MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT HELD ON THE 05th July 2022 in CARNDONAGH PUBLIC SERVICE CENTRE

The outgoing Cathaoirleach, Cllr Nicholas Crossan, opened the meeting pending the election of the new Cathaoirleach. Cllr Crossan welcomed everyone and stated how it has been an honour to serve a second term as Cathaoirleach although it was bitter sweet to accept due to the circumstances, the untimely death of Cllr Bernard McGuinness. Cllr Crossan stated how the late Cllr Bernard McGuinness was a hard-working and conscientious Councillor for over 40 years and he is still greatly missed by all the Members.

Cllr Nicholas Crossan mentioned that although we are currently going through a crisis period there has been funding provided in all departments and outlined the following ongoing projects in Inishowen:

- Primary care centre Buncrana
- Swan Park, Buncrana
- Fort Dunree, Buncrana
- Greencastle Pier
- Greencastle Maritime Museum
- Leisure Centre, Buncrana
- Malin Head
- Regeneration of the Shore Front, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan also thanked Aideen Doherty and Una Cresswell and all the staff in Carndonagh for the help throughout the year. Cllr Crossan also thanked the Directors of Service for their commitment to the Inishowen Municipal District.

Cllr Crossan stated that it would be remiss of him not to mention the defective blocks issue as it is the biggest single disaster that has ever happened in Inishowen. Cllr Crossan reiterated that himself and all the Councillors have committed their full support to people effected.

1. Election of the Cathaoirleach

Cllr Crossan invited nominations for the position of Cathaoirleach. Cllr Canning was proposed by Cllr Crossan and seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott. Accordingly, Cllr Canning was elected Cathaoirleach of the Inishowen Municipal District for 2022 to 2023.

Cllr Paul Canning thanked Cllr Nicholas Crossan as outgoing chair for his role. Cllr Canning further thanked his family and all his supporters and political colleagues. Cllr Canning also wanted to give

a special mention to former colleague and friend, the late Cllr Bernard McGuinness, and noted how he had learned a great deal in local politics from Cllr B McGuinness.

Cllr Canning stated that he was delighted and honoured to accept the position of the Cathaoirleach and looks forward to representing Inishowen.

Cllr Canning stated that how going forward there is a lot of work to do and that in recent times he feels that there has been much blaming each other for failings that are outside of their control and he hopes that going forward everyone works together and supports each other. Cllr Canning acknowledged that the defective blocks issue is the biggest challenge in Inishowen but stated that it is important to continue with improving infrastructure also.

2. Election of the Leas-Chathaoirleach

The Cathaoirleach invited nominations for the office of the Leas-Chathaoirleach.

Cllr Rena Donaghey was proposed by Cllr Martin Farren and this was seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott. Accordingly, Cllr Rena Donaghey was then declared Leas-Chathaoirleach of the Inishowen Municipal District for 2022-2023.

Cllr Rena Donaghey stated that it was a great honour to accept the position. Cllr Rena Donaghey also mentioned the untimely passing of Cllr Bernard McGuinness and how he is still greatly missed. Cllr Donaghey also thanked outgoing chair Cllr Nicholas Crossan.

The Members collectively expressed their association with all the words today in relation to the late Cllr Bernard McGuinness and how he is sorely missed. The Members all thanked out-going chair Cllr Nicholas Crossan for his work throughout the year and congratulated Cllr Paul Canning and Cllr Rena Donaghey on their appointment in the roles of Cathaoirleach and Leas-Chathaoirleach.

Bryan Cannon, A/Director Roads and Transportation, on behalf of the Senior Management Team, wished Cllr Canning and Cllr Donaghey well in their new positions. Bryan Cannon also thanked outgoing Cathaoirleach Cllr Nicholas Crossan and noted the busy schedule he undertook throughout the year. The significant impact of the passing of Cllr Bernard McGuinness was also noted by Bryan Cannon and he acknowledged how the Inishowen Elected Members work together for the advancement of the Municipal District. MINUTES OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 05th JULY 2022 at 2.00pm in CARNDONAGH PUBLIC SERVICE CENTRE

The meeting was opened by the Cathaoirleach, Cllr Paul Canning who welcomed all to the meeting.

22.39 Consideration of the Minutes of the May Meeting of Inishowen Municipal District held on 17th May 2022.

On the proposal of Cllr Rena Donaghey and seconded by Cllr Terry Crossan, the minutes of the Meeting of Inishowen Municipal District Meeting held on 17th May 2022 were agreed.

22.40 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES

Rosita Mahony, Senior Economic Development Officer, presented the report and it was taken as read. Rosita Mahony highlighted a few items to the Members.

22.40.01 Trail Gazers Project

Rosita Mahony advised that this project is coming to an end and one of the key outputs is developing a toolkit to look at the multiplier effect of walking routes. The project team are proposing to hold a workshop with the Members in the Autumn. Details of this will be circulated in advance.

22.40.02 Talent Solutions

Rosita Mahony advised that Donegal County Council continue to work in partnership with Derry City Council and Strabane District Council on a number of key projects with the aim of stimulating inward investment in the region. The Councils are working with consultants to develop a mapping platform to demonstrate the range of skills in the region. Members were advised that there will

be a campaign launched seeking online responses through a survey from both business and employees on current skills in the region in addition to highlighting future skills needs.

22.40.03 AER Summer Academy event

The Assembly of European Regions Summer Academy event will take place in the Atlantic Technology University on the week of 29th August 2022. Donegal County Council will co-host the event with Udarás na Gaeltachta and it is to mark 50-year anniversary of joining the European Union. It is of relevance to any youth organisations.

22.40.04 Donegal Connect 2022

Members were advised that Donegal Connect 2002 will take place 23-25 September 2022. It is part of the Global Irish event therefore Donegal County Council are working with Fáilte Ireland in conjunction with the Department of Foreign Affairs. The aim is to allow the diaspora to explore the county and discover why they should return here to live, work and invest here. There are a number of events planned over the weekend including a genealogy workshop as well as the Tip O Neill Diaspora Awards 2022.

22.40.05 European Project -TIDE

Rosita Mahony updated Members on the TIDE project -an Atlantic network for developing historical maritime projects- and advised that there will be a launch of the virtual reality experience at Greencastle and Fort Dunree on July 13th 2022.Invites will be circulated shortly to Members and stakeholders.

22.40.06 Camper Van pitch, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan enquired about the caravan pitch in Buncrana as he highlighted that all the facilities are in place at this pitch however there is no management in place for it. Cllr Nicholas Crossan noted that potential revenue is being lost here and he requested that something is done about the situation as soon as possible. Members collectively supported Cllr Nicholas Crossan's comments on this issue with Cllr Albert Doherty noting that correspondence had been received from the campervan members who want to see the Council as proactive and welcoming the campervan sector into the County.

Cllr Jack Murray also highlighted how the area could be promoted as a package with the Causeway Coast and Glens and noted the importance of the ferries to the peninsula. Cllr Johnny McGuinness supported Cllr Murray's comments and agreed that the catchment area for tourism needs to be Inishowen's hinderlands. Cllr McGuinness further noted that the camper van sector will be more prevalent due to increase in pricing in the hotel sector and noted a reduction in the footfall in tourism this year in the peninsula. Cllr Terry Crossan enquired if there was any uptake on the Caravan, Camping, Campervan and Motorhome Facilities Grant Scheme 2022 for

businesses to increase the number of overnight accommodation facilities for this sector in locations currently underserved in the county.

