MINUTES/RECORD OF THE INISHOWEN MUNICIPAL DISTRICT 'GOTOMEETING' HELD ON TUESDAY 8th December 2020 at 1.00pm

20.55 Deferral of Commencement of Inishowen Municipal District Meeting

The meeting was opened by the Cathaoirleach, Cllr Albert Doherty. It was proposed by Cllr Rena Donaghey and seconded by Cllr Nicholas Crossan that the meeting be deferred until 1.20pm in order to continue the North West Greenway's workshop.

The meeting reconvened at 1.20pm

20.56 Consideration of the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District Budget 2021 Meeting held on 27th October 2020

On the proposal of Cllr Terry Crossan and seconded by Cllr Jack Murray, the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District Budget 2021 Meeting held on 27th October 2020 were agreed.

20.57 Consideration of the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District "GoToMeeting" held on 27th October 2020

On the proposal of Cllr Martin McDermott and seconded by Cllr Martin Farren, the minutes of the Inishowen Municipal District Annual General Meeting held on 27th October 2020 were agreed.

20.57.01 Minutes Correction

It was noted that in minute 20.52.07 that repairs to the ZIP line in Moville have in fact not been carried out to date.

20.58 ENVIRONMENT

Brian McBrearty, Mathew Byrne, Waste Enforcement Officer presented the Environment report to the members.

20.58.01 Paint Collection

Cllr Bernard McGuinness reiterated his request that there be another paint collection organised as it was very successful in the past. Brian McBrearty advised that he would refer the matter to Suzanne Brogan, Waste Awareness Officer for consideration.

20.58.02 Bottle Banks

Cllr Paul Canning said that the bottle banks in Newtowncunningham were full and asked that this be looked at and he also asked about the level of maintenance at the bottle banks. Cllr Martin McDermott referred to his previous request to seek an alternative location for the bottle bank in Carndonagh to make them more accessible to the public. Cllr Martin Farren suggested that extra bottle banks were required due to the pandemic and emptying the banks more regularly was necessary particularly during holiday periods like Christmas.

Brian McBrearty said he was aware of the increased demand for the banks and that they would be emptied on a regular basis over the holiday period

Cllr Terry Crossan took over the chair in Cllr Albert Doherty's absence.

20.58.03 Lisfannon Beach

Cllr Rena Donaghey stated that it was now four years since Lisfannon lost its Blue Flag status and that every effort should be made to have the Blue Flag status restored. She referred to erosion that concerned her at the beach and the condition of the car park that may require attention.

20.58.04 Culdaff Beach

Cllr Bernard McGuinness expressed his gratitude for the landscaping works completed at Culdaff beach which has enhanced the area.

20.58.05 Pathway to Father Hegarty's Rock

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that the pathway between Conyburrow to Father Hegarty's rock in Buncrana be looked at as it can be slippy due to water running onto it in parts from adjoining lands. He added that the path is becoming increasingly popular with walkers and requires immediate attention.

20.58.06 Wheelchair Access to Beaches

Cllr Bernard McGuinness proposed and Cllr Martin McDermott seconded that wheelchair access be provided at all beaches and that more wheelchair access friendly accommodation like the Hoist Away facility in Culdaff be encouraged.

20.58.07 Kinnego Bay

Cllr Bernard McGuinness proposed and Cllr McDermott seconded that Kinnego beach should be categorised as a Blue Flag beach and that toilets and life guards should be provided there.

20.58.08 Litter

Cllr Terry Crossan praised the work of the litter team in a very difficult year for all. He added that the litter team always acted in a positive and prompt manner in dealing with litter issues.

Cllr Terry Crossan handed back the chair to Cllr Albert Doherty

20.58.09 Westbrook Pumping Station

Cllr Rena Donaghey referred to the overflow at Westbrook Pumping Station and the importance of keeping the proposed upgrade on the Agenda.

20.58.10 Pollinator Plan

Cllr Albert Doherty sought clarification on who will be responsible for the provision of €20,000 funds for the Pollinator Plan which is being assigned to each Municpal District.

20.59 PLANNING

The Planning Report was taken as read by Killian Smith, Executive Planner.

20.59.01 Inishowen Municpal District Planning Applications

Killian Smith advised that the Inishowen Municipal District have the highest number of planning applications in the county.

20.59.02 Taking in Charge of Private Residential Estate- Strand Court, Lower Ballymacarry, Buncrana Approval was sought from the members for the Taking in Charge of Strand Court, Lower Ballymacarry, Buncrana in the Inishowen Municipal District Area in order to complete the Taking in Charge process.

