MINUTES OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING HELD IN THE CHAMBER, CARNDONAGH ON TUESDAY 19th APRIL 2016 AT 2.00pm

16.28 Mayoral Chain of Office

Cllr Rena Donaghey began by welcoming everyone to the meeting. Cllr Donaghey informed the members that the new Chain of Office for the Cathaoirleach of the Inishowen Municipal District had been received. Mr John McLaughlin, Director of Service to the Inishowen Municipal District formally presented the chain of office to the Cathaoirleach.

Cllr Donaghey stated that it was a great honour to be presented with the chain. Cllr Donaghey added that Buncrana Town Council had a mayoral chain that was always worn with great honour and dignity by the first citizen at civic occasions and she was humbled and honoured to be the first bearer of the new Inishowen Municipal District chain of office.

16.29 Drowning tragedy in Buncrana

The Cathaoirleach Cllr Donaghey called on the members to stand for a minute silence in memory of the victims of the drowning tragedy in Buncrana. She praised the contribution of the emergency services on the night and commended the courage and bravery of Davitt Walsh his partner Stephanie Knox and all those who took part in the rescue and recovery operation on the night. Cllr Donaghey paid a special tribute to Louise James for her courage and dignity in the face of such a tragedy and enormous loss and that she is an inspiration to the whole community.

A minute silence was observed.

16.30 Consideration of the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District Meeting held on 15th March 2016.

On the proposal of Cllr Nicholas Crossan, seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott, the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District meeting held on 15th March 2016 were agreed.

16.31 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES

Aideen Doherty, Area Manager for Housing & Corporate Services stated that the Housing Update Report was circulated with the agenda and that she would take it as read.

Cllr McGuinness requested that the members are provided with a report detailing all lands in Inishowen in the ownership of the Donegal County Council that are available for Housing.

Cllr McGuinness acknowledged that the membership of the MICA expert panel has been finalised. He added that it is important that Donegal County Council Engineering staff liaise closely with the expert panel and that Donegal County Council plays its full part in the process. Cllr McGuinness asked how many Council properties are affected by the MICA problem

Cllr Doherty also welcomed Minister Coffey's announcement but expressed disappointment that it is expected to take six months for the panel to issue its report. Cllr Doherty stated that the Council should request that the panel expedites its investigations and issues a report in a shorter period of time.

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16.32 COMMUNITY & ENTERPRISE

Paddy Doherty, Divisional Manager presented the Community & Enterprise report to the members.

16.32.01 Malin Head

The Divisional Manager stated that the Council is expecting to receive the formal letter of offer this week comprising funding of almost €400,000. The Council has also made an application to Failte Ireland for Technical Assistance support towards cost of a masterplan proposal which will include detailed design, costing and related studies required for the development of a Wild Atlantic Way signature Discovery point at Malin Head.

Cllr McDermott expressed his frustration at the lack of progress made to date with the project. He stated that Failte Ireland must respond more quickly to ensure that the project is delivered.

Cllr McGuinness expressed his support for Cllr McDermott adding that a meeting with representatives of Failte Ireland should be sought to clarify the issues and to keep all stakeholders informed.

Cllr Doherty expressed disappointment that the vacant C & E post in Inishowen has not yet been filled. He added that the unavailability of a C & E representative in the area is causing a delay in the delivery of the C & E programme in the Municipal District.

16.32.02 Ferry Services

The Divisional Manager informed the members that the Swilly Ferry operator has been in discussions with Donegal County Council regarding the service in 2016. He added that the operator is prepared to enter into a four year deal to provide the service if the Council is agreeable.

The Divisional Manager stated that the Foyle Ferry Service has been advertised on eTenders, with a closing date for receipt of completed tenders of Friday 29th April 2016.

The was broad agreement amongst the members that the delay going to tender for the Foyle Ferry is very disappointing and it was acknowledged that the delay was not on the part of Donegal County Council. However given that the matter is currently the subject of a live tender process, no further discussion was held.

The members welcomed the proposal to run the Swilly Ferry service on a multi-year basis. It was acknowledged that this arrangement will benefit the local tourism providers with their strategic market planning.

16.32.03 Peace IV

The Divisional Manager advised that the Council will be developing a Peace IV Partnership and Peace IV Action Plan over the coming months. This will involve a public consultation in each of the Municipal Districts. Donegal has received an allocation of €5,552,691 under the Peace IV Programme.

16.32.04 Rural Development Programme / LEADER

The Divisional Manager advised that the Donegal Local Community Development Company has expressed an interest in relation to the LEADER/Rural Development Programme with a view to being the Local Action Group for County Donegal. Donegal LCDC will lead on the preparation and implementation on the next phase of the LEADER/RDP in the county as a whole. It is anticipated that following discussions with the Department that the Leader programme could be open for applications in July/August.

