MINUTES OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING HELD IN THE PUBLIC SERVICES CENTRE, CARNDONAGH ON TUESDAY 17th JANUARY, 2017 AT 1PM

An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Bernard McGuinness began the meeting and welcomed everyone in attendance. He introduced Executive Planner, Ruth Diver to the members and wished her well in her role as the Executive Planner for the Inishowen MD.

16.93 Consideration of the Minutes of the Municipal District Meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District held on 6th December 2016.

In reference to Minute 16.90.01 Tier Two Towns, Cllr Martin Farren stated that he requested that Moville is designated as a tier two town however it should also remain as a Heritage Town. He requested that the record is amended to reflect this change. The amendment was agreed by the members.

Cllr Albert Doherty queried minute 16.87.04 and stated that he had proposed that a request be made to the Minister to receive a deputation from the Inishowen MD on the issue of funding for marine services. An Cathaoirleach Bernard McGuinness stated that it was his recollection that the members seek a meeting with the Minister when he visits the county which Cllr McGuinness believes to be imminent. An Cathaoirleach added that he will support seeking a deputation to the Minister if the meeting with him locally doesn't take place.

On the proposal of Cllr Rena Donaghey, seconded by Cllr Martin Farren, the minutes of the December Meeting of the Inishowen Municipal District meeting held on 6th December 2016 were agreed.

16.94 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES

The Area Manager for Housing & Corporate Services Aideen Doherty briefed the members on the Housing and Corporate Services report as circulated. The Area Manager added that two requests have been received to address the Municipal District.

The North West Lyme Disease Support Group has requested an opportunity to address the members at the next suitable meeting of the MD.

Bernie Flanagan of the Waters and Communities Office has also requested an opportunity to meet the members at the February MD meeting. The Water and Communities Office is a shared service which is currently working with the Inishowen Rives Trust.

It was proposed by Cllr Martin Farren, seconded by Cllr Rena Donaghey and agreed to invite both groups to the February meeting of the Inishowen MD.

16.94.01 Follow up Status Report

Cllr Farren expressed his frustration at the state of broadband availability in Inishowen. He added that he isn't happy with the response following the request to ask the Chief Executive to engage a dedicated resource to improve broadband penetration in Inishowen. The Director of Service, John McLaughlin stated that he would liaise with Brian Boyle, Head of Information Systems in relation to the matter.

Provision of broadband services to the Lisfannon Industrial Estate in Buncrana was discussed by the members. It was stated that at least two companies have decided against locating in the site as a direct result of the poor facilities. It was noted that the Metropolitan Area Network (MANS) runs to the entrance to the site. The prohibitive cost of connecting to the MANs was again discussed. The members expressed their frustration that these issues keep coming up an no action to remedy the situation is ever taken. Cllr Murray proposed that the Inishowen MD writes to Enterprise Ireland to ask what their proposals are to improve broadband availability at the site. Cllr Doherty seconded the call and it was agreed to write to Enterprise Ireland for a response. It was also agreed to write to the Minister to highlight the lack of broadband service at the Lisfannon site.

16.94.02 Housing Grants

The members raised concerns with the Area Manager regarding the delay to grant applications in the Newtowncunningham and Manorcunningham areas. The members asked the Area Manager to contact the head of the Occupational Therapy Service of the HSE to highlight the matter.

16.94.03 SI Houses

The Area Manager confirmed to the members that Donegal County Council continues to process applications for SI houses. A new operating procedure for considering SI applications has been agreed with the Housing SPC and applications will be assessed under the new policy.

16.94.04 Joint Policing Committee

Cllr Doherty referred to the meeting of the county JPC which took place on 16th January 2017 at which a call was made for a cross community response to the problem of anti-social behaviour. He asked that all elected members work with the JPC to address the problem of anti-social behaviour.

16.95 ROADS & TRANSPORTATION

The Senior Executive Engineer Seamus Hopkins briefed the members on the follow up report included with the agenda. He advised that he will arrange to meet the members at the Brochan House Bridge to hear their concerns.