On the proposal of Councillor Rena Donaghey, seconded by Councillor Nicholas Crossan, it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act 2000(as amended) for the creation of a public right of way over the estate roads within the housing estate Strand Court, Lower Ballymacarry, Buncrana as set out in the attached maps in the Planning Report presented to the members, to enable it to proceed with the taking in charge of the estates.

On the proposal of Councillor Rena Donaghey seconded by Councillor Terry Crossan, it was resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 11 (1) of the Roads Act, 1993 to declare the estate roads within the Strand Court, Lower Ballymacarry, Buncrana to be a public road and note the consequential provisions contained in Section 180(4) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) whereby this Council will also take in charge the water services infrastructure and the public open spaces or car park within the attendant grounds of the development and will subsequently transfer the water services within the estate to Irish Water.

20.59.03 Greenways and Regional Roads

Cllr Paul Canning suggested that there may be issues regarding proposed Greenways that may be close to regional roads in terms of upgrading the roads in the future and speed limits. He asked if these potential issues are being considered in a planning context. Killian advised that he would discuss these issues with the Northwest Greenway team as a priority.

20.60 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The report was taken as read by Brenda Hegarty, Assistant Head of Enterprise, Local Enterprise Office

20.60.01 Water Tender

Cllr Martin McDermott said he was disappointed with the response he received from the Fire Service regarding the new fire tender which is situated in West Donegal. He said he was advised that the tender was available to respond to any incident anywhere in the county. He added that the distance between west Donegal and Inishowen, particularly North Inishowen was too far for a satisfactory fast response to a fire.

The members supported a motion proposed by Cllr Bernard McGuinness and seconded by Cllr Martin McDermott that a second tanker is purchased for the county; Cllr Rena Donaghey suggested that this additional fire tender be located in Inishowen as Inishowen as Inishowen is the size of a county. Brenda Hegarty said that she would take the comments back to the fire service.

20.60.02 Brexit Stimulus Package

Cllr Martin Farren referred to the 8-10 Million Brexit Package. He said it was important that the Inishowen Municpal District gets a fair share of the funds and that members should be involved in how the funds are distributed as he believed the impact of Brexit would be catastrophic for the border areas.

20.61 COMMUNITY AND ENTERPRISE

The report was taken as read by Fiona Doherty, Development Officer

20.61.01Pride of Place Awards 2020

Fiona Doherty advised that the 18th Annual IPB Pride of Place Awards took place virtually on Saturday 21st November with Spraoi agus Sport in Carndonagh winning the Pride of Place Award in category 7 entitled 'Community Wellbeing Initiative'. She indicated that she was liaising with the Cathaoirleach, Cllr Albert Doherty in relation to the presentation of the trophy to the group in compliance with the Health Pandemic guidelines. She acknowledged the Contribution by the Members to the Pride of Place Awards Initiative in Donegal.

20.61.02Buncrana School Campus

Fiona Doherty advised that Donegal County Council are working on behalf of the Department of Education and Skills in progressing a Compulsory Purchase Order for securing the identified site for the Buncrana School Campus. She advised that a Compulsory Purchase Order Notice was in this week's local newspapers. She stated that copies of the Public Notice and maps relating to the CPO were available for inspection at the Public Services Centre in Carndonagh, the Council office in Buncrana and Donegal County Council headquarters in Lifford. The Members welcomed this development.

20.61.03Malin Head Visitor Management Plan

Following the workshop meeting that took place on Monday 19th October regarding the Malin Head Visitor Management Plan. Fiona Doherty sought agreement to hold a follow up online workshop meeting on Monday 14th December at 12 noon. This was agreed by the members.

20.61.04 Town and Village Renewal 2020

Cllr Martin Farren sought a date for an announcement by the Department regarding funding under the 2020 Town and Village Renewal Scheme. Fiona Doherty indicated that it was anticipated that the Minister within the Department of Rural and Community Development would make an announcement in January 2021.

20.61.05An Grianan of Aileach Fort

Fiona Doherty advised the Members that the Conservation and Management Plan by the Office of Public Works would be ready for circulation to the Members soon. She also advised that the plan will provide a framework for identifying and prioritising work at the site.