16.32.05 Aire de Service

The three locations for the installation of the Aire de Service facilities are Carndonagh, Maghery and Magheraroarty. Work at the Carndonagh site will be completed in May.

16.32.06 Buncrana School Campus

The Divisional Manager advised that further information has been requested from the Department of Education & Skills on 17th February 2016. Eamon Boyle, Executive Engineer is currently assessing the request in order to preparing the Council's response.

Cllr Murray expressed his appreciation for the prompt repair to the playground equipment in Buncrana. He also welcomed the progress with the project at Malin Head and stated that the Council should give consideration to developing the tourism potential of An Grianan Aileach.

Cllr Martin McDermott congratulated Donegal County Council for their hard work preparing the Local Economic and Community Plan. He added that it is imperative that funding now comes available.

Cllr Canning concurred adding that the work and effort will assist the speedy delivery of projects.

Cllr Farren stated that repairs are required for Moville playground. He added that he had already informed the Executive Engineer, Eamon Boyle.

Cllr Doherty praised the work done to deliver the playground at Clós Phadraig. Referring to the REDZ project for Carndonagh and to the meeting held earlier with the local Tidy Towns Committee, Cllr Doherty stressed the importance of having a contact person for Community and Enterprise located in the local PSC as soon as possible.

The members discussed the efforts to identify a site for the school campus in Buncrana. The members were informed that representatives of the three schools will meet in Buncrana on Wednesday 20th April to discuss the lack of progress.

Cllr Crossan stated that pressure must be applied to expedite the delivery of a site for the project in the interests of the staff, students and parents concerned.

16.32.07 Development Fund Initiative Workshop

The Divisional Manager advised that a workshop will be required to consider the Development Fund Initiative 2016. It was agreed to hold the workshop on Tuesday 10^{th} May 2016 at 10.30am.

The members expressed their concern that applications for the DFI were not accepted at the Public Services Centre in Carndonagh and that some applicants were forced to get a taxi to Lifford to lodge their application. The members stated that any document presented to any PSC should be stamped as having been received by Donegal County Council.

16.33 PLANNING

The Senior Executive Planner Paul Christie briefed the members on the planning update report circulated with the agenda. He further advised that Eunan Quinn, Senior Planner will attend a workshop with the members to discuss current staffing arrangements within he Planning Service. The Senior Executive Planner advised that a workshop will also be required to discuss the Local Area Plans in the Municipal District.

There was a brief discussion on the designation of the towns in Inishowen under the Tier 2 category. Concern was expressed that Moville is not designated as a Tier 2

town. Cllr Farren stated that he had been advised that Moville is to be categorised as a Heritage Town. It was agreed that further information should be provided with regard to the status of Moville as a Heritage town.

The members expressed their concerns regarding their difficulties getting access to the planners for Inishowen. It was agreed to keep the concerns for discussion with the Senior Planner at the forthcoming workshop. It was agreed to hold a workshop to consider both the LAPs and the staffing arrangements on Thursday 12th May 2016 at 11am.

16.33.01 Windfarm at Kinnego Bay

There was a long discussion regarding the application for a wind farm at Kinnego Bay. The members expressed grave concern that the developers of the wind farm had initiated logistical preparations outside the permitted times set out in the conditions of planning permission. It was further noted that agents of the developers had carried

out works to remove obstacles to their large vehicles at junctions along their route. Cllr Farren stated that he had personally intervened with contractors for the developer in Moville to prevent them carrying out road works.

The members expressed their anger that such a scenario could arise and urged the Chief Executive to consider taking an injunction to stop work on the development immediately.

The Senior Executive Planner stated that the Planning Office is aware of the matter. He advised that the planner has been out to inspect the complaints made and that the matter is currently being treated as an unauthorised development. He acknowledged the very strong views of the members and assured them that the Planning Service is treating the case very seriously. He added that as the matter is currently the subject of a live unauthorised development investigation, he did not consider it appropriate to discuss it any further at this stage.

16.33.02 Fire Certificates

Cllr Doherty, noting planning application 16/50299, highlighted the length of time it takes for Fire Certificates to issue from the Fire Service. He added that pre-school facilities require fire certificate in order to comply with regulations.

Cllr McDermott commented that currently it is taking six months to get a fire certificate. The members expressed their concern that the delays could jeopardise the provision of new childcare places in September.

16.34 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES

Mr John Gallagher, Senior Engineer Water & Environment presented the Environment Update Report to the members.