Referring to the workshop held earlier in the day, the SEE advised that he hopes to have a schedule of MD works agreed by March. The SEE stated that any members who couldn't attend the earlier workshop could bring come directly to him.

16.95.01 Members issues for follow up

The members listed issues of for the Roads team to consider.

- Traffic diversions from national primary to county roads and damage from heavy goods vehicles.
- Re-introduction of LIS schemes.
- Road widening and re-alignment at Ballyloskey to be examined.
- Taking in charge of road at Drimm.
- Provision of disabled parking bays at chapels in Inishowen.
- Traffic calming at Clonmany car park. Does land belong to Council.
- Carson's Lane, Manorcunningham resurfacing.

Director of Service for Roads and Transportation John McLaughlin advised the members that following the November meeting of the full Council, he had written to the Minister seeking the re-introduction of LIS schemes and the response was that each local authority could decide to fund LIS by top-slicing their annual road grant allocation if that was their wish. The Director added that the same response has been received from the Department on the matter on several occasions following requests from the members. The members discussed the advice of the Director.

An Cathaoirleach, Bernard McGuinness stated that the Minister has given his response to the request and is unlikely to change his mind.

An Cathaoirleach expressed his thanks to the Roads Team for the great work carried out through the year.

The Senior Executive Engineer stated that he and his team are reviewing the traffic diversions at various locations. He referred to the tragic accident at Fahan before Christmas and acknowledged the quick response of the staff and the area engineer in that assistance.

16.96 COMMUNITY AND ENTERPRISE

Fiona Doherty, Staff Officer presented the Community and Enterprise update report to the members. The Senior Executive Engineer advised that he will consult the parking section with regard to the query in relation to designated parking at churches and other areas.

16.96.01 Malin Head

The Council has appointed a design team which is currently finalising the design drawings. A meeting took place with officials from Fáilte Ireland to finalise the design for the toilet block.

Fáilte Ireland have approved the design of the toilet block, the tender documents are been finalised and it is anticipated that it will be advertised for tender within the next week.

The tender documents for the procurement process for the appointment of a design team to carry out the master plan as Phase III are now finalised and are been currently assessed by Fáilte Ireland. The Council are expecting a response from Fáilte Ireland later in the week which should then enable the Council to begin the procurement process.

The tender documents for the Toilet block, car parking and associated works was advertised on e-tenders on the 9th January, 2017. The deadline for the receipt of tenders is 12 noon on Friday 3rd February, 2017. Analysis of returned tenders will take place following this date. A copy of the drawings has issued to the Members.

16.96.02 Foyle Ferry Service

Advertisements inviting applications for a licence to operate a roll on / roll off ferry service between Greencastle and Magilligan were placed in the following papers by Causeway Coast & Glens Borough Council in the week beginning 12th December 2016:

- Irish Times;
- Belfast Telegraph;
- Derry Journal;
- Chronicle (Limavady, Coleraine & Ballymoney).

The closing date for receipt of applications is Wednesday 25th January 2017.

The members enquired whether there had been any contact with the Causeway Coast and Glens District Council regarding the Foyle ferry service. Paddy Doherty, Divisional Manager confirmed that he had made contact with Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council and it was agreed to consider the matter further after the tender process is complete.

Cllr McGuinness stated that it is important that the Council members from the two local authorities get a chance to meet to discuss the service.

The Divisional Manager circulated his report on passenger numbers for the Swilly Ferry Service in 2016.

There was a discussion in relation to the match funding of €2.5m to be provided by the Northern Executive to the North West Gateway initiative.

Concern was expressed that strategic cross border initiatives such as the Foyle ferry service will be at risk because the Executive has collapsed and the funding has not been paid. It was stated that FM Arlene Foster has refused to release the funding to the Councils.