20.61.06 Rural Development Investment Programme - 2020 Clár Funding

The announcement of Clár funding at Portaleen, Glengad was welcomed. A discussion took place regarding other rural areas in Inishowen such as Gaddyduff, Rasheny and Glentogher that are ineligible because they are located outside of the scope of the scheme. Cllr Albert Doherty proposed and Cllr Bernard McGuinness seconded that the Council write to the Minister in the Department of Rural and Community Development seeking a review and extension of the targeted rural District Electoral Divisions under the Clár Rural Development Investment programme.

20.61.07 Playground Maintenance 2020/2021

Moville Play Park

Cllr Martin Farren requested that the broken Zip line equipment at Moville playground removed for safety reasons should be replaced.

Culdaff Play Park

Cllr Bernard McGuinness acknowledged the meeting on site with the Engineer responsible for playgrounds and requested that the replenishment of the sand at the Culdaff playground is expedited.

20.61.08 Donegal Walks and Trails

Cllr Albert Doherty welcomed the report from Darryl O' Connor, Outdoor Recreation Development Officer and his plans to carry out an assessment and report regarding the Riverside walk damaged in the flooding that took place in August 2017.

20.61.09 Dunree Fort and Military Museum Co. Ltd

Cllr Rena Donaghey sought an update regarding the outcome of the funding application for development at Dunree submitted to Fáilte Ireland under the Platform for Growth - Platform 1: Immersive Heritage and Cultural Attractions. Fiona Doherty stated that following the submission of the third stage of the five stage process relating to the Business Case and the visit by some members of the

assessment team to the site and online assessment meetings that an announcement was expected from Fáilte Ireland in the first quarter of 2021 regarding progression to the next stage.

20.61.10 Cycle Lanes in Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to a request by a local group to develop cycle lanes linking key strategic places in Carndonagh. He asked that the Community Development section liaise with the Roads directorate to pursue options.

20.61.11 Campervan Facility in Buncrana

Following on from the previous meeting, Cllr Nicholas Crossan reiterated his request to consider the issue of providing an alternative solution to the disposal of grey waste at the facility

20.62 HOUSING &CORPORATE SERVICES

Aideen Doherty, Area Manager, Housing and Corporate Services presented the Housing report to the members and updated them on matters.

20.62.01 Donegal Brand Workshop

Aideen Doherty, Area Manager for Housing and Corporate Services reminded the members that a Donegal Brand Online Workshop was taking place on 10th December at 3.30pm.

20.62.02 Allocations

It was noted that all the nineteen new houses at Newtowncunningham have now been allocated. Cllr Paul Canning expressed his gratitude to Aideen Doherty, Una Cresswell and the housing team for their work in allocating these properties. Similarly Cllrs Martin Farren and Cllr Terry Crossan expressed their thanks for progressing allocations in Inishowen throughout the year.

20.62.03 Litter at Ard Na Guala Duibhe, Moville

Cllr Martin Farren requested that rubbish left in Ard Na Guala Duibhe, Moville be removed before Christmas.

20.62.04 New Housing Development at Crana View, Buncrana

A discussion took place regarding the planned new housing development at Crana View, Buncrana. It was suggested that there had not been enough discussion and little consultation with local residents. It was pointed out that there is a planning process whereby any member of the public can raise objections to housing developments and there were also opportunities at Municipal District meeting level to raise concerns regarding the proposed development.

20.62.05 Housing Need

Cllr Albert Doherty referred to current housing needs and sought clarification on whether all housing needs are taken into account when planning additional social housing. He also referred to demand for sheltered housing and assisted accommodation. He also added that additional respite care facilities were urgently required as discussed at previous meetings.

20.62.06 Rural Housing

Cllr Bernard McGuinness reiterated the need for rural housing rather than concentrating on housing for the three main towns in Inishowen. He said he felt strongly about the continued lack of rural housing and was going to keep this item firmly on the Agenda. He said that the debate over the new housing development in Buncrana was unnecessary as we should welcome new social housing in all areas of Inishowen where there is clearly a demand.

Cllr Martin McDermott said that the reduction in numbers in rural schools was very worrying and that the projected figures for school numbers in some in rural areas over the next five years were worrying. He added that if housing applicants wished to stay in rural areas that the council should facilitate this by providing adequate housing.

Aideen Doherty advised that a lot of work was put into analysing the demand for social housing between the Local Authority and the Department in all areas. She added that for some time acquisitions were the only option in rural areas but possibly we should be considering a cluster of rural houses to meet demand in rural areas as SI houses may not always be the best solution. She added that thirty eight expressions of interests had been received for possible development throughout Inishowen and these were currently being assessed.