16.34.01 Big Donegal Clean Up'16

This year's campaign was successfully launched by Donegal Footballer Neil Gallagher and Cathaoirleach Cllr Ciaran Brogan. A number of clean ups have already taken place with Easter being a busy weekend for clean ups across the County. Promotion of the cleanup will continue through the use of social media, online advertising and local radio and press.

16.34.02 Spring Anti - Litter awareness campaign

Over the month of April the Council's promotional activities will focus on an anti-litter message targeting roadside litter, dog fouling and promoting community clean ups. This is carried out by advertising on local radio, online advertising, print media and using social media.

16.34.03 Dog Fouling

Free poop scoops are now available at all Council Public Service Centres and we would encourage dog owners to avail of the free poop scoop bags or use any bag and dispose of the dog mess in the appropriate manner. An advertising campaign is also underway with this message.

16.34.04 Home Composting

Home compost bins are available from all Council Public Services Centres for only €13. 1/3 of all waste can be composted such as fruit and vegetable peelings. By composting these types of waste we reduce the waste in our bins and we make our own compost which is a wonderful resource for our gardens. A book on home composting will be given out with every bin sold.

16.34.05 Recycling.

Donegal County Council continues expand its Bring Bank sites across the county, with new site been identified in Letterkenny and Stranorlar. Additionally the Council is conducting a process of renewing old and damaged banks with new stock on an ongoing basis. The Council is actively looking for new sites and any assistance in this search would be appreciated.

The Senior Engineer informed the members that a Tidy Towns Seminar took place in Letterkenny on 18th April 2016 which was presented by Anne O'Leary, a national tidy towns adjudicator. The Senior Engineer stated that he would circulate the members on the seminar in due course.

The members praised the work done throughout the county on the Big Donegal Cleanup. There was widespread praise for all the local volunteers who took part. There was a special mention for the Council's Litter Warden Pearse McCrory, for Mary McCallion of IDP for contacting all the voluntary and community groups to provide information and for the Council drivers who assisted on the day.

The members acknowledged the provision of free poop scoops at the Public Service Centres however they expressed serious concern at the extent of the dog fouling problem. Cllr Donaghey reiterated her request for signage at the entrances to Swan Park regarding dog fouling.

In response to question from Cllr Canning, The Senior Executive Planner Paul Christie confirmed that planning permission granted for wind farm developments normally require the provision of a bond to cover the cost of removal of redundant machinery by the Council should the need arise.

Cllr Doherty expressed concern that the new regulations regarding the disposal of used tyres will result in additional cost being passed to the consumer.

The members welcomed the confirmation that approval has been received from OPW to progress and seek an appropriate contractor to assess coastal erosion issues in Inishowen from Clonmany to Malin Head. However, concern was expressed regarding the urgent works required at Lagg and at Ballyliffen Golf Club.

Cllr Donaghey requested an update on plans to upgrade Westbrook Pumping Station.

16.35 ROADS & TRANSPORTATION

The Senior Executive Engineer Seamus Hopkins presented the Roads Schedule of Municipal District Works 2016 update report to the members. He also presented the follow up report to the issues raised at the March meeting.

The Senior Executive Engineer advised that funding for maintenance of the Barrack Hill Town Park had been provided. He added that it is proposed to use the funding to carry out the immediate maintenance work for the current year and to begin planning for a programmed approach to maintenance and development in the future.

Cllr McGuinness referred to the Restoration and Improvement Programme and stated that the works were agreed by the Municipal District as a whole. He complained that some members had sought to take personal credit for certain areas included within the programme. He added that he would like to see the restoration of the LIS programme.

Cllr Farren stated that the new bridge at Moville was damaged in a recent accident and requested that a new safety barrier is erected.

Cllr John Ryan acknowledged the follow up in relation to safety issues at Magherabeg School and the meeting with the Transport Infrastructure Ireland representative. He added that action is now required as soon as possible to address the issues.

Cllr Ryan stated that residents of Inch Road and Inch Island raised concerns regarding traffic speeds on the R238. He stated that right-turning traffic from the R238 to Inch Road are at risk from over-taking traffic from the rear on this stretch of road.

Cllr Murray highlighted concerns of residents of sheltered housing in Muff. He stated that parked cars along the main road in the vicinity of the housing development are blocking vision lines of traffic emerging onto the regional road.

Cllr Murray further raised concerns in relation to the junction from Railway Tavern to the R238.

Cllr Canning enquired whether there is any proposal to invite sponsorship for the roundabout at Manorcunningham.

The Senior Executive Engineer advised that the Letterkenny MD is responsible for the maintenance of this junction.

Cllr Crossan praised the Roads Service for the work at Aghilly Road. Cllr Crossan requested that the directional sign is erected at Westbrook for Dunree Museum.

