MINUTES OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING HELD IN THE PUBLIC SERVICES CENTRE, CARNDONAGH ON TUESDAY13th FEBRUARY 2018 AT 1.00Pm

18.10 Consideration of the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of Inishowen Municipal District held on Tuesday 13th January 2018.

On the proposal of Cllr Paul Canning and seconded by Cllr Rena Donaghey, the minutes of the January meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District meeting held on 16TH January 2018 were agreed.

18.11 Child Protection Policy - Briefing for Members

Paddy Mullan, one of four Designated Child Protection Officers for Donegal County Council briefed the members on the draft Donegal County Council Draft Protection Policy to the members. He highlighted the importance of the policy for Donegal County Council in ensuring that vulnerable adults and children are protected. Broad examples of the types of issues brought to the Designated Child Protection Officers were outlined.

18.12Housing and Corporate Services

18.12.01 Housing Workshop

It was agreed that a Housing workshop would take place at 10.00am on Tuesday 13th March prior to the Inishowen Municipal District meeting to discuss Housing matters

18.12.02 Clos Phadraig

In response to a query from residents in Clos Phadraig regarding erosion/damage due to the floods, ClIr Albert Doherty thanked Aideen Doherty, Area Manager for the response that the issues would have to be considered as part of the overall management plan for the river.

18.12.03 Burnfoot – Pairc an Ghriannan Estate

A lengthy discussion took place on Pairc an Ghriannan Estate. The members referred to recent media reports and discussion on the eight properties that were damaged and vacated in the floods including

security issues. The general consensus was that former displaced tenants were frustrated in not knowing what was happening in the long term. It was acknowledged that Donegal County Council was awaiting the Cframs Study report but was simultaneously investigating all possibilities in finding solutions. John McLaughlin, Director of Roads and Transportation added that it was difficult to predict any timeframe at the moment. Aideen Doherty advised that Donegal County Council Housing personnel had met with the displaced tenants to advise them that it was unlikely that they would be back in Pairc an Ghriannan this year and had listened to their individual concerns. Aideen further advised that the displaced tenants had been accommodated in houses as close as possible to Burnfoot and that she was aware that they wish to return to their homes in Pairc and Ghriannan as soon as possible. She also indicated that in the event that a solution to flooding could be found that the houses could be brought back to standard within an 8-10 week period.

18.12.04 Mica

Following a number of queries raised by members re progress on MICA affected homes Aideen Doherty advised that the council is awaiting the outcome from the NSAI on testing.

18.12.05 Lighting of Carndonagh PSC and former Buncrana Town Council Office for St Patrick's day

On the suggestion of Cllr Jack Murray and supported by all the members it was agreed that Carndonagh PSC and former Buncrana Town Council Offices would be lit up in Green for St Patrick's day.

18.13 COMMUNITY AND ENTERPRISE

Paddy Doherty, Divisional Manager, Community and Enterprise, Development Officer circulated the Community and Enterprise report to the members

18.13.01 Land Disposal

Land disposal was discussed earlier in a workshop and it was noted that the item would be brought to the members at the March Municipal District Meeting.

18.13.02 Malin Head -Visitor Management plan for Malin Head Signature Discovery Point Project

Paddy Doherty advised the members that the tender documents would be finalized shortly. Cllr Martin McDermott expressed his disappointment with the timeframes of the Malin Head Project in general fearing that there are items that will not be completed before the next tourist season.

18.13.03 Malin Head – Access and Amenity Improvement Project

Paddy Doherty, Divisional Manager, Community and Enterprise advised that snagging issues would be addressed and completed in the next couple of weeks. Cllr Martin McDermott requested that landscaping be completed at Malin Head to tidy the site up. Seamus Hopkins Area Manager, Roads and Transportation, suggested that this may have been included in the contract price anyway.

18.13.04 Development Fund Initiative

It was noted that the closing date for applications for the Development Fund Initiative was 2nd March 2018. It was agreed that a workshop to discuss the Development Fund Initiative would take place at 12.00pm on Tuesday 13th March prior to the Inishowen Municipal District meeting. The members requested that the DFI applications would be sent out to them in advance of the workshop.

