MINUTES OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING HELD IN THE PUBLIC SERVICES CENTRE, CARNDONAGH ON TUESDAY 14th MARCH, 2017 AT 3PM

An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Bernard McGuinness welcomed everyone in attendance to the meeting. He stated that on behalf of the Inishowen elected members he would like to introduce and welcome Linda Melconian to Donegal. Linda is a former American legislator who served as Majority Leader of the Massachusetts Senate. She is member of the Democratic Party and represented the greater Springfield area as its State Senator from 1983-2005. Cllr McGuinness added that she was first woman Majority Leader in the history of the Massachusetts Senate.

Cllr McGuinness added that the Members were grateful to John McGee from Buncrana for inviting Linda to Donegal, following their first meeting at Speaker O'Neill's 100th birthday celebration in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The council had the pleasure of welcoming a number of her constituents to Donegal last year when the Economic Development Council of Western Massachusetts visited the county and it was hoped that the Council continue to work in cooperation with them in looking at opportunities to collaborate. The current Mayor of Donegal County Council, Terence Slowey hosted a meeting in Springfield last November with the development council and met a number of businesses interested in the NW region of Ireland.

Cllr McGuinness referred to Tip O'Neill whose maternal grandmother Eunice (Unity) Fullerton was born outside Buncrana. In 1977 he denounced violence in Northern Ireland and used his influential position as Speaker to play a key and pivotal role in bringing about peace in Ireland. An annual Tip O'Neill Donegal Diaspora Award has been established to acknowledge his many outstanding achievements, give credit to an illustrious grandson of a Donegal emigrant, and an eminent member of the Irish Diaspora. We look forward to welcoming his son Tommy and his wife Shelly back to Donegal later this year he added.

The members individually welcomed Linda to the meeting. Cllr Nicholas Crossan briefed her on how the Tip O'Neill Diaspora Award came about from an idea in 2011 to commemorate the centenary of Tip O'Neill's birth in 2012. The award has gone from strength to strength and this year the format of the award may be altered, he added.

Linda Melconian thanked the members for welcoming her to the meeting. She described the type of inspirational person that Tip O Neill was and the way he operated to achieve goals and move things forward. There was a question and answer session. Topics such as the undocumented Irish in the USA and Brexit were discussed.

Aideen Doherty, Area Manager, Housing and Corporate Inishowen, briefed Linda on the connections between Massachusetts and Donegal County Council. She referred to the Golden Bridges Delegation from the North West area that had gone out to Massachusetts last year, forging lasting links.

17.16 Consideration of the Minutes of the Municipal District Meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District held on 14th February 2017.

On the proposal of Cllr Martin Farren, seconded by Cllr Paul canning, the minutes of the February Meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District meeting held on 14th February 2017 were agreed.

There were no matters arising.

Cllr Martin McDermott expressed his condolences to Search and Rescue Services and their families for the tragic loss of life in Mayo. Also, Cllr Bernard McGuinness expressed his sympathy to the family of James McShane, former County Engineer for Donegal County Council.

A minutes silence took place for the deceased.

17.17 PLANNING

The Planning Services Report was taken as read.

17.17.01 Take -over of Housing Estates / Unfinished Estates

The planning authority made public notices in 2016 of its intention to take in charge residential estates with the Municipal District. A workshop and discussions were held with Senior Executive Planner, Frank Sweeney prior to the Municipal District meeting, in relation to taking charge of estates in the Inishowen District as listed in Schedule A.

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17.17.02 Central Planning Unit - Record of Protected Structures

At the Plenary Council meeting of 31st January, 2017 a strategy for a three-phased approach to a programme of additions to the Record of Protected Structures was discussed arising largely as a result of recommendations received from the Minister for additions to be made to the Record. It was decided that decisions on additions to the Record of Protected Structures were to be taken at a Municipal District Level (as provided for under Section 131A of the Local Government Act, 2001 and Schedule 14A, Part 2). It was further agreed that workshops would be held in advance of Municipal District meetings to discuss in detail the proposed Phase 1 additions.

Accordingly, a list of proposed additions to the list of protective structures was presented by Collette Beattie, Assistant Planner to the members. The list was considered and discussed at a workshop prior to the Inishowen Municipal District meeting. It was noted that the additions are comprised of two sub-groups:

- a. Structures falling within Tier 2 Local Area Plan towns in each area- Carndonagh and Bridgend.
- b. A small number of other properties located outside the Tier 2 Local Area Plan Towns but the subject of longstanding requests to the Council to have them considered for addition.

On the proposal of Cllr Paul Canning, seconded by Cllr Albert Doherty it was resolved that the Phase 1 addition process commence and that the proposed recommended additions as detailed below, under the Planning and Development Act 2005 - 2015, Section 55 go out to public consultation.

17.18 ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

Senior Executive Engineer, Seamus Hopkins distributed the Roads and Transportation, Schedule of Municipal District Works 2017 Report. This report had been discussed at workshops on 17th January, 14th February and 7th March, he added. It was to be noted that the Bridge Strengthening Programme and Lighting were additional items.