20.62.07 Date of Next Meeting

It was agreed that the next Inishowen Municipal District Meeting would take place on 12th January 2021 at 1.00pm

20.63 ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

The Roads and Transportation report circulated by Seamus Hopkins, Area Manager, Roads and Transportation was taken as read. Seamus Hopkins advised the members of works completed to date. He added that it was positive news that the programme had been delivered considering the lost time due to the current pandemic.

20.63.01 Back Roads of Estates

Cllr Albert Doherty sought clarification on back lanes on council estates. Seamus Hopkins advised that a draft policy on this matter was proposed but not adopted. The proposal suggested that the Housing directorate would fund the costs but the Roads service would carry out the works. Cllr Bernard McGuinness said that this matter had been discussed previously at SPC level and that the consensus was that the back lanes were Housing's responsibility but works would be completed by the roads service. Aideen Doherty advised that the issue was a funding matter as there was no line in the budget for this work. The question of whether roads within estates become public roads was also asked.

After some further discussion the general consensus of the members was that this matter needs to be addressed and clarified. Seamus Hopkins advised that he would check with the Director of roads and get back to the members on this issue.

20.63.02 Works in Muff and Quigley's Point

Cllr Terry Crossan acknowledged the works completed at Aught Road, Muff with minimum disruption. He said he had requested more signage in the area from the Road's engineer. He also said he welcomed the commencement of works at Quigley's Point and at the footpath between the Red Cross and Grove Cottages, Muff.

20.63.03 White Lining Quigley's' Point to Whitecastle

Cllr Farren he welcomed the completion of white lining between Quigley's' Point to Whitecastle which he said made a lot of difference. He asked that cat's eyes could be extended to other parts of the road.

20.63.04 Crash Barriers

Cllr Martin Farren asked that crash barriers be located at the pier in Redcastle at other locations where there have been accidents.

20.63.05 Lighting in Buncrana

Cllr Rena Donaghey asked that lights at Cockhill Road and Railway Road in Buncrana be fixed. She requested that the lights be maintained on a more regular basis. Seamus Hopkins advised that the ESB maintaining the lights and it is often a slow process to get them repaired; He added that Aidan Smith is the official on the council responsible for lighting and maybe a workshop could be arranged with to discuss lighting.

20.63.06 Works at Kinnagoe and Ludden, Buncrana

Cllr Rena Donaghey commended the works at Kinnagoe and Ludden, Buncrana

20.63.07 Inner Relief Road

Cllr Nicholas Crossan requested that the works required on the remaining two hundred meters of the relief road be prioritised. Seamus Hopkins advised that this project is on the list but there are significant works necessary to get this shovel ready.

20.63.08 Slina Sliante, Buncrana

Cllr Nicholas Crossan suggested that the walk at Sli na Sliante path should be developed and enhanced into a historical walk to attract tourist.

20.63.09 Castle Bridge, Buncrana

Cllr Crossan said that the lights at Castle Bridge Buncrana were too high and is blinding on the town side and asked if they could be adjusted. He also requested that the road from Castle Bridge to Cockhill to the General shop could be looked at with a view to removing the overgrowth.

20.63.10 Lights in Carndonagh

Cllr Albert Doherty said that the decorative lights in Carndonagh were problematic and that the Upper Diamond area in the town was very dark and also the feeder streets in the town were dark

20.63.11 Gleneely to Moville Road

It was requested that the surface on the Gleneely to Moville Road be looked at.

20.63.12 Bridge St Footpath

Cllr Doherty said that he would like to see the works at the Bridge St footpath completed.

20.63.13 Inishowen Co op Yard

Cllr Bernard McGuinness asked of there was any update on the Inishowen Co Op yard.

20.63.14 Beach Walk Culdaff

Cllr McGuinness suggested that Community Employment participants could assist in building the beach walk wall in Culdaff.

20.63.15 Works at Glentogher, Carndonagh

Cllr Bernard McGuiness reiterated his comments from previous meeting how the monies allocated to works at Glentogher Carndonagh should not be lost and that the proposed project be kept on the agenda. Seamus Hopkins advised that there was a specific funding application with a view to adding to what was initially approved for the project

Businesses apply for a Section 254 license and the Council is committed to a prompt assessment of applications within 10 working days of receipt of a complete application and temporarily waiving fees from 1 June 2020 to 31 December 2020. Concierge Service: a dedicated point of contact for existing businesses, potential business start-ups or businesses looking to relocate or wishing to expand, by offering support and advice and connecting them with key personnel for a wide range of Council services and supports.

