He submitted that it is not acceptable there is an ambulance stationed in Killybegs which has no crew leaving a single ambulance to cover the area from Dunkineely to Glencolmcille. On the proposal of Cllr O'Neill, seconded by Cllr Kennedy it was agreed that an invitation issue to the National Ambulance Service for a representative to attend the next MD meeting.

A number of comments/queries were dealt with at the meeting.

The following follow up issues were noted;-

In response to a request from Cllr Conaghan that the lighting not working at the roundabouts on Donegal Town Bypass to be repaired, Ms. C Campbell undertook to follow this up with the TII.

In response to a request from Cllr Conaghan for the lights on the Quay in Donegal Town to be repaired, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members he would report this issue.

In response to a request from Cllr O'Neill for the Cavangarden - Cashelard Junction on the Ballyshannon Road to be lighted, Ms. C Campbell undertook to refer this matter to the TII..

In response to a query from Cllr Campbell if 'missing' lights can be reported for repair (i.e., lights not on the system), Ms. C Campbell requested that these should be referred through the Local Roads Office.

### Follow up issues from previous meeting

Mr. M Sweeney noted he had forwarded an update on matters raised at the previous meeting via e-mail to Members.

### **Demolish old Fire Station in Donegal Town**

Mr. M Sweeney referred to previous discussion on the demolition of the old Fire Station in Donegal Town for use as additional car parking. He advised that the cost is in the region of €25,000.00 and sought Members agreement to fund this out of Pay & Display monies. On the proposal of Cllr O'Neill, seconded by Cllr Kennedy, this was agreed.

### **Tullan Strand**

Cllr O'Neill requested under Environment that a full update be provided on access to Tullan Strand at the next MD Workshop. He made particular reference to recent public comment on the 'no bathing' element of the recommendation and asked if Donegal County Council intended to implement the recommendations of Irish Water Safety Risk Assessment report. Members agreed that Mr. David Friel and Mr. Eamon Boyle be requested to attend the workshop on Tuesday the 27<sup>th</sup> March 2018 to provide a full briefing and update.

### **Clean Ups**

Cllr Kennedy referred to a recent coastal clean up that was undertaken by volunteers last Sunday with support from the Council. Killybegs will be considered among all the other Towns & Villages throughout County and any 'Expression of Interest' will be assessed against the criteria set by the Department when the Scheme is announced later in the year.

Cllr Kennedy in speaking to her motion submitted she feels that Killybegs needs regeneration in particular in relation to footpaths and over head wires to support the cruise shops and the businesses in the town and given that Bridge Street is one of the oldest residential area in the County.

Cllr O'Neill also spoke in support of the motion.

Donegal County Council will be hosting the HERICOAST Workshop and meetings with the International partners from the 24<sup>th</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018, and this is an opportunity to showcase the enormity of the coastal heritage asset we have. The 35 European delegates (approximately) will be based at the Shandon Hotel, following requisite procurement rules. The project team are working closely with Norway, the project lead, to agree on a schedule of meetings, events and field trips for the event, and the project team shall update the County Councilors when the detail becomes available.

# Chief Executive Report on Proposed Additions to the Record of Protected Structures to Donegal Municipal District Meeting 10th April 2018



#### Additions to the Record of Protected Structures

### 1.0 Introduction

At full Pleanary meeting held on the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2017 a strategy for a phased approach to the additions to the Record of Protected Structures was discussed. It was resolved that decisions on additions to the Record of Protected Structures were to be taken at a Municipal District level (as provided for under Section 131A of the Local Government Act, 2001 and Schedule 14A, Part 2).

This is the work programme following on from the Additions in 2017. It consists of a total number of 12 structures which have been proposed by either a Member of the Public or the owner of the structure, to be added to the Record of Protected Structures (RPS), over the past year.

Out of the 12 proposed additions to the Record of Protected Structures it is considered that 1 structure does not have sufficient merit to be added.

There are 4 proposed structures in the Donegal Municipal District consisting of two bridges and two residential properties and these are set out in Appendix 1 of this document. There is a photo and location map together with the NIAH ref number, the name and address, a description of the structure together with the individual rating and importance values of the structure.