22.40.07 Aire de Service Review

Cllr Albert Doherty stated that he would like to see a briefing for all Members as to where the Aire de Service facilities are situated in the Inishowen MD and then also look at areas not serviced.

22.40.08 Property Solutions

Cllr Albert Doherty noted that the report from the Economic Development Unit stated that 12 property solutions were progressing across the County. Cllr Doherty enquired how many are in the Inishowen MD?

22.40.09 Remote Working

Cllr Albert Doherty also noted that from the report that 11 digital hubs are working in the county. Cllr Doherty enquired how many were in the Inishowen MD and how much of a turnover is generated?

22.40.10 Water tanker

Cllr Martin McDermott expressed his extreme disappointment that the water tanker has been situated in Letterkenny. There have been a number of incidents in Inishowen where there has not been enough water and this was the reason behind bringing this motion before full Council. Cllr McDermott highlighted how he has brought this issue up at every meeting and discovered via a press release that it was going to Letterkenny. The Members collectively shared Cllr McDermott's disappointment and frustration on this matter. Cllr Paul Canning undertook to raise this issue at the next Corporate Policy Group meeting. Cllr McDermott requested Rosita Mahony to bring the comments of the Members on this matter to the attention of the relevant people.

22.40.11 North West Region

It was noted that in relation to minute 22.37.07 from the previous meeting that Cllr Albert Doherty confirmed that a motion was past regarding installation of signage from Derry City to Carndonagh.

22.41 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Fiona Doherty presented the report to Members and took the report as read. Fiona Doherty proceeded to highlight a few issues to Members.

22.41.01 2017 Town and Village Renewal Scheme -Newtowncunningham project

Fiona Doherty advised Members that the Tourist Information kiosk is now completed and open and is promoting local interests in the area. Cllr Paul Canning acknowledged the success of the kiosk and thanked Fiona Doherty for the work on this project.

22.41.02 2020 Clár Funding project -Glengad

Fiona Doherty advised that the Portaleen Viewing Point work is now completed and was officially opened by Cllr Martin McDermott, Leas-Cathaoirleach on Wednesday 22nd June 2022. Cllr Martin McDermott thanked Fiona Doherty for all the work carried out on this project.

22.41.03 2021 Clár Funding-Culdaff Outdoor Recreation / Playground project

Fiona Doherty provided an update on this project and confirmed the works are due to commence mid-July and are scheduled to complete in 5 weeks.

22.41.04 Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme - Moville Playground

Fiona Doherty announced that work will commence on the upgrade and improvement of the playpark in Moville on the 01st week of September and duration of completion is 7 weeks. Cllr Martin Farren welcomed this progress.

22.41.05 Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme – Barrack Hill Town Park

Members were updated on this project and advised that an assessment of the two sites is complete and Engineers can progress the project to design and tender stage in September.

Cllr Albert Doherty highlighted that one issue of concern for the Barrack Hill Committee is that the Green Flag previously awarded may be in jeopardy due to the absence of a maintenance and repair plan for the playground. Cllr Doherty also requested an update on the development of a 5km park walk/run/cycle lane.

22.41.06 Malin Head Access & Amenity Improvement Project

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to the report which advised that an update had been provided by the Divisional Manager to Members on the status of the Malin Head Visitor Management Plan. Cllr Doherty advised that he was not aware of this update and requested an update on the status of the project.

Cllr Doherty also noted that land negotiations are ongoing but queried the specifics of this.

Cllr Martin McDermott supported Cllr Doherty's comments and noted his disappointment that another summer has come without progress on this project even though a plan had been agreed with the community three years ago. Cllr McDermott called on Donegal County Council and Fáilte Ireland to make this a priority and noted again that a Project Manager is required in order for this project to move forward and to be delivered. Members collectively supported these comments

to get this project moving forward. Fiona Doherty noted the Members concerns and will relay same to Director of Service Liam Ward and Divisional Manager Paddy Doherty and request a response on same.

22.41.07 Town and Village Renewal Scheme- Clonmany

Cllr Doherty noted that a contractor has been appointed for the resurfacing works at the Colmcille Village and queried if these works are going to plan due to recent increase in costs. Fiona Doherty confirmed the works will commence in September.

22.41.08 Town and Village Streetscape Enhancement Scheme -Burnfoot

Cllr Jack Murray wished to acknowledge the fantastic work that has been completed in Burnfoot and thanked all stakeholders for the participation in the scheme. Cllr Nicholas Crossan supported these comments. Cllr Murray also proposed the development of a play park between Bridgend and Burnfoot. Fiona Doherty noted Cllr Murray's proposal and advised she would discuss further with him in terms of progressing this suggestion.

22.41.09 Moville Town and Village Renewal Scheme

Cllr Martin Farren requested an update on this project.

22.41.10 Slí na Slainte Walk, Moville

Cllr Martin Farren enquired if he could get an indication of when a response on this application might be expected. Fiona Doherty advised that it will be Spring of 2023 when the Department announce funding regarding the outdoor recreation programme.

22.41.11 Capital works

Cllr Paul Canning requested that Brendan O Donnell, Senior Engineer attend for a workshop or meeting with the Elected Members to provide an update on capital works projects in the Inishowen MD.

A workshop for July 25th was agreed with Members.

22.42 ENVIRONMENT

Brian McBrearty presented the report and took it as read.

22.42.01 WEEE Collection Day

Cllr Nicholas Crossan noted on the report that areas with large electrical retailers will not be selected. Cllr Crossan queried how large does a retailer need to be for an area not to be selected?

22.42.02 Buncrana Leisure Centre

Cllr Rena Donaghey and Cllr Murray requested an update. Brian McBrearty advised that he would seek same and revert.

22.42.03 Septic Tanks- National Inspection Plan

Cllr Albert Doherty noted from the report that there has been a 42% failure rate in the 2022 septic tank inspection plan. Cllr Doherty queried if there are any plans or initiatives to provide a workshop or presentation to the public that highlights the issues and assists the public on how to deal with it.

Cllr Paul Canning also noted the high failure rate of 42%. Cllr Canning queried how the roof or surface water entering the system is checked. Brian McBrearty advised he will refer to Joe Ferry, Senior Executive Chemist, for a response.

22.42.04 Big White Bay Shroove

Cllr Martin Farren stated that the hedges leading to the Blue Flag Beach at the Big White Bay, Shroove required strimming and he requested that it is attended to and an update provided. Cllr Farren expressed his frustration that this is an issue he has to raise each year. Brian McBrearty advised that he would be refer this matter to Roads & Transportation section.

22.42.05 Lady's Bay Buncrana

Cllr Jack Murray stated that the issue at Lady's Bay Buncrana needs addressing and noted that the warning signs at the beach has a detrimental effect for tourism. Cllr Murray requested an update from Environment / Irish Water in relation to the issue. Cllr Rena Donaghey also expressed her disappointment at the ongoing issue at Lady's Bay Buncrana. Brian McBrearty advised that he follow up and revert.

22.42.06 Burnfoot Flood Relief Scheme

Cllr Jack Murray welcomed the update on the Burnfoot and Buncrana Flood Relief Schemes. Cllr Murray noted the frustration from families at Páirc an Ghrianáin who have been unable to return to the dwellings there and also the concerns of the families at Elm Park and Riverside in Buncrana.