18.13.05 Seminar/Workshop Developing Place-based Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Branding in Donegal

Fiona Doherty, Development Officer, Community and Enterprise distributed details of an all day seminar/workshop which is going to take place on 15th March at An Grianan Hotel to encourage the

development of place-based entrepreneurship, innovation and branding in Donegal. The aim is to create a lasting benefit, which is achieved through innovation and an increased ability to recognise and realise new opportunities to grow the local economy, create additional jobs and sustain local communities. The idea behind the workshop is to use events such as 2018 Dubai Duty Free Irish Open, Star Wars, The Wild Atlantic Way Initiative, the development of Malin Head, the North West Greenway network and the Clipper 2017-2018 Round the World Yacht Race, to promote Donegal as a world-class destination with positive products, services and visitor experiences – under a consistent local brand,

Cllr Martin McDermott stated that the event was welcomed as a positive step in promoting the Irish Open Golf tournament this year amongst other recent events. He expressed his view that there were many items that had to be addressed and delivered on to make the tournament a success including supports from central government.

18.13.06 Walks and Trails HSE Bridge – Donagh Park Resident River Walk connecting to Hospital

Cllr Albert Doherty reiterated his request that the River walk between the Donagh Park and the hospital be repaired as it has no entry signs at both ends of the walk. He requested that a short term safety solution should be considered immediately between the HSE and council to reopen the popular walk. It was agreed that Frances Conaghan, Walks and Trails Officer, Donegal County Council be contacted to look at options.

18.13.07 Buncrana School Campus

The members reiterated their concerns over the delay in moving the project further. Cllr Rena Donaghey expressed her upmost frustration on the ongoing delays in identifying a suitable site and progressing the development of the Campus. She added that another school year will be at an end in a few months with little progress.

18.13.08 Ports and Harbours Magilligan Pier'

Cllr Bernard McGuinness suggested that Donegal County Council should remain in discussions over the future of the pier at Magilligan as historically, Donegal County Council had been instrumental in supporting its development and construction. He said DCC should be involved in discussions regarding its future,

18.13.09 Footpath Ballyliffen Golf Club to Ballyliffen Village

Cllr McGuiness proposed that a submission should be presented to Central Government to apply for funds to secure a footpath from Ballyliffen Golf Club to Ballyliffen village. This was seconded by Cllr Albert Doherty, Cllr McGuinness suggested that a plan should be drawn up incorporating plans to widen roads and enable the movement of traffic at the Ballyliffen Dubai Open Irish Golf Tournament.

Paddy Doherty advised that Roads and Community and Enterprise Sections were making a submission in collaboration in this regard.

18.13.10 Abbey Park Playgrounds – Manorcunningham

Cllr Paul Canning requested that goal posts could be erected at Abbey Park Playgrounds; Manorcunningham as children were dangerously wrapping the swings around the swing stands to make a goal post.

18.13.11 An Grianan Fort

It was noted that it was envisaged that the tender document for the Conservation and Management Plan will be completed within the next few weeks by the Office of Public Works. Donegal County were working in collaboration with all stakeholders in relation to the development of the site.

18.14 PLANNING

Ruth Diver, Executive Planner presented the Planning Report to the members

18.14.01 Access to Planners - Phone Arrangements & Planning Clinics

The members generally welcomed the new phone arrangements for contacting planners and the new Planning clinic dates. However, Cllr Martin Farren said that this was inadequate and ideally the Planning service should be returned to Carndonagh PSC. This was seconded by Cllr Bernard McGuinness and agreed by all members. Cllr Doherty stated that he wished to see additional access to planners so that matters can be addressed and followed up on such as unauthorised sites, derelict sites etc.

17.12.02 Planning Reports

It was requested that details of significant planning application and commercial planning applications could be presented in the Planning report each month to the members.

17.14.03 Derelict Sites

Cllr Albert Doherty sought clarification on who was responsible for derelict sites?

18.14.04 Exempt Development

Cllr Paul Canning suggested that changes in planning policy should be considered for young people wishing to build their initial homes at the back of their family home. He suggested that by building accommodation at the back of their family homes, the numbers on the Housing list would be reduced significantly. Exempted planning permission for this purpose may be a solution he added, Paul Canning proposed that this suggestion could be raised at the next Planning Strategic Policy Committee; this was seconded by Cllr Bernard McGuiness.