16.36 DATE OF NEXT MEETING

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Municipal District will take place on Tuesday 10th May 2016 at 1pm.

ENVIRONMENT SECTION REPORT APRIL 2016.

1. Big Donegal Clean Up'16

This campaign is well underway and has been a great success to date. Lot's of groups are also sending in there photographs and our Communications office is promoting and publicising events where possible.

2. Tidy Towns Seminar

Donegal County Council hosted a very successful seminar on the 18th April for Tidy Towns groups on the sustainable waste and resource management category of the competition. Among the guest speaker was Anne O'Leary Tidy Towns National Adjudicator who gave an excellent overview of the Tidy Towns competitions with other presentation focussing on the sustainable waste theme. The Radisson Hotel presented a very interesting case study on the activities of the hotel in the area of waste prevention.

3. Pay By Weight

A national and regional awareness campaign on Pay By Weight will be commencing 18th May with an intensive media campaign, a national launch event will take place on May 18th with a print and radio campaign taking place from 22nd - 29th May and again from the 19th - 26th June. A suite of awareness resources has been developed for Donegal County Council to use at a local level.

4. Enforcement Figures 2016.

Total number of environment complaints for the year to date, 438 of which 85% were for waste and litter.

Total number of Fixed Penalty Notices served under the Litter Pollution Act 1997 is 58 of which 34% have been paid to date and 13% of the total were served on persons with NI addresses.

Coastal Management

Priority Beach Works

A list of beach priority works has been drafted following direction of An Taisce re Criteria Compliance to retain Blue Flag and Green Coast status and recent Irish Water Safety beach risk assessment recommendations. Immediate works are pending for Dooey, Killahoey and Drumnatinney.

Downings beach access was improved ahead of the Easter holidays as the access path was badly choked with sand.

Designated Bathing Areas

The EPA has just awarded Donegal County Council two additional Designated Bathing Area status for Dooey and Magheroarty beaches. This brings our total to 21 (or 15%) of the total 140 beaches Nationally.

Coastal Erosion

- A very productive meeting was held with An Mhacháire le Chéile Teo to address erosion issues affecting the <u>Maghery</u> area. Coastal Officer is progressing the issues agreed.
- An application is in Preparation to the NPWS to address the erosion issue on <u>Magherawarden</u> beach by the local river. Work is necessary to divert the river flow toward the sea. The erosion has an obvious impact re land loss but also potential deterioration in water quality.
- A meeting was held with management of <u>Carrickfinn</u> Airport re accretion issues affecting the airport and locality. With their input, an application can be made to the OPW for funding to assess the situation.
- Approval was received from the OPW to progress and seek an appropriate contractor to assess the coastal erosion issues in Inishowen from Clonmany to Malin Head.

Beach Sea Mammals

Under the Wildlife (Amendment) Act 1976-2005, all cetaceans and seals are protected species listed on the 5th Schedule. There is an obligation to protect these animals should they arrive on our shores (alive or dead). Also, there is a scientific interest to record the details of such events to track and monitor trends. Such recording can allow the introduction of measures to reduce/prevent deaths. Again, this is an obligation under the Wildlife (Amendment) Act 1976-2005.

A very productive meeting was held with the County Vet where a draft policy policy on dealing with beached sea mammals (dead or alive) was presented. The Litter Wardens, Mobile Litter Units, etc, were supportive of the policy. This policy is the first developed in the country with input from all relevant agencies.

Beach Lifeguards

Interviews are being held to appoint seasonal beach lifeguards for 14 beaches across the County. Supporting infrastructure (Lifeguard Stations, ringbuoys, toilets, uniforms, etc) is also currently being procured.

Access for All

A Loughs Agency sponsored beach wheelchair will be delivered this week to Rathmullan Water Sports and Sailing School for use by them over the 2016 season. This will enable access to the water and beach by the group's members of all abilities. This will be a valuable pilot project.

DCC is making arrangements for a long term loan of our Loughs Agency sponsored pontoon hoist to Gartan Outdoor Centre. This hoist is used to transfer disabled water enthusiasts from land to vessel safely. It was previously used in the Greencastle Marina but has been replaced with a permanent hoist.

Public Conveniences

PC Assessment

An assessment is nearing completion on the Public Convenience status at each of the 24 locations county wide. There are additional portaloo services provided both seasonally and annually. These have been excluded from this initial assessment.

These services are being reviewed in consultation with Michael Hanley re the Health and Safety of the facilities as a place of work for our staff.

Initial costs have been sought for improvement works at Bundoran, Dungloe, Arranmore Island, Ballywhoriskey, Dunfanaghy, Downings and Moville.