Queries are directed to economicdevelopment@donegalcoco.ie.

The Concierge Service responds swiftly and proactively to the needs of businesses including businesses looking to re-open and adapting their operation to meet social distancing requirements in a post-Covid society. To date 57 queries have been dealt with through this service.

Property Solutions: involves identification, marketing, option appraisal of Council owned property and land for economic development opportunities including provision of soft landing and second site location opportunities for business. The Unit is dealing with several queries relating to potential property solutions across the county and is liaising with colleagues in various Council divisions.

Collaboration: Working with our colleagues in Community Development and Planning Services to progress a range of strategic projects including:

 Platforms for Growth, Stage 3 Application for large scale investment at Fort Dunree with the submission of Part B Business Case on August 31st, awaiting final decision on funding following presentation to funders. Various Regeneration and Development Proposals under the URDF and the RRDF to ensure that an economic development focus is derived for the respective locations prioritised. These projects are in locations across the county in all Municipal Districts and were recently submitted as part of the DCCs Regeneration plans.

Donegal Tourism Strategy: This new 5-year Strategy will guide the work of Donegal County Council by providing strategic direction for the recovery and development of the sector over the next 5 years.

A more detailed Terms of Reference is currently being finalised.

Caravan & Camping Study: The EDU is currently engaging a study to assess and evaluate the opportunities and challenges facing the Caravan & Camping sector in Donegal and to make recommendations on how best to support the future development of this sector with a view to ensuring a sustainable and viable sector going forward. This assignment will include extensive consultations with key stakeholders and the recommendations will inform a range of interventions that will assist in addressing the challenges currently being experienced.

A company has been appointed to complete the evaluation and will now work with the EDU to progress this study.

Global engagement: work is continuing to proactively target potential FDI opportunities in the US market in collaboration with Derry City & Strabane District Council and working to create a Donegal/North West bias for businesses interested in exploring investment opportunities in the EU and UK. This includes the provision of essential baseline data and information for location decision makers.

Remote Working: The EDU is near completion on a new Remote Working Strategy for Donegal to maximise the opportunities arising for the county as a destination of choice for remote working which will form a key part of the COVID-19 recovery plan.

The EDU is also working with various Innovation and Digital Hubs in Donegal. A Grow Remote Donegal Chapter has been initiated to promote remote working opportunities to the unemployed and underemployed across the county and to market Donegal as a great place to live and work.

Atlantic Economic Corridor: working with Local Authority partners along the western coast to progress mutually beneficial projects and initiatives. The EDU are currently managing €34,549.99 of funding support (Hub Opening Scheme) from the Department of Rural and Community Development/Western Development Commission to digital hubs in the county to enable them to open safely over the coming months.

Divisional Funding Needs Analysis

The Funding Needs Analysis process is well underway. The Strategic Funding Unit has circulated the Funding Needs Analysis survey to all Directorates. A number of Funding Needs Analysis meetings have taken place with Divisional Teams. Further meetings are scheduled for January 2021. Reports are being produced based on the outcomes of these meetings with a view to informing future plans in relation to funding applications.

Strategic Funding Unit Newsletters

Donegal County Council Strategic Funding Unit continues its targeted e-mail campaign. E-mail newsletters are being sent weekly to the team members in the various Divisions regarding funding opportunities, project development and events that are relevant to the work they are doing in line with the strategic objectives set out in the corporate plan. To date 10 targeted e-mail newsletters have been sent since the campaign commenced mid-September.

CPMR (Conference of Peripheral Maritime Regions)

Donegal County Council has been confirmed as pillar co-ordinator for the Atlantic Strategy and Atlantic Action Plan pillar 1: ports as gateways and hubs for the Blue Economy and this will allow the Council to have a much greater influence on policy and funding related to this sector. The SFU has also provided input on the Brexit Adjustment Reserve Fund Declaration that was submitted to the EU Commission in relation to the future distribution of the BAR fund to ensure that the interests of County Donegal are put forward at EU level.

Funding Call Alerts & Reviews

In addition to the e-mail newsletters, direct e-mails are sent to staff when a relevant funding opportunity arises that suits their work plan. Also, the Strategic Funding Unit prepares funding call reviews for circulation to the SMT e.g. the EU Innovation Fund review.