It was noted that under Road Lengths and Budget Allocation, Muff should be replaced by Moville on the fourth line of the report.

On the proposal of Cllr Martin Farren, seconded by Cllr Jack Murray, the Roads and Transportation Schedule of Municipal District Works for 2017 were agreed.

17.18.01 Lighting Provision Programme 2017

Seamus Hopkins advised the members that should additional funds become available that he would try and get some lighting issues resolved in some areas. The lighting being updated in Carndonagh was part of the REDZ programme, (Rural Economic Development Zones Programme)

Cllr Martin Farren expressed his gratitude for the provision of two additional lights installed at Battery Brae, Greencastle.

17.18.02 St Columbas Church Group, Straid, Clonmany

Cllr Albert Doherty queried whether the Council could consider looking at the wall at St Columbas which is protruding through the fence.

17.18.03 Bonar's Corner, Moville

Cllr Martin Farren requested that a pot hole at Bonar's Corner, Moville be repaired as it was causing problems. Seamus Hopkins suggested that it would require it to be filled hot rolled asphalt as a solution. He added that there was a possibility that this could be done as part of a contract when the restoration work is being carried out in the area.

17.18.04 Broadband at Lisfannon

Cllr Jack Murray referred to the lack of broadband provision at Lisfannon Industrial Estate. He stated that additional employment opportunities could be made available if broadband services were enhanced. He suggested that when carrying out road works, laying broadband should be carried out in conjunction with the works. It was noted that John G McLaughlin, Director of Roads and Services and Garry Martin, Director of Finance were going to have discussions in this regard.

Cllr Rena Donaghey stated that she agreed with Cllr Murray and that she too was disappointed with the lack of progress in improving broadband services at Lisfannon. She asked that clarification be sought on who actually owns the premises there. Five years ago, it was supposed to be transferred over to Donegal County Council, she added.

17.18.05 Ramp and Bollards at Abbey Park, Manorcunningham

Cllr Paul Canning requested that additional ramps and bollards are required at the local shop in Manorcunningham as there are ongoing safety issues in the area such as large vehicles blocking vision lines etc.

17.18.06 Safety Plan for Carrigans

Cllr Paul Canning queried when the safety measures including a pedestrian crossing will be put in place in Carrigans. He expressed his concern over the level of speeding in the area.

17.18.07 Safety Measures for Killea

Cllr Paul Canning requested that a pedestrian crossing be installed in Killea. He advised that a person had recently been knocked down by a car close to the chapel in Killea. It was noted that there was a high volume of heavy goods vehicle passing through Killea.

17.18.08 Pedestrian Crossing at Magherabeg School, Newtowncunningham

Cllr Pal Canning queried when a pedestrian crossing would be installed at the school in Newtowncunningham

17.18.09 Lights a Shore Front, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan stated that the lights at the Shore Front in Buncrana were not working.

17.18.10 Traffic Lights at West End Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that measures be put in place to deal with the frequent grid locks at the West End Buncrana.

17.18.11 Road Signage

Cllr Martin McDermott expressed his concerns over lack of road signage. He requested that road signage be considered for the Mountain Road Carndonagh and Mamore Gap.

17.18.12 Junction at Mullins Shop, Malin Head

Cllr McDermott requested an update on any proposed safety measures for the junction at Mullin's Shop Malin Head.

17.18.13 Lights at Clonmany/Ballyliffen

Cllr Martin Mc Dermott suggested that lights should be installed between Clonmany and Ballyliffen.

17.18.14 Vision Lines at Barrack Hill

Cllr Albert Doherty suggested that safety measures should be considered for the junction at Ballyloskey Road and the Carndonagh to Derry Road. Barrack Hill Garden and the Boxing Club generate increased traffic pressures, he added. He suggested lighting and improved vision lines.

17.18.15 Piers and Harbours

A discussion took place on what government department has authority over funding piers and harbours. A Council motion was made in January on this matter seeking clarification. John G McLaughlin Director of Service explained that there had been a change in 2016. Prior to that the Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine were the authority but currently, the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government are the parent authority for funding. Cllr Rena Donaghey referred to a Dail question to the then Minister Michael Creed, Department of Agriculture Food and Marine regarding Greencastle pier, in which he stated that the pier was owned by Donegal County Council whose responsibility for its development repair and maintenance, was the Local Authority in the first instance, and its parent Department. (Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government). The Dept of Agriculture, Food and Marine provides funding for development and repair of Local Authority owned piers, harbours and slipways under the Fishery Harbour Coastal Infrastructure Development Programme subject to the exchequer funding.

It was agreed that efforts to obtain clarity over funding and complete the unfinished works at Greencastle pier should be encouraged.

17.18.17 Outer Relief Road, Buncrana – Kearney's Pass

Cllr Rena Donaghey suggested that the Outer Relief Road in Buncrana should be reviewed and all options considered. She added that as Cockhill Bridge was now in progress, it was time to encourage the Outer Relief Road to progress. It was proposed by Cllr John Ryan and seconded by Cllr Paul Canning that this should be moved forward.

17.19 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES

Cllr John Ryan initially chaired the meeting briefly on behalf of An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Bernard McGuinness.