22.42.07 Blue Flag Beach Culdaff

Cllr Johnny McGuinness raised the issue of access to the blue flag beach at Culdaff. He noted that families with additional needs use Hoist Away cabins for holiday and respite but that they can't get access to the beach. Cllr McGuinness stated that a meeting is still required regarding this ongoing issue. Cllr Martin McDermott supported Cllr McGuinness's comments.

22.43 PLANNING

Killian Smith presented the report and took the report as being read.

Killian Smith noted that Inishowen MD has the highest number of applications and the lowest refusal rates. In addition, Inishowen MD has the highest number of final grants.

22.43.01 Buncrana Regeneration Programme

Cllr Rena Donaghey queried if the design for this project was to be submitted in July.

22.43.02 Taking in Charge of Private Residential Estates

The Taking in Charge team as detailed in the Planning Report for the Inishowen Municpal District meeting, presented three estates, as listed below in the Inishowen MD to Members and sought approval to complete the Taking in Charge process.

- 1. Foxwood, Gleneely
- 2. Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 1)
- 3. Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 2)

The Planning Authority is satisfied that there is a need for a Public Right of Way over the estate roads and sought approval from Members to make an order to create these Rights of Way in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act.

Approval was sought from Members, in accordance with Section 180 of the Planning & Development Act to initiate the procedures under Section 11 of the Roads Act to declare the roads within these estates to be public roads and thereby complete the Taking in Charge of the estates.

Foxwood, Gleneely

On the proposal of Councilor Johnny McGuinness seconded by Councillor Albert Doherty, it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) for the creation of a public right of way over the estate roads within the housing estate Foxwood, Gleneely as set out in the maps in the report, to enable it to proceed with the taking in charge of the estates.

On the proposal of Councillor Albert Doherty, seconded by Councillor Johnny McGuinness it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 11 (1) of the Roads Act, 1993 to declare the estate roads within the housing estate Foxwood, Gleneely to be a public road and note the consequential provisions contained in Section 180(4) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) whereby this Council will also take in charge the water services infrastructure and the public open spaces or car park within the attendant grounds of the development and will subsequently transfer the water services within the estate to Irish Water.

Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 1)

On the proposal of Councillor Martin McDermott seconded by Councillor Johnny McGuinness it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) for the creation of a public right of way over the estate roads within the housing estate Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase1) as set out in the attached maps in the report, to enable it to proceed with the taking in charge of the estates.

On the proposal of Councillor Johnny McGuinness seconded by Councillor Martin McDermott it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 11 (1) of the Roads Act, 1993 to declare the estate roads within the housing estate Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 1) to be a public road and note the consequential provisions contained in Section 180(4) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) whereby this Council will also take in charge the water services infrastructure and the public open spaces or car park within the attendant grounds of the development and will subsequently transfer the water services within the estate to Irish Water.

Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 2)

On the proposal of Councillor Albert Doherty seconded by Councillor Martin McDermott it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) for the creation of a public right of way over the estate roads within the housing estate Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 2) as set out in the attached maps in the report, to enable it to proceed with the taking in charge of the estates.

On the proposal of Councillor Martin McDermott seconded by Councillor Albert Doherty it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 11 (1) of the Roads Act, 1993 to declare the estate roads within the housing estate Gemstone Park, Gleneely (Phase 2) to be a public road and note the consequential provisions contained in Section 180(4) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) whereby this Council will also take in charge the water services infrastructure and the public open spaces or car park within the attendant grounds of the development and will subsequently transfer the water services within the estate to Irish Water.

22.43.03 Regeneration Programme Moville

Cllr Farren wished to acknowledge that Paul Kelly, Senior Executive Planner rang him and gave him an update on the project and an undertaking that a visit will be arranged as soon as possible.

22.43.04 Tus Nua Project

In response to previous enquiries from Cllr Albert Doherty, Cllr Martin Farren and Cllr Martin McDermott

Killian Smith advised that work is progressing on the project, but it is slow process. A date of Monday 25th July was agreed with Members for a workshop on the project with Paul Kelly, Senior Executive Planner.

22.44 HOUSING, CORPORATE AND CULTURAL SERVICES

Aideen Doherty presented the report and took it as read. Aideen Doherty highlighted a few matters to the Members.

22.44.01 Baile na Carraige, Buncrana

Aideen Doherty advised that the allocation of the 21 new dwellings at Baile na Caraige, Buncrana has been completed. It was noted that there were 5 refusals, however there is a waiting list and these dwellings will be reallocated. Aideen Doherty further noted the difficult task associated with the allocations due to a number of factors-

- Long Term Leases Properties expiring,
- RAS tenancy agreements expiring with Landlords wishing to take back the dwellings to rent in the private market,
- Current council tenants transfers due to defective concrete block issues
- Exceptional transfers cases

Aideen Doherty advised that a formal opening and official naming of the estate will take place when all the new tenants have moved into the estate.

Cllrs Jack Murray, Rena Donaghey, Nicholas Crossan all welcomed the allocation of the new dwellings at Baile na Carraige. It was noted by Members that allocations are difficult in the current circumstances and staff of the Housing Services were thanked for the work on this allocation.

Cllr Nicholas Crossan expressed his frustration upon learning that 5 dwellings were refused and stated that it finds it difficult to understand why a refusal would be made considering that we currently have a housing crisis in Inishowen. Cllr Nicholas Crossan queried if these applicants can refuse another property. Aideen Doherty confirmed that the reasons for refusal will have to be considered and a decision made as to whether it is a reasonable or unreasonable refusal.

22.44.02 Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Cllr Albert Doherty noted from the housing report that developers who had submitted valid proposals for Buncrana and Carndonagh have withdrawn from the process and Cllr Doherty queried the reasons for this. Aideen Doherty advised that on some occasions it can be to do with the capacity to deliver but she would require specific detail on these proposals. Aideen Doherty also confirmed that discussions are ongoing for a potential turnkey acquisition in Carndonagh.

22.44.03 Disposal of Property at The Bath Green, Moville

Aideen Doherty advised Members that Donegal County Council proposes to lease property at The Bath Green, Moville comprising of 0.0735 hectares of land including two buildings and decking area constructed thereon to Inish Adventures Limited, Greencastle Road, Moville, County. Donegal.

Members considered the report circulated with the agenda in relation to the above.

On the proposal of Cllr Martin Farren and seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott it was recommended that this land disposal under Section 183 of the Local Government Act, 2001 is presented to the next Plenary Council Meeting.

22.44.04 Defective Concrete Blocks Bill 2022.

Cllr Albert Doherty highlighted that today In Dáil Éireann under the order of business, consideration is to be given to the allocation of time for the debate of the Defective Concrete Blocks Bill 2022 and the new amendments. Cllr Albert Doherty proposed that correspondence is sent to Minister of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, Darragh O'Brien, conveying that the Inishowen MD Councillors fully support the amendments tabled and urge the Minister for the provision of sufficient time for the consideration of these revisions and amendments. Cllr Terry Crossan seconded this proposal. Aideen Doherty noted same and arranged for the correspondence to be issued.

22.44.05 Municipal District Meetings

Cllr Jack Murray proposed a start time of 2pm for MD meetings. This proposal was seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott.