Director of Service, John McLaughlin advised the members that the Chief Executive will be meeting the Chief Executive of Derry and Strabane District Council on Monday 23rd January to consider the position with regards to the NW Gateway Initiative. He added that more information will available thereafter.

16.96.03 Rural Development Programme/LEADER

The four Implementing Partners in the county, Donegal Local Development Company (DLDC), Inishowen Development Partnership (IDP), Údarás Na Gaeltachta and Comhar na nOileán held a series of county wide information evenings on the LEADER programme in late 2016. Expression of Interest forms were issued and completed, and are currently being assessed. Targeted calls for funding applications are now open and have been advertised by the Implementing Partners.

Expressions of Interest received that are deemed to be in line with the criteria outlined in the Local Development Strategy (LDS) will be invited to submit a full application to the relevant Implementing Partner. Applications will then be brought before the Evaluation Committee and onto the LCDC for approval. It is expected that this process will continue into Q1 2017 with actual projects kicking off on the ground by late Q2 2017.

16.96.04 Donegal Walks and Trails

A letter of offer for funding has been allocated for the North West Greenway Project under INTERREG VA (Sustainable Transport Measure). The allocation of €14,861,188 has been made to the project which has four main partners:

Derry City and Strabane District Council, Donegal County Council, SUSTRANS and Transport NI. The overall cost of the project was estimated at circa €18 million and both Councils have agreed to provide the match funds if required depending on final agreed costings and identified savings.

The project will see 3 no. cross border routes developed from:

- (1)Derry to Muff 10.5 km
- (2)Derry to Buncrana via Bridgend (with a spur towards Newtowncunningham via Tooban Junction Inch Level) 32.5 km
- (3)Strabane to Lifford 3.5 km

This project will commence in January 2017 and the early stages will look at project design and route selection (including land owner discussions) and obtaining the necessary statutory permissions. The project will run for five years and is scheduled to be complete by December 2021.

16.96.05 Peace IV

The Donegal Peace IV Action Plan (Stage 2 Submission) was submitted to the SEUPB on 23rd September. Further information in relation to the application was provided to SEUPB on 1st November. The Council has been responding to clarification requests from SEUPB in relation to the PEACE IV Stage 2 application. The application was considered by the SEUPB steering committee on 14th December. The Council continues to liaise with SEUPB to progress the application.

16.96.06 An Grianán of Aileach

A meeting with representatives of the OPW has been arranged for 2pm Tuesday 7th February 2017, at An Grianan Hotel, Burt. The format will entail a round table discussion followed by a visit to An Grianan of Aileach monument.

16.96.07 Development Fund Initiative Workshop

The Divisional Manager advised the members that he would be seeking to organise a workshop prior to the February meeting of the Municipal District to consider the DFI applications for 2017.

The Area Manager for Housing and Corporate Services advised that a number of workshops will be required on the same day.

16.97 PLANNING

An Cathaoirleach Bernard McGuinness welcomed the new Planner for the area to Inishowen and wished her well in her new assignment. The members joined An Cathaoirleach in welcoming the new Planner.

The Executive Planner Ruth Diver circulated a list of names and contact details for the various planning staff assigned to the municipal districts in the county.

The members welcomed the new arrangements and the provision of planning clinics at the Public Services Centres. The increase in planning applications received by the council was also welcomed by the members as an indication of renewed confidence in the local economy.

The Executive Planner responded to questions from the members.

16.98 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES

Matthew Byrne Waste Regulation Officer presented the Environment Report to the members.

16.98.01 Beach at Lagg

Mathew Byrne confirmed that the Coastal Officer David Friel has arranged to meet members of the local community at Lagg, Malin Head. He further advised that David Friel will be available to attend the next meeting of the Inishowen MD to advise the members on the status of the Slodden to Binbane - Coastal Erosion Study.

16.98.02 Bring Banks

The Waste Regulation Officer advised that Donegal County Council adopted an innovative approach to reduce littering and illegal dumping at bring bank sites by installing motion activated litter prevention audio devices at two of the busiest Bring Banks sites in the county - Dunnes Stores, Oldtown, Letterkenny and the Donegal Town Bring Bank site.