17.19.01 Tenant Purchase Scheme

Aideen Doherty, Area Manager, Housing and Corporate Services advised that applications for the Tenant Purchase Scheme were being processed. Valuations had been received for the properties. There were thirty three applications to date of which four were made in 2017.

17.19.02 Resettlement Programme

Aideen Doherty advised that the progress of the programme was satisfactory with the expectation that refugees would arrive in Donegal in late May or early June of this year.

17.19.03 Mica Report

Aideen Doherty advised the members that a report on Mica by the expert Mica panel was completed and due to be published soon as noted at the last meeting.

Cllr Albert Doherty, questioned whether a registry of mica affected properties was going to be established? Cllr Doherty stated that the Assistant Principle Officer, Paris Beausang who was working on the report has moved to a new post and that he had not been replaced. It was suggested that a letter should be sent to acknowledge his commitment and time.

17.19.04 Newtowncunningham

Cllr Paul Canning welcomed the commencement of works at Newtowncunningham. He expressed his concerns that Revenue Commissioners had entered the site and possibly did not adhere to Health and Safety.

17.19.05 Turnkey Developments

Aideen Doherty advised that in the near future, an advertisement seeking expressions of interest for Turnkey Developments will be publicized.

17.20 COMMUNITY AND ENTERPRISE

Paddy Doherty, Senior Executive Officer updated the members on the items on the Community and Enterprise Report.

17.20.01 Swilly Ferry Service

Paddy Doherty, Divisional Manager advised the members that a comprehensive meeting took place between officials of Donegal County Council and Causeway Coast and Glens Council regarding the options available. Cllr Bernard McGuinness expressed his dissatisfaction in relation to the timeframe in procuring the service and stated that the said meeting should have taken place on the 6th December, 2017.

Cllr Bernard McGuinness proposed and Cllr Martin Farren seconded a motion that the Council should re-advertise for a ferry service with sub-vention. A lengthy debate took place regarding the funding of both ferry services and the members were of the opinion that funding provision should be made in the Annual Budget, Cllr Martin Farren added that it was unfair that the monies had been top sliced and impacting of the Strategic Development Fund Initiative.

Mr. Paddy Doherty stated that he understood the frustration of the members and asked that the members allow another two weeks for the outcome of the positive meeting between both Councils. Mr. Doherty agreed to initiate the process of preparing documentation for a joint tender for the Foyle Ferry with subvention between Donegal County Council and Causeway Coast and Glens Council, pending confirmation from the Causeway Coast and Glens Council.

17.20.02 Buncrana School Campus

Cllr Rena Donaghey expressed her dissatisfaction in relation to the time taken to progress in securing a site for the Buncrana School Campus. She added that the same information was been presented at each monthly Municipal District Meeting regarding ongoing negotiations with the owner of the identified site. Cllr Donaghey suggested that the second and third identified, preferred site should be considered if there is continuous lack of progress on the preferred site.

17.20.03 Pontoons at Culdaff

Cllr Bernard McGuinness sought an update on the replacement of the Pontoons at Culdaff beach.

17.20.04 BIM FLAG Programme

Cllr Albert Doherty sought the names of the successful applicants under the BIM Flag Programme. It was agreed to follow up on same.

17.21 ENVIROMENT

Cllr McGuinness expressed his view that a representative from the Environment section should have attended the meeting.

17.21.01 Illegal Dumping

There was a consensus from the members that there has been an increase in illegal dumping particularly at Stroove Head, Glengad Hill. It was agreed that illegal dumping needed to be addressed and that those responsible should be named and shamed.

17.21.01 Launch of Spring Clean UP

It was noted that the Spring Clean up was going to be launched shortly. Cllr Rena Donaghey said that there was a significant amount of work getting all the communities involved.

17.21.2 Steps at Beach at Porthall – Fr Hegarty's Grave

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that the steps at Fr Hegarty's rock be looked at, also the provision of litter bins on the pathway under the bridge at the shorefront.

17.21.3 Marram Grass Transplanting -

Cllr Albert Doherty requested an update on whether local intervention of Marram Grass Transplanting could take place at Lagg beach as it had been done at Carrickfinn. Also it was discussed if a survey could be completed to consider the level of erosion at Lagg.

17.22 SCHEDULE OF MUNICIPAL DISTRICT WORKS

At a workshop prior to the meeting the members discussed the Schedule of Municipal Works for 2017.

A discussion took place on Clar funding. Cllr Albert Doherty suggested that perhaps more funding could be drawn down from Clar. Seamus Hopkins advised that less than half of Inishowen is in the Clar area whereas other parts in Donegal have whole areas in Clar. It was agreed efforts should be made to maximise funding where possible. Cllr McGuinness stated that the allocation of funding should be equal for the entire county.

It was proposed by Cllr Paul Canning , seconded by Cllr Albert Doherty resolved that the Inishowen Municipal District hereby adopts for the financial year ended 31st December 2017, the Schedule of Municipal District Works 2017, as required by Section 103A of the Local Government Act 2001 (as amended) and in line with requirements of Circular LG27/2014/Fin21/2014.