22.45.06 Mayor of St. Charles, Missouri, USA

Cllr Rena Donaghey advised that the Mayor of St. Charles, Missouri would like to visit Inishowen MD on the 17/18/19th September along with colleagues and would like to meet with Inishowen MD Members while they are here. Further details are to follow.

22.45 ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

Michael McFadden presented the report and took it as read and highlighted some matters to Members.

- Restoration Improvement Programme 2022 is progressing well, a lot of work is complete.
- Restoration and Maintenance Programme -over 90% of work has been completed.
- Bridge Strengthening Programme 2022- remedial works are proposed to be carried out at Ballyloskey Bridge and these works are required to be completed by the end of September.
- Low Cost Safety Programme 2022- signs have been erected at the Crossroads Junction at Tul na Ri, Carndonagh
- Road Design are currently progressing the Crash barrier Assessment for the R238, Clar, Moville scheme. currently awaiting CEO approval for this to proceed.

22.45.01 Proposed Lease of Greencastle Harbour, Greencastle

Michael McFadden advised Members that it is recommended that Donegal County Council enters into a 4 year 9 month Lease Agreement (01/01/2021 to 31/09/2025) with the Michael Kavanagh Fishing Ltd, Mossy Glen, Lecamy, Carndonagh, Co Donegal in respect of a site at Queensport, Greencastle Harbour, Greencastle, Co Donegal for the purpose of storage and under the agreed terms. On the proposal of Cllr Martin Farren and seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott the proposed lease was approved.

22.45.02 Footpath Provision Programme

Cllr Martin Farren raised the issue of the footpath at Quay Street, Moville and noted that the work is to be carried out in August. In the case of more funding becoming available Cllr Farren requested that the Council consider putting bitmac on the footpath repair at River Row Moville.

22.45.03 Hedge Cutting

Cllr Martin Farren noted that hedge cutting is required in many areas and that he has submitted a list of areas to the Roads Department. Cllr Farren requested an update on this.

22.45.04 Battery Brae, Greencastle

Cllr Martin Farren referred to a matter at Battery Brae, Greencastle regarding a dispute over the erection of a wall. Cllr Farren stated that he believes that this matter has now been resolved and he requested an update on the matter.

22.45.05 Moville to Derry Road

Cllr Martin Farren queried if there was any success sourcing funding for the installation of cats' eyes on the Muff to Moville road. Cllr Terry Crossan supported these comments. Michael McFadden confirmed these works were on the agenda for consideration.

22.45.06 Clar Corner

Cllr Martin Farren noted that €25,000 had been allocated for crash barrier at Clar corner and the road design team were currently looking at this. Cllr Farren requested an update.

22.45.07 Funding -Road Improvement Programme

Cllr Martin McDermott stated that be believed that the same level of funding is not available for the improvement of roads especially with the increase in costs and he enquired if the Council have applied to the Department for additional funding. Cllr Albert Doherty supported these comments. Bryan Cannon, A/Director of Roads and Transportation advised that the issue has been raised with the Department and unfortunately the roads allocation remains as it is at this time. Bryan Cannon advised Members that the Council staff have done their best to mitigate

against the impact of these costs increases by delivering as much work as possible with the allocations received and continue to explore any opportunity for additional funding.

22.45.08 Signage Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan queried if the Council could consider putting additional signage in Buncrana at Shore Road especially for traffic coming from the Lough Swilly Ferry so they can easily be directed to areas such as Town Centre, Swan Park and Tourist Information Office.

22.45.09 Street Cleaning

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that when the street cleaning contract is being renewed that consideration is given to include the estates that have been taken over by the Council. Cllr N Crossan stated that it would be a great benefit to the Tidy Towns Committee. Cllr Jack Murray supported these comments. Michael McFadden confirmed that this would be looked at with the Area Engineer.

22.45.10 Westbrook, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan welcomed the slowing down of the traffic at Westbrook however he believes there is little room now for cyclists. Cllr Crossan enquired if it is possible to include a cycle lane at this location. Michael McFadden advised that this would be referred to Road Design Team.

22.45.11 Street Lights

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested a workshop for Members regarding street lighting. Cllr Albert Doherty noted that additional street lighting is still required at Carrowreagh road, Carndonagh and would like this issue resolved before the winter months.

22.45.12 Main St, Muff

Cllr Terry Crossan stated that there is an ongoing issue at Main St, Muff. Michael McFadden confirmed the Roads department are aware of this issue and it will be investigated further.

22.45.13 Greenway

Cllr Terry Crossan advised that he received an update this morning from Derry City and Strabane District Council that the stretch of greenway from Culmore to Foyle Hospice is now out for tender and it will be awarded in August. Cllr T Crossan also renewed his calls for signage in relation to dog fouling and bins for the disposal to be installed at each end of the Muff Greenway. Michael McFadden confirmed that he would discuss with the Environment department.

22.45.14 Donagh Park, Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty noted that Roads personnel have previously visited Donagh Park in relation to the concerns of residents regarding ramps for reducing speed, a section of perimeter missing and significant erosion from the Donagh river. Cllr Doherty requested an update on this. Michael McFadden advised that ramps had been procured for Donagh Park, but delivery will be six weeks. It was also confirmed that the other issues would be looked at with the Area Engineer.

22.45.15 Primary School, Gleneely

Cllr Doherty highlighted a concern from the school principal in Gleneely and requested that improvements are made to road signage and road markings near Glenbree estate and Cnoc na Noinini estate in Gleneely.

22.45.16 Ballyloskey Road junction, Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty noted that this issue at Ballyloskey Road junction onto the main Derry road has still not been resolved and he requested an update.

22.45.17 Ferris Lane Carpark, Buncrana

Cllr Jack Murray highlighted that Ferris Lane at Buncrana is still closed following the fire at premises there in February 2019 and queried if this road could be reopened. Cllr Murray also noted an ongoing problem with anti-social behaviour at the carpark on Ferris Lane. Cllr Rena Donaghey supported Cllr Murray's comments in relation to Ferris Lane and getting this road reopened again. Cllr Donaghey noted that rubbish is being dumped behind the barriers in place there. Cllr Donaghey further noted that the primary care centre is being opened soon and with this increase in traffic Ferris lane reopened would help alleviate some of the traffic congestion. Michael McFadden advised that he is aware of the situation and it was currently closed for public safety.

22.45.18 Causeway Road Buncrana

Cllr Jack Murray raised and issue at Causeway Rd Buncrana?

22.45.19 Blacks Bridge, Burt

Cllr Jack Murray noted that the road at Blacks Bridge Burt is in poor state of repair and Cllr Murray requested that some repair works are carried out.

22.45.20 Fahan Pier Crane

Cllr Jack Murray reiterated his calls for the crane removed from Fahan pier to be relocated to Inishowen as soon as possible from its temporary location in Donegal Town. Cllr Murray

suggested Shore Front Buncrana or the Greenway at Fahan as possible locations for it. Cllr Johnny McGuinness supported Cllr Murrays calls for a speedy resolution to this matter.

22.45.21

Cllr Jack Murray said that residents were requesting speed ramps at Millfield, Buncrana?

