all the unfinished housing estates in the southwest constituency."

Cllr McMahon in speaking to his motion welcomed the response received and submitted it is important for persons to know the unfinished estates in the District and in particular anyone seeking to purchase a house. Cllr Naughton seconded the motion.

#### MDD/162/19 DISCUSSION ON CALL TO BAN SALE OF SMARTPHONES AND TABLETS TO CHILDREN UNDER 13 YEARS OF AGE

On the proposal of Cllr Naughton, seconded by Cllr McMahon the following motion was adopted;-

" That this Municipal District call on Minister for Communications, Climate Action and Environment Mr. Richard Bruton and Minister for Children, and Youth Affairs Ms. Katherine Zappone to ban the sale of smartphones and tablets to children under 13 years of age".

In speaking to his motion, Cllr Naughton submitted he intends to submit the same motion to the Plenary Council in January 2020. He made a lengthy submission in support of his motion including in particular the following issues for young children using smart devices;-

- Access to Pornography
- Lack of hand eye co-ordination due to over use of smart phones rather than traditional play methods for younger children
- Access to all kinds of harmful websites
- Lack of regulation on young children using such devices
- The impact of exposure to such material in later life on young children
- The importance that something positive could be done to protect young children
- Feedback from Teachers and Doctors on the effects of such devices on young children
- The need to start a debate on such issues

In tandem with the above construction programme, the Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available. In this regard, the Council has identified suitable lands in Ballyshannon which are currently at contract / conveyance stage.

#### 2. House Acquisition Programme

Donegal County Council has acquired, or is in the process of acquiring, properties under the House Acquisition Programme. In the Donegal Municipal District during 2018-2019, 4 properties were purchased under this programme. Additionally there are 4 property acquisitions currently in progress which are progressing through conveyance.

Following acquisition and prior to allocation to approved applicants on the social housing list, improvement works are carried out on the properties to provide high quality, sustainable homes to individuals and families throughout the county.

#### 3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council initiated a turnkey acquisition public procurement process in early 2018 seeking to acquire social housing through turnkey acquisition developments. A competitive dialogue procurement process is continuing to be progressed to enable the Council to accelerate the delivery of social housing throughout the county. This process requested submissions for a total of 17 towns across the county from Developers in a position to deliver (i) completed units, (ii) units under construction and (iii) units to be constructed on suitable sites, within a reasonable timescale.

The Council has received a significant response to this process. Submitted proposals have been assessed at appropriate stages and remaining valid proposals are being worked through for the following towns in the Donegal Municipal District:

#### Ballyshannon

It should be noted that multiple submissions have been received from some towns and the Council is continuing to dialogue with developers in relation to valid submissions in the above towns with the aim of progressing these turnkey proposals to approval stage.






Response:	Under the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan agreement signed between Donegal County Council and the National Biodiversity Data Centre in November 2019, Donegal County Council has committed to adopting a cross- directorate approach that considers the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan in its policies, plans and management decisions. Furthermore, it has committed to undertake a number of actions each year to help pollinators. The National Biodiversity Data Centre has outlined 30 potential actions that local authorities can take to help pollinators and Donegal County Council will report annually on progress. It is intended that a cross- directorate meeting will be established to explore how some of these actions can be implemented for 2020. Expertise and experience exists within Buncrana Tidy Towns that can be drawn upon in relation to implementing All-Ireland Pollinator Award for the third year in a row and the National Biodiversity Data Centre will provide a short workshop for staff on a cross-directorate basis to provide advice on actions selected by Donegal County Council and to help identify other All-Ireland Pollinator Plan actions that local community groups and schools can do in relation to the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan are available from the County Donegal Heritage Office or on-line at www.pollinators.

Response:	The inspection of the facility by the structural engineer has highlighted that remedial rather than replacement works may be suitable with respect to various elements of the structure. This may result in a more economic solution than had been expected. Given this further investigation is now underway with respect to various details and costs. This further investigation has delayed the completion of the report. It is hoped that this report can be completed by mid February. In parallel with progressing the recommendations of the report consideration will be given to how a public convenience service may be provided within Ballyshannon in the interim and in the long term.