### 2.0 Background

Progress to date within the last two months/quarter 1 - inclusive of current status	Marine Tourism Conference A Marine Tourism Conference took place on the 8 <sup>th</sup> March 2018 in the Shandon Hotel, Dunfanaghy. Hosted by Donegal County Council over 200 people registered for the event which was cofunded by the Marine Institute. Keynote speakers included world adventurer Monty Halls, Naomh McElhatton, digital marketing expert from House of Comms, Thomas Furey from the Marine Institute, Beckey-Finn Britton from Clean Coasts and a local business case study provided by Jim Muldowney. The CE of Donegal County Council and Cathaoirleach gave the opening addresses at this event. The afternoon featured a workshop facilitated by Naomh McElhatton on the development of online marketing strategy for marine tourism businesses. A number of organisations and agencies attended to provide promotional stands with information about their services and supports. There was good representation from cross-border local authorities and other agencies.  Welcome Anchorages 2018 The front cover of Welcome Anchorages 2018 showcases the new marina in Killybegs and there is an editorial piece within
	the magazine all about the MalinWaters regions including Donegal. This has been distributed to marinas and information centres in the UK and Ireland.  Wildsea Europe  While EU funding for this project has ended, a board meeting took place on 21 <sup>st</sup> February 2018 to discuss the future of the project. It has been decided that the network of partners will

provide a financial contribution for 2018 to continue the marketing activity for the website and to provide a resource for the continued development of the booking engine that will provide support for SME's on booking management and also work on marketing activities. New partners have now joined the network including Forum Oceano (Portugal), Visit Cornwall, the WCA (World Cetacean Alliance). The WAOH project which has been recently launched is the follow up to Wildsea Europe and will provide more EU funding to further develop the network.

# Project Targets for the next bi-monthly/quarter 2 2018 reporting period

#### **Monty Halls Campaign**

Following the Marine Tourism Conference the Tourism Unit is working with Monty Halls on a campaign to promote Donegal as a family friendly adventure destination.

### **MalinWaters Marketing Activity**

The funding call for MalinWaters events sponsorship closed on **28**<sup>th</sup> **February 2018** 

#### **ISLE Tourism Project**

The ISLE Tourism Project, led by Donegal County Council and partner Udáras na Gaeltachta has been successfully funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine under the CEDRA (Commission for the Economic Development of Rural Areas) programme. The Tourism Impact Study is being finalised at the moment and will be made public in April 2018. The training course at LYIT is ongoing and will be finished in May 2018. Photos of the islands have been procured and will be used in promotional materials. Signage is in development.

#### **CAPITEN**

The EU funded CAPITEN project is now underway. Donegal County Council is responsible for a number of elements including the production of a Marketing Plan and a template of guidelines for event organisers. Terms of reference for the production of the Marketing Plan have been sent out to potential suppliers.

#### **WAOH Project**

Donegal County Council is responsible for a number of elements of the WAOH project as follows and will be working on these in coming months:

- The mapping of the WAOH route will involve the identification of key dive sites in the partner regions. A number of stakeholder engagement workshops across County Donegal for this project.
- Development of a Marketing Plan for the route.
- A social media/familiarisation trip.
- Further development of the Wildsea.eu website.
- Information workshops.
- Participation at targeted trade shows with opportunities for local SME's to participate.

#### **MalinWaters**

A Marketing Plan and budget are in development for MalinWaters. This was pending the responses from partners in relation to membership and funding contribution for MalinWaters in 2018. A meeting of the MalinWaters partnership will be held in April 2018.

#### **Marine Tourism Newsletter**

Further updates will be sent out to over 200 marine tourism contacts via the e-mail newsletter.

#### **Blueway Opportunities**

The possibility of creating sections of 'Blueway' in Donegal along our coastline is being investigated. Donegal County Council has been liaising with Waterways Ireland in relation to the development of Blueways.

#### SeaFest 2018

Donegal County Council Tourism Unit will be exhibiting at SeaFest 2018. This is an excellent opportunity to promote Donegal to both the domestic and international market and to encourage visitors to travel to the North West over more commonly travelled routes to the south of Ireland. SeaFest 2017 attracted over 100k visitors and over 800 brochures, maps and other promotional materials were distributed at the event.