22.45.22 Road Maintenance

Cllr Johnny McGuinness raised a number of issues regarding road maintenance-

- Surface dressing at Malin, road too narrow, HGV pulling into verge into area that is been dredged. Location of telegraph questioned.
- Road at Ballyharry to Carrowmenagh -project was to be completed- update requested
- Footbridge at Culdaff no works currently being carried out and update requested. Cllr Paul Canning supported Cllr McGuinness in relation to the footbridge. Michael McFadden advised that the footbridge is moving forward but will revert with timeframe.

Cllr Paul Canning referred to the Active Travel Programme and asked if at raised platform could be an option at the chapel at Killea?





FLOOD RELIEF SCHEMES

BUNCRANA FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME – BRIEFING NOTE NO. 05

1. PROGRESS SUMMARY

1.1 Engineering Surveys and Site Investigations:

a. **Hydrometric Tidal Survey:** To date, the project team have received three sets of hydrometric survey data from gauges recording tidal levels around Lough Swilly covering the period of May to July 2022. The Steering Group have agreed to extend the survey until the end of September. This data will be key to understanding coastal risk in Ramelton, Buncrana and Luddan.

1.2 Hydrology and Hydraulics:

The draft hydrology report was submitted to the Steering Group in August 2022 for review. Hydraulic modelling is progressing and will continue until November 2022 before draft baseline outputs are ready for review by the Steering Group. The baseline outputs will consist of estimates for flooding for a varied of return periods e.g. estimates for the levels and impact of the 1 in 10 year (10% AEP), 1 in 100 year (1% AEP) and 1 in 1000 year (0.1% AEP) floods with present day conditions before mitigation measures are put in place.

1.3 Environmental Assessments:

The specialist third-party environmental surveys have commenced – including Aquatic Ecology Surveys and Bat Surveys. Remaining specialist surveys will be carried out during winter 2022 and/or as required once design options have been progressed further. These surveys will form a critical part of the planning submission for the preferred option.

1.4 Stakeholder and Third-Party Communications

1.4.1 Project Website

The project website is being updated on an ongoing basis with a quarterly newsletter to be posted after the issue of this Briefing Note.

1.5 Contracts

A contract for treatment of invasive species has been awarded to Greentown Environmental Ltd. The treatment process began in July 2022 and is currently ongoing. The contract has been awarded up to the end of the 2024.

2. NEXT STEPS

- **Hydrology**: Review of Steering Group comments and submission of the final hydrology report.
- Hydraulic Modelling: Continuation of hydraulic modelling calibration stage and baseline scenario runs
- Environmental Assessment: Continue with specialist surveys
- Invasive Species Treatment Contract: Continuation of invasive species treatment
- Natural Water Retention Measures: Complete the assessment of potential for Natural Water Retention Measures in river catchments to alleviate flood risk and issue first draft maps for review.

BURNFOOT FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME

Briefing Note 7 – August 2022

Progress Summary

The project team have collected all available data relating to past flood events, the local environment, river catchments, topography, culverts, rainfall and river flow. This data has been analysed extensively and used to produce a detailed computer model of the Burnfoot and Skeoge Rivers as they flow through the village and discharge at Inch Lough. The model has been calibrated against past flood events, most notably August 2017, to ensure it is correctly simulating and mapping flood risk in the area. A range of design flood events have been tested in the model to cover all eventualities including the risk of more severe flooding due to climate change.

Various flood risk management options were considered and modelled to evaluate the most effective scheme for Burnfoot. All types of potential measures have been looked at in detail, including but not limited to those in the North Western Flood Risk Management Plan (www.floodinfo.ie).

Each option was subject to a costing exercise to determine the whole life cost across the design life. The team are currently refining these costs based on the best available current market data.

A property economic damage assessment has been completed for the Burnfoot FRS. This provides estimates of the monetary impacts/ damages caused by flooding, from which the potential benefits of the flood scheme can be calculated across its design life. The ratio of whole life cost against monetary benefit determines economic viability and score (Benefit Cost Ratio) which informs selection of the preferred option.

A Multi-Criteria Analysis has been undertaken to assess the performance of each option against a range of technical, environmental, social and economic factors. This also informs the selection of the preferred option and ensures that benefits beyond economic viability are considered.

This process of option development, analysis and screening has resulted in the following measures remaining under consideration:

- Hard defences (earthen embankments and flood walls) at Burnfoot
- Modification/ removal of embankments downstream of Burnfoot
- Works to improve conveyance at the R238 road bridge
- Culvert upgrades

A collaborative workshop was held in April 2022 with a view to developing the preferred option. The workshop was attended by the Burnfoot FRS Steering Group and other relevant public sector stakeholders. Since then, RPS has been considering the feedback and refining the emerging preferred option based on buildability, operation and maintenance, adaptability to climate and other future changes.

The emerging preferred option has been assessed to determine the level of environmental assessment required. RPS have determined that the Scheme will require Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) under the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) and an Appropriate Assessment (AA) with Natura Impact Statement under the European Communities (Natural Habitats) Regulations (S.I. No. 94 of 1997) under Regulation 31 (Annex 1.2). The scope of these assessments is currently being established and will be completed when the preferred option is selected.

Further specialist environmental services, such as otter surveys, will be required to further inform the Environmental Impact and Appropriate Assessment of the preferred option.

The treatment of Invasive and Alien Species (IAS), specifically Japanese Knotweed, is ongoing as part of the Scheme Invasive Species Management Plan in advance of the construction period. Treatment was undertaken in July with a second application scheduled for late September/ early October 2022.

Next Steps

Surveys: RPS are looking at further surveys to inform the preliminary design of a scheme, including ground investigation and services.

Scheme Analysis and Development: RPS are working to confirm the preferred option in conjunction with the Steering Group. Options reports including supplementary reporting on the application of nature-based catchment measures, buildability, operation and maintenance and climate change adaptation are being prepared. **Environmental Assessment:** Scoping for Environmental Impact Assessment is ongoing. Specialist environmental surveys to inform the EIA are scheduled for autumn 2022.

Public Information Day: A public information day is planned for November 2022 to present the preferred Scheme Option.

Planning Application: A further statutory public consultation will be held early next year as part of the planning process. Following this documentation for the scheme will be prepared and submitted for planning later in 2023.



1.0 RURAL REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

1.1 EXISTING APPROVED CATEGORY 1 RRDF PROJECTS (2019)

1.1.1 Killybegs 2040 – A Town Centre Regeneration Project Value: €4.84m

This project proceeded to tender in February 2022 and closed on 1st April 2022. The tender assessment and evaluation was completed and a tender report submitted to the DRCD on 4th May 2022 for: (i) Decision Gate 3 Approval to appoint the preferred tenderer and to proceed to site, and (ii) enhanced funding to deliver the project.

The process of project handover to the Councils new Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) has also commenced in anticipation of imminent progression to site. CPDU will manage the construction and handover stage of the project. In advance of same the following arrangements to update the Elected Members and the general public have been made:

- 12pm Tuesday 6th September 2022. Members will be updated on this project, the delivery arrangements and associated timelines at a scheduled workshop of the Donegal Municipal District;
- 3-7pm Thursday 8th September 2022. An open public information event will be held in the Tara Hotel, Killybegs to update the general public on the project, the

delivery arrangements and associated timelines. This will be a drop in event, project information will be on display and relevant Council staff will be present to facilitate queries and clarifications etc.