18.14.05 Refusal of Planning Permissions

Cllr Paul Canning expressed his disappointment at some recent planning applications that had been refused and questioned the reasons behind refusals. Cllr Martin McDermott expressed his frustration on projects in Malin Head and Ballyliffen not being able to move forward due to planning constraints. He relayed a developer's frustration in trying to obtain planning permission and how opportunities were lost. A discussion took place and it was acknowledged that the planning

service is under pressure and may require additional resources to dedicate to specific items. It was noted that architects also had a responsibility to provide accurate information and valid applications to enable the efficient processing of applications.

Cllr Martin Farren proposed and Cllr Albert Doherty seconded that Liam Ward, Director of Community, Enterprise and Planning Service be requested to attend the next Inishowen Municipal meeting.

18.14.06 Planning Workshop

It was agreed that a Planning workshop would take place on Tuesday 13th March at 11.00am in Carndonagh PSC.

18.14. ENVIRONMENT

Mathew Byrne, Waste Regulation Officer, presented the Environment Report to the members. He updated the members on the items on the report. Mathew thanked the members for their expression of sympathy on the death of his grandmother Mary Ellen.

18.14 01 Food Waste

Mathew Byrne updated the members on the National Stop Food Waste campaign. It was noted that on average each household waste up to €700 worth of food per year.

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18.14.02 Tyre Compliance Scheme

Mathew Byrne briefed the members on the Tyre Compliance Scheme which is similar to recycling of electrical goods scheme. Cllr Paul Canning asked if there were any government directives or proposals for using the tyres. Mathew Byrne stated that Repak ELT is, working under approval from the Department of Communication, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) to operate the compliance scheme for tyres in Ireland.

18.14.03 Anti Dumping Initiative

Donegal County Council secured funding to carry out 18 clean-ups under the Anti Dumping Initiative 2017. Funding is subject to sites meeting project selection criteria and it is anticipated that funding will be secured in 2018 for this very welcome initiative. The 2018 initiative is to be launched shortly.

18.14.05 Recycling Bring Banks – Supervalu Buncrana

Mathew Byrne advised that new recycling bring banks are due to be delivered to Buncrana SuperValu and the bring banks at Nailors Row are to be removed. The Mobile Litter Unit is liaising with service providers to switch banks when empty. The members welcomed this and expressed their gratitude. Cllr Martin McDermott requested that the bring banks could be brought to the shopping centre in Carndonagh,

18.14.06 Clean up at Stragill, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan thanked the Environment Section for the prompt clean up at Stragill, Buncrana

18.14.07 Fly Tipping

Cllr Albert Doherty expressed his disgust at the fly tipping that was happening in the peninsula and at non compliance of individuals with regard to disposal of waste. Cllr John Ryan referred to dumping around the 19th Hole in Bridgend and also to the amount of waste thrown from cars onto the road around Burnfoot/Bridgend. Cllr Rena Donaghey referred to the problems at Lisnagra as mentioned at previous meetings.

18.14.08 Pay by Weight Bin Charges

Cllr Albert Doherty reiterated his concerns over the pay by weight system and inconsistencies in charges. He suggested a financial support/reimbursement system for people with health problems.

18.04.09 Ballyliffen Sewerage Treatment Plant

Cllr Bernard McGuinness suggested that Ballyliffen Sewerage Treatment Plant requires attention as it is at full capacity at the moment and that a meeting with Irish Water should be arranged to discuss and progress the issue. He added that there were problems with Sewerage Treatment Plants in other towns but Ballyliffen required urgent attention,

18.14.10 Inishowen Clean Up

Cllr Rena Donaghey suggested the 7th April for the National Spring Clean. She suggested a date would need to be confirmed to give the community groups time to get organised,

18.14.11 Public Toilets Moville

Cllr Martin Farren said he would like to see the public toilets open in Moville from the beginning of March.

18.14.12 Access to Lagg Beach

Mathew Byrne advised that he had no timeframe at the moment for the opening of access to Lagg Beach and that the members would be updated.