When activated bring bank users hear a pre-recorded message thanking members of the public for recycling and reminding recyclers to avoid a €150 litter fine by taking home all bags and empty boxes from the sites.

16.98.03 Tidy Towns

The members acknowledged and welcomed the initiative to hold a tidy towns competition for the county. The proposal is supported by a provision of €15,000 per municipal district in budget 2017. The Director of Service for Roads and Transportation advised that each municipal district will decide on how the funding should be used, having regard to existing commitments.

16.98.04 Blue Flag Beaches.

An Cathaoirleach Bernard McGuinness stated that he would like to see Kinnagoe Bay considered as a Blue Flag beach and he requested that the Council carries out any works necessary to improve facilities at the location.

Environment Report

Municipal District Meeting, January 2017

Environment Awareness

1. Green Schools

There are currently 161 Green Flags flying in Donegal with some schools currently working towards their 8th Green Flag having been involved in the programme for at least 16 years. We also have schools hoping to be awarded their 1st Green Flag in 2017. The Council plays an important role in the implementation of the Green Schools programme and work together with An Taisce to support schools. Schools are given advice, support and information talks on the variety of themes which include, Litter & Waste, Energy, Water, Travel, Biodiversity, Global Citizenship Litter & Waste, Global Citizenship Energy and the most recent theme Global Citizenship Marine Litter.

This is a very busy time of year for schools as many are preparing to apply for their next Green Flag, they also require a support visit from the Council or An Taisce before the application deadline of 24th March.

The Green Schools awards for Donegal schools are held in May of each year at a Donegal venue. The Green Schools programme has been a great success in Donegal and the evidence of this is that we have schools going for their 8th Green Flag, this illustrates the long-term nature of the programme and how schools have really embraced it.

2. Smoky Coal

The Council is continuing it's awareness campaign in relation to the Smoky Coal ban in the Letterkenny area through radio advertising, promotions on social media and most recently by developing the attached piece of artwork to be used on the Council's website, social media etc. Enforcement activities have involved the inspection of delivery lorries, and the inspection of any premises selling, marketing or distributing coal with the Letterkenny area. Enforcement staff are also following up on all complaints on an ongoing basis. New legislation has also made provision for fixed penalty notices for breaches of the legislation within the coal sector ranging from €250 - €1,000.

Donegal County Council encourages members of the public to report instances of the flouting of the law, which will result in enforcement action being taken by the Council.

3. Tidy Towns Amenity Grant

The Environment Section has welcomed the additional funding allocated for Tidy Towns through an amenity grant in the 2017 budget. Application forms and criteria are currently being drawn up and it is hoped to invite Tidy Towns groups to apply in the next month.

4. Anti - Litter Campaigns

Preparations are currently underway for the spring anti-litter campaigns these will include radio advertising, online advertising and social media promotional work. These campaigns will focus on roadside littering, dog fouling and community clean-ups. Preparations have also begun in organising the "Big Donegal Clean -Up 2017".

6. Bikes 4 Africa

The Council, Letterkenny Rotary Club and Bryson Recycling wish to thank everyone who donated a bicycle to the Bikes 4 Africa appeal in October 2016. In just two weeks over 300 bicycles were collected at the 6 Bryson Recycling Centres at Letterkenny, Milford, Carndonagh, Dungloe, Laghey and Stranorlar. Last week all the bikes that were donated were sent to Loughlan House, the correctional facility in Co. Cavan where the Irish Prison Service has arranged for the inmates refurbish the bicycles as part of their rehabilitation and training programme. The refurbished bicycles will eventually be transported to The Gambia, where Rotary's partner organisation "Jole Rider Gambia" pre-selects the schools, and then oversees the distribution of the bikes, with the assistance of the Gambian Education Ministry.

A joint press release will be issued next week.