1.1.2 Burtonport and Aranmore Island – Harbour to Island Regeneration Value: €4.1m

Aranmore Island:

This element of the project is now complete and the Forbairt Taitneamhachtaí Cois Cladaigh Oileán Árainn Mhór (Arranmore Island Shorefront Amenity Development) was officially opened by the Minister for Rural & Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD on Friday 22nd July 2022 in the presence of Leas-Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council Cllr. Michael Naughton and representatives of Comharchumann Oileán Árainn Mhór CTR.

The performance space has already been used on many occasions, including as a part of the Earigall Arts Festival and hosted its inaugural concert after the official opening when Clann Mhic Ruairí, Green Island & Special guests entertained everyone present.

Burtonport Harbour

The Phase 1 redevelopment of Burtonport Harbour has now commenced. These works are being delivered by the successful contractor McDermott & Trearty Construction Ltd and are already progressing well towards substantial completion.

The process of project handover to the Councils new Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) is now complete in respect of this project. CPDU will now manage the completion of construction and handover stages of the project.

1.2 EXISTING APPROVED CATEGORY 2 RRDF PROJECTS (2020)

1.2.1 **Back to Ballyshannon** – A transformational project to re-energise, re-imagine and sustain the social, cultural, historical, physical and economic fabric of Ballyshannon's historic town centre.

Value: €247,500. (RRDF funding approved €185,625)

Update: The Team continues to work towards (i) progressing an acquisition interest in Ballyshannon Town Centre, and (ii) the publication of a planning scheme, so as to develop this project as a shovel ready capital project targeted for future Category 1 RRDF funding. Steady progress continues to be made through complex reporting and appraisals in relation to: the environment & ecology, archaeology and structural investigation and which will inform the next steps in the acquisition process and the planning consent pathway.

Members will be provided with a detailed progress update at workshop in September. The Regeneration & Development will make separate arrangements for same in due course.

1.2.2 **Ramelton Historic Town Centre** – A Restorative & Transformational Public Realm Scheme.

Value: €249,159 (RRDF funding approved €186,869)

Update: A Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Tuesday 1st February 2022 and a Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members at a Plenary Meeting of the Council on Wednesday 6th April, 2022 and it was decided to proceed with the development as proposed.

The Regeneration and Development Team subsequently completed the submission of a Category 1 capital funding application to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund for the capital delivery of this project by the 12noon deadline on Friday 29th April, 2022. The submitted project has a total project value of €7,949,868 and is now under assessment. Meanwhile, work continues to advance on the Detailed Design of Project together with preparation of a completed Tender Package, which is scheduled for completion by the end of September of this year.

1.3 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL

REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

1.3.1. Ballybofey & Stranorlar - The 'SEED' project – A sustainable, green regeneration project to

Strengthen, Engage, Enable and Deliver transformational change in Ballybofey-Stranorlar. Value: €9,756,969.

Due diligence has been completed on this project and the formal Funding Agreement received and confirmed. The Project Brief and Procurement Strategy have been submitted to the DRCD for this project and for Decision Gate 2 (Pretender) approval. These documents are presently under consideration and on receipt of approval this project will proceed to tender. It is anticipated that the capital works element of this project will commence in Q3 of 2022.

1.3.2. Burtonport (Harbour to Island) Regeneration Value: €2.3m

Due diligence has been completed on this project and the formal Funding Agreement received and confirmed. This project is at an advanced stage of readiness given that consultancy services were previously procured using Councils own resources. On 20th April, 2022 a Project Brief and Procurement Strategy were submitted to the DRCD for Decision Gate 2 Approval to recommence consultancy services to complete detailed design and proceed to tender stage in advance of construction. Approval to proceed was subsequently received on 3rd May 2022 and the services of MH Associates have recently been re-engaged to complete the detailed design phase and subsequently progress to tender stage.

The process of project handover to the Councils new Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) is completing in respect of this project. CPDU will manage the completion of the detailed design, construction and handover stages of the project and arrangements will be made to update Members in due course and once handover is complete.

1.3.3. Carndonagh Tús Nua Regeneration Project Value: €9,542,852

Due diligence has been completed on this project and the formal Funding Agreement received and confirmed. The Project Brief and Procurement Strategy for this project was submitted to the DRCD for Decision Gate 2 and Pre-Tender approval on 8th August 2022. Decision Gate 2 approval was subsequently received for this project on 11th August 2022. Arrangements are now being made with the Capital Projects Delivery Unit to progress this project to tender stage. It is anticipated that the capital works element of this project will commence in Q3 of 2022.

1.4 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 2 PROJECTS UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 6th January 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €1.17m had been awarded under the Third Call for Category 2 Projects of the RRDF for the "Repowering Buncrana" regeneration Project.

Due diligence has been completed on this project and a formal letter of Offer together with an associated Funding Agreement was received on 10th May 2022. The Funding Agreement was subsequently accepted and formally returned to the Department on 18th May 2022. The project will now progress to procurement of the required consultancy services before commencement of the planning and statutory consents stages of this project enabled by the funding award. A successful public information event in respect of this project was held in the Inishowen Gateway Hotel, Buncrana on Monday 23rd May, 2022.

1.5 FOURTH CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL

REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 17th December 2021 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD announced the fourth call for Category 1 applications to the €1 Billion Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF).

The closing date for the receipt of proposals was 12 noon on Friday 29th April 2022.

As described at Point 1.2.2. above the Ramelton Re-Imagined regeneration project, with a value of €7,949,868 was submitted under this call and is now under assessment.

1.6 REGENERATION STRATEGIES & PROJECT DEVELOPMENT WORK

The Regeneration & Development Team had undertaken with Members to progress Regeneration Strategies in a number of Tier 2 Strategic Towns as a part of our work programme. This work has been progressing through in house resources and capacities together with consultancy services. An update on this area of the work programme is provided hereinunder:

1.6.1 Ramelton Action Plan

The Ramelton Action Plan was formally launched on 3rd July 2020.

1.6.2 Killybegs Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Killybegs Regeneration Strategy was formally launched on 6th July 2021 and is available at https://bit.ly/KillybegsRegStrat. It has also been circulated across Donegal County Council Directorates and to key stakeholders.

The Strategy was commissioned by the Killybegs Regeneration Group in conjunction with Donegal County Council and was funded by BIM, FLAG with match funding by Donegal County Council. Its delivery was led by Pasparakis Friel Architects with the support and input of the Council's Community Development Section and the Regeneration and Development Team.

1.6.3 Ballybofey-Stranorlar Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Ballybofey-Stranorlar Regeneration Strategy was endorsed by the Committee of BASICC, as project partners, on 7th February 2022 and subsequently endorsed by the Stranorlar-Lifford MD on 25th May 2022. The Strategy was launched 27th May 2022 by means of press release and is currently being circulated across Donegal County Council Directorates and to key stakeholders. The Strategy is available at Donegal County Council (donegalcoco.ie)

1.6.4 Ballyshannon Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Ballyshannon Town Centre Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan was formally published, launched and circulated to Members on the 20th April 2022. The Strategy &

Action Plan, and associated Town Centre Masterplan, is available to view/download online at www.donegalcoco.ie and at Council offices. It will also be circulated across Donegal County Council Directorates and to key stakeholders. The Strategy was commissioned and funded by Donegal County Council and its delivery was led by GM Design Associates with the support and input of the Council's Regeneration and Development Team.