18.15 Roads and Transportation

18.15.01 Swan Park

A discussion took place on the future of Swan Park. Cllr Rena Donaghey advised that a Tidy Town's meeting had taken place last evening and there was a lot of discussion at it about Swan Park. Cllr Donaghey asked whether there was a possibility that Swan Park could be reopened in some way and also asked if there any monies left over from the REDZ Scheme that could be used. The consensus of the members was that all efforts should be made to secure that the Crana Fest takes place this year as it attracts canoeists from all over the world and generates significant business in the local economy.

18.15.02 Clar Corner, Redcastle

Seamus Hopkins, Area Manager. Roads and Transportation advised that Road Design were continuing to consider options for the road at Clar Corner, Redcastle.

18.15.03 Battery Brae, Greencastle

It was noted that after the wall at Battery Brae, Greencastle was removed recently that a new wall was built which protrudes out onto the road and is considered dangerous. A discussion took place on the issue. Seamus Hopkins advised that solutions were being sought to address the issue

18.15.04 Proposal for Additional Car Park in Moville

Cllr Martin Farren suggested that a car park to ease congestion opposite the chapel in Moville should be created by opening access onto the green area. He added that car parking space is very limited in this area and this would be of great benefit. He requested that this be considered by Road Design

18.15.05 Redcastle Village

Cllr Martin Farren requested that a review of the speed limit should be reviewed as there were complaints of cars travelling through Redcastle Village at high speed.

18.15.06 Church Brae Greencastle to Fishery School & Derry Road at Thompson's Coal Yard in Moville Cllr Martin Farren requested that the Church Brae Greencastle to Fishery School Road be reviewed as it was in a poor state also the Derry Road at Thompson's Coal Yard in Moville

18.15.07 Bridge at Donagh River, Circular Road, Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty requested an update on the repair of the wall at Circular Road, Carndonagh

18.15.08 Perimeter Fence at St Patrick' Boy School Carndonagh

Cllr Doherty asked was there any update on providing a perimeter fence in the grounds of St Patrick's Boy School, Carndonagh as it was destroyed in the floods.

18.15.08 Bridge St Works

Cllr Albert Doherty sought clarification on whether all issues had been dealt with and when were works going to commence

18.15.09 Barrack Hill

Cllr Albert Doherty requested that extra public lighting be installed at Barrack Hill and that the road on the right hand, Ballyloskey side be realigned.

18.15.10 Works at Planting, Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty acknowledged the significant works at the Planting Carndonagh; He sought clarification on when the road would revert to two lane traffic. Seamus Hopkins advised that it is envisaged that two way traffic would be restored in four to six weeks time.

18.15.11 Water on Surface of Roads

Cllr Martin McDermott sought clarification on what Donegal Count Council can do to encourage landowners to take responsibility for ensuring surplus water from their lands does not spill onto public roads. Cllr McGuinness suggested the Council should be engaging with farmers and landowners to address the problem

18.15.12 Rivers

Some discussion took place on who has responsibility for rivers. It was noted that the Office of Public Works have no maintainable channels under the 1945 Drainage Act and that owners adjacent to rivers are responsible. Donegal County Council can make an application under the the **Minor Flood** Mitigation **Works & Coastal Protection Scheme.**

18.15.13 Newtowncunningham /Manorcunningham Upgrade

Cllr Paul Canning requested an update on street upgrading at Newtowncunningham including bollards, street lighting and a pedestrian crossing. He requested that the same request be applied for Manorcunningham too.

18.15.14 Lisfannon Beach Access

Cllr Nicholas Crossan stated that the Lisfannon Road was badly eroded and required attention

18.15.15 Gritting

It was acknowledged that the outdoor staff was delivering an excellent Winter Maintenance Programme ensuring the roads were being gritted. There was a suggestion that the gritting areas could be extended.

18.15.16 River leading to Skeg River opposite Revenue Commissioners, Bridgend

Cllr John Ryan requested that the river in this area be cleaned as there had been several complaints from businesses,

18.15.17 Path at Fruit of Loom – Shore Walk

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that works should take place at the Fruit of the Loom shore path and he said he believed this would complement the excellent work on the shore path already completed.

18.15.18 Miscellaneous Roads Items.

It was agreed that the Roads Workshop following the meeting would discuss Roads items further and it was also agreed that an additional Road's Workshop would take place at 2.00pm, 13th March 2018 prior to the Inishowen Municipal District meeting