1.6.5 An Clochán Liath (Dungloe) Regeneration Strategy & Action Plan

The Draft an Clochán Liath (Dungloe) Town Centre Regeneration Strategy and Action Plan was made available for public consultation from Tuesday 5th April until Tuesday 3rd May 2022. A drop-in public consultation event also took place on Thursday 14th April from 2.00pm to 7.00pm at the Shopping Arcade, Main Street, Dungloe. In addition to the comments received and discussed during the drop-in event a total of 12 no. written submissions from members of the public were received.

A short report on the submissions has been completed and was considered at a workshop of the Glenties MD on Tuesday 19th July 2022 and at which Members endorsed the final Strategy and Action Plan subject to agreed amendments. Arrangements are now being made for final publication, launch and circulation across Donegal County Council Directorates and statutory bodies and community organisations and it is anticipated that this will take place at, or in advance of, the September Municipal District Meeting.

1.6.6 Rathmullan RRDF Project Development work

Work to complete the Draft Design & Design Report for this project is advancing, and targeted stakeholder group consultations took place in December 2021. This primarily included key internal Council services, external statutory bodies and a cross-section of community interests in Rathmullan identified by 'The Way Forward' group. A presentation on the Draft Design Report for this project was made to the Elected Members at a scheduled workshop on 2nd June 2022 in advance of an informal public consultation event which took place later the same day from 3pm to 8pm in the St. Vincent de Paul Centre, Rathmullan. The closing date for observations on the draft designs was 16th June, 2022. The submission responses together with the Draft Design & Design Reports are presently being evaluated with a view to progressing a statutory planning scheme for the Project in Q3 of 2022.

2.0 URBAN REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (URDF)

2.1 Existing approved URDF project in Letterkenny (application submitted 2018; final approval to proceed received September 2019)

This first application secured €1.9m in URDF monies, match funded by €600,000 for three sub-projects, the detail and progress of which is set out below:

(i) Preparation of a Regeneration Strategy for Letterkenny Town Centre.

The 3rd and final phase of consultation on the Letterkenny Regeneration Strategy opened on 20th May 2022 and closed on 6th June 2022 relating to Design Concepts for 11 key regeneration sites. In response, 52 online surveys were completed and 9 direct email submissions were received. The consultation period also included a public drop-in event on Tuesday 31st May 2022 in Dillons Hotel which was attended by circa 40 people.

The consultancy team, led by The Paul Hogarth Company presented the findings of the 3rd phase of consultation together with Draft Design Guidelines (Work Area 3), Draft Public Spaces and Linkages Action Plan (Work Area 4) and a Lower Main Street exemplar to a workshop of Letterkenny-Milford MD on 8th July 2022 wherein Members endorsed the finalization and publication of the Regeneration Strategy thus the project reaching a significant milestone.

The consultancy team are currently working on the final write up and to bring together all strands of the project brief including Work Area 5 in respect of branding.

Plans are being formulated for a formal launch event which is expected to be held toward early October 2022. The services of AV Brown branding consultants, as part of the multi-disciplinary team are being engaged to create a video to inform the launch and to communicate the project effectively to the public, investors, visitors and funders. Members will be updated directly as the arrangements develop in relation to the launch event of the final Regeneration Strategy.

(ii) Acquisition of key town centre regeneration site.

Work to progress interests in the key regeneration site approved by DHLGH for acquisition continues with intent. The Donegal County Council (Letterkenny Strategic Urban Regeneration Site) CPO 2021 was published on 4th November 2021. It was subsequently submitted to An Bord Pleanala for confirmation on 8th November 2021. The period for the making of objections to the CPO expired on 20th December 2021 and a single objection was received by An Bord Pleanala to this CPO. The next step is the fixing of date for oral hearing by An Bord Pleanala with the case now identified as a 'Priority.'

Alongside acquisition, Phase 1 development of the site was approved at a Special Meeting of Donegal County Council on 24th February 2022. The proposed development includes for the demolition of former ESB buildings and the development of circa 60,500sqft business, enterprise and innovation space (Alpha/Beta) supported by access linkages and public realm. This project is now being progressed by the Capital Projects Team to its next stage of detailed design with input from the Regeneration and Development Team in relation to review of tender documents and participation in Steering Group and Design Team Review meetings.

Alongside the Part 8 proposed development, discussions are ongoing internally in relation to options for the business model as regards the residential component of the Concept Masterplan relating to the remainder of the strategic site (Phase 2). Further updates will be brought to the Letterkenny-Milford MD in this regard as this work develops.

(iii) Public realm in the area of the Public Services Centre and Joe Bonnar Rd

Members turned the sod on 3rd June 2022 on the project to construct public realm in the area of the Public Services Centre and Joe Bonnar Road. ACS Civils LTD have been appointed and commenced on site on the week beginning 6th June 2022 with a build period in the region of 6 months. The development will deliver high quality walking, cycling and public realm infrastructure in the town centre. It forms the 1st phase of the wider planned network known as 'LK Green Connect' that will ultimately connect across a series of town centre destinations.

2.2 Successful application to the Urban Regeneration & Development Fund (May 2020)

On Friday 12th March 2021 Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage, Darragh O'Brien TD announced that a provisional allocation of €13.6m has been awarded under the URDF application Letterkenny 2040 (Phase 1) 'Re-energise and Connect the Historic Town Centre' supported by match funding committed by the Council in the sum of €4.5m.

Specifically this new investment will help to advance five projects to varying stages of as follows:

- The further enhancement of the Cathedral Quarter
- The re-purposing of the Courthouse
- Strategic land assembly towards:
 - o Regeneration of Lower Main Street
 - o Advancement of a Regional Transport Hub
 - o Enhancement of 'LK Green Connect,' walking, cycling and parkland infrastructure.

The project continues to progress through funding approval steps required under the Public Spending Code. In this regard, a Preliminary Business Case (PBC) was submitted to DHLGH in March 2022 and for review and approval. This was followed by submission of Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy on 29th July 2022.

The current status of the project is that the Preliminary Business Case secured approval of DHLGH on 11th August 2022. This represents approval under Decision Gate 1 in the project life cycle and 'approval in principle to Donegal County Council to proceed to Design, Planning & Procurement Strategy.' As outlined, a Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy has already been submitted to DHLGH on 29th July 2022 and is therefore actively under review and consideration by DHLGH.

Approval of Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy will lead to approval to proceed to tendering inclusive of satisfactory completion of the Final Business Case and thereafter each project will advance at varying paces dependent on nature, scale and complexity.

Alongside the above activity, a number of steps are being taken to develop each subproject further. The table below sets out this activity.

2.3 Future URDF call for applications

Although there is no confirmed date available for a 3rd call for URDF applications, an announcement is anticipated as early as Q4 2022/Q1 2023 and following an ongoing review of funding commitments/ project costs currently being undertaken by DHLGH. Consideration is being given to the options in this regard including the further sequencing of investment to deliver on the LK 2040 ambition particularly in relation to the advancement of a Regional Transport Hub, associated accessibility infrastructure and capital projects at Lower Main Street. It is proposed to scope the options with Members of Letterkenny-Milford MD as part of a future MD workshop.

2.4 Other

The Regeneration and Development Team continue to engage in other regeneration related work areas and support other sections of Donegal County Council as required and across a number of other activities.

In tandem with the above construction programme, the Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available.

2. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council's turnkey acquisition process is continuing throughout the county. This competitive dialogue procurement process will result in a major capital investment in social housing, with the initial projects in the county now complete. This is a very effective mechanism enabling the Council to feed into the design of the proposal to ensure that the end product is suitable for the needs of social housing tenants.

In order to safeguard the nature of the process and bearing in mind the commercial sensitivities of the process as well as the extent of the approvals required, the Council will continue to provide Elected Members with detailed information of the proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval (i.e. stage 4).

Contract discussions are ongoing for a potential turnkey acquisition at Convent Road, Carndonagh.

Council officials are continuing to dialogue with Developers with regard to the additional valid proposal for Moville. Members will be fully informed of this proposal upon receipt of Irish Water requirements and final departmental approval.

3. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is planning to develop further projects on existing landbank in various locations throughout the county. Preliminary designs are underway for a number of these sites and are informed by the pertaining approved social housing need at local level. Land negotiations are ongoing to acquire additional lands for housing in areas of need.

There is an open advertisement on the Council's website for expressions of interest for parcels of land, derelict sites / buildings with the potential to deliver social housing. A significant county-wide response has been received to this advert and approximately 15 submissions for Inishowen MD have been shortlisted and are receiving detailed consideration.

Works are scheduled to start within a couple of weeks, (September 2022)


Works will include:

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1.0 PROJECT SUMMARY DETAILS

Project: N13 Bridgend to County Boundary Route Improvement Project

Proposed route improvement of a 1.2km section of the existing N13 through Bridgend and on to the border with Northern Ireland where

the N13 connects to the A2 Buncrana Road.

Scheme Description:

Description:

The village of Bridgend sits at the base of the Inishowen Peninsula on the most strategically important border crossing in the Northwest. The village is bisected by the N13 / A2 transboundary route which facilitates more than 19,000 vehicle movements (per working day) across the border in both directions. The strategic importance of the route is supported by the fact that the N13 / A2 transboundary route forms part of the TEN-T. This is a network of multimodal strategic transport corridors identified to improve the mobility of goods and people throughout the European Union (EU).

The N13 Bridgend to County Boundary Route Improvement Project focuses on a 1.2 km long section of the N13 National Primary Route through the village of Bridgend and onto the border with Northern Ireland (Derry) where it connects to the A2 Buncrana Road.

The juxtaposition in currency, regulation, taxation, and employment opportunity between each jurisdiction has and continues to make, the area immediately both sides of the border and adjacent to this section of the N13 / A2 attractive to commercial, retail and residential development. This has increasing potential to significantly undermine the operational efficiency of the N13 / A2 transboundary route. These developments coupled with Brexit, the establishment of the Northwest City Region and associated European, Regional, National and Local policy developments has significantly increased the strategic importance and priority improvement of this section of road in recent years.

2.0 PROJECT STATUS

The proposed project is currently being developed through the Phases of the Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) Project Management Guidelines (PMG) as follows:

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During 2021, the Donegal NRO developed the project through **Phase 0** and **Phase 1** of the TII-PMG, obtaining TII approval to procure and appoint *Multidisciplinary Engineering and Other Specialist Consultancy Services*, to develop the project in partnership with the Donegal NRO from **Phase 2** to **Phase 5** inclusive.

To date during 2022 the project has progressed in accordance with our agreed consultancy programme to approximately 60% completion of the **Phase 2 – Options Selection** process.




Figure 2.1 - Project Status & Approvals

3.0 PROGRAMME AND PROGRESS

The project is currently at Phase 2: Options Selection, which is a 3-stage process and has completed the Stage 1 Preliminary Options Assessment.

At Stage 1 Preliminary Options Assessment, twenty-one initial route corridor options were developed (titled Stage 1A Options). These underwent an initial sifting process to refine the number of options to twelve corridors (Stage 1B Options) for more detailed assessment. These twelve Route Corridor Options were subjected to the Stage 1 Preliminary Options Assessment in accordance with the TII Project Management Guidelines and Project Appraisal Guidelines under the headings of:



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The Stage 1 options have been assessed and five options are now being recommended to take forward to the more detailed Stage 2 (Project Appraisal Matrix) assessment.



4.0 PUBLIC CONSULTATION

A key attribute of Phase 2, and indeed project development, is the facilitation of open, engaging, and continuous stakeholder consultation. During Phase 2 and throughout stakeholder engagement is being facilitated by public consultation events, media notification and engagement, and web-based services. As such, on the 30th March 2022 Public Consultation No.1 – Constraints Study, was held at An Grianán Hotel, Burt, informing members of the public and other interested parties on the constraints identified that could affect the development of future options. Following feedback from this consultation, the Study Area was increased to accommodate potential options further west of Bridgend.

Donegal County Council has invited residents of the local area, members of the public, public representatives, and other interested parties to participate in a second non-statutory public consultation today, Tuesday 6th September 2022, again in An Grianán Hotel, Burt. The aim of this second public consultation, is to demonstrate how the five options recommended to go forward were assessed, and selected, and to receive views on the five options being taken forward and whether there are any constraints that could impact on the options being considered. Participation in this consultation is important and we would value any feedback which the public and other interested parties think should be reviewed by the project team to help inform the development of the project. Submissions relating to the project should be made before the 4th October 2022



Countywide	Property Solutions: The team is progressing 13 property solution opportunities across the county. This involves working closely with local business or inward investment opportunities to provide suitable property solutions including Council owned land or property as well as opportunities for acquisition.
	Donegal – Irelands DNA – Clothing Range: To drive further visibility of the Donegal Place Brand, a partnership has been agreed with O'Neills Sportwear to develop a range of Donegal branded clothing.
	The range launched in early August and includes t-shirts, polo-shirts, jackets and hoodies with a total range of 13 items across a range of sizes. Initially these are for sale through three sports retail outlets in Donegal; McElhinneys of Ballybofey, All Sports Donegal Town, and Michael Murphy Sports, Letterkenny. It is envisaged that more stockists will come on board following the initial launch and a request has been made to explore options for Irish language versions following an initial positive response to the range.
	Remote Working: The Remote Working Holiday campaign has received a fantastic response since launching on May 18 th with over 300 sign-ups to date. Each of the 13 digital hubs across Donegal has received a number of requests from which to remote work and feedback from participants has been very positive. Cut off for new vouchers is 31 st August with remote workers requested to use vouchers by end September. Sign-ups have included remote workers based across Ireland, the UK, US and even Australia.
	Killybegs Marine Cluster: The Economic Development Unit are working with key stakeholders to support the development of the Blue Economy, and to drive awareness about the opportunities presenting in new and emerging growth sectors. This involves working collaboratively with key

stakeholders on the Killybegs Marine Cluster Enterprise Ireland, the Atlantic Technological University and the Local Enterprise Office.

Caravan, Camping and Campervan Study: Work is progressing on the implementation of recommendations as set out in above study for the future sustainable development of the Caravan, Camping and Campervan sector in the county in co-operation with the external and internal stakeholder groups. These include:



Creative Coast Donegal

Creative Coast Donegal aim is to support the building of a strong creative and digital economy in Donegal with businesses that are robust, confident, financially viable, and collaboration-friendly, all impacting positively the local economy in terms of job creation, as well as being pro-active and competitive on an international stage.

In November, Creative Coast Donegal will host a conference that will celebrate the strength and heritage of the Fashion & Textile industry of the northwest region.