Networking & Partnerships

The Strategic Funding Unit are working with a variety of networks such as CPMR and AER to explore project development and funding opportunities.

Public Service Innovation Fund 2021

The Strategic Funding Unit is working with IS and Finance teams to explore project ideas with a view to develop a project related to digital technology and apply for funding under the Public Service Innovation Fund 2021.

EURural Project

The Strategic Funding Unit is working with the Municipality of Aras de los Olmos (Spain) on the development of a project under the EU funding call Europe for Citizens. If successful, the project aims to foster democratic engagement and civic participation in rural areas and encouraging democratic participation of citizens at EU level and participation in the EU policy-making process. A decision is expected in January 2021 by the EU Commission in relation to this project.

AER Summer Academy Event 2022

The SFU is in talks with AER (Assembly of European Regions) in regard to hosting their Summer Academy here in Donegal in 2022 depending on the pandemic situation. This would provide a positive economic boost to the county and international exposure. Fáilte Ireland are also working with the SFU to support this initiative.

Other Funding Investigations

The Strategic Funding Unit is investigating a number of funding opportunities in relation to themes around digital transformation including digital hubs, IoT, infrastructure, tourism innovation, sustainability, climate change and specific funding calls such as the Innovation Fund, NPA, Peace Plus, Atlantic Area Programme and Horizon 2020.

Up to 12 hours of free online/telephone mentoring is available to any business seeking assistance in addressing COVID -19 issues including developing their cash flow projections, managing cashflow, drafting loan applications, HR advice, Risk Assessment, etc and developing short action plans to address the identified actions. Mentoring application forms are available to download here.

Progress: To date, 136 COVID -19 Mentoring applications have been received.



Trading Online Voucher Scheme

The Trading Online Voucher (TOV) Scheme which has been updated from 8th April to offer more assistance for businesses looking to build an online presence has recorded significant demand. 90% Financial assistance up to €2500 is available to small businesses that have been trading for more than 6 months with less than 10 employees. Participation in the Trading Online Workshop is compulsory for approval for this scheme. The scheme will continue in 2021 but with a reduced financial assistance rate of 50%. Completed applications submitted in advance of 31 December 2020 deadline will be considered for the 90% support rate.

Progress: 517 TOV applications have been received by the Local Enterprise Office in 2020 with 459 applications awarded €1,109,292 funding in line with the approved budget.

Micro-Enterprise Assistance Scheme

This is a NEW Scheme launched in September 2020. The objective COVID-19 Micro-Enterprise Assistance Scheme is to provide a grant of a minimum of €500 to a maximum €1,000 in respect of vouched expenditure contribution towards the cost of reopening or keeping a business operational and re-connecting with employees and customers. The scheme closed on November 13th . 12 applications

have been received of which 7 were approved for funding.



Microfinance Ireland Supports for COVID-19

The COVID 19 Business Loan from Microfinance Ireland (MFI) in association with the Local Enterprise Office is a government funded initiative to support small businesses through the current period of uncertainty and protect job creation/sustainment in Ireland. If any micro-enterprise is impacted or may be impacted negatively by COVID-19 resulting in a reduction of 15% or more in turnover or profit, AND they are having difficulty in accessing Bank finance, the MFI COVID-19 Business Loan may be an alternative funding solution for them. Loans up to €25,000 are available with a reduced interest fee of 4.5% as opposed to 5.5% available, if the application is submitted via the Local Enterprise Office. Interest Free and Repayment Fee for 6 months is available. For more information, click here.

Progress: 23 applications have been received by the Local Enterprise Office of which 16 have been approved to date. The scheme has reopened for applications.

In addition, there is a COVID-19 Working Capital Loan available from SBCI. This is for eligible businesses impacted by COVID-19. Loans from €25,000 up to €1.5m will be available at reduced rates (max 4%), with up to the first €500,000 unsecured. Applications can be made through the SBCI website https://sbci.gov.ie/.

Other Supports

New Stimulus Package

A new stimulus package valued at €8-10m has been announced in the Border region for LEO M1 clients who are engaged in manufacturing and internationally traded services.

A suite of new programmes will be delivered notably;

- Green for Micro,
- Retail,

- Financial Management,
- Innovation,
- Exporting.

Measure 1: Financial Supports

Start Up/Business Expansion

For existing companies and potential start-ups that meet eligibility criteria (such as manufacturing/added value/ internationally traded services, employing 10 or fewer people with the potential for growth and job creation), the Local Enterprise Office offer three types of financial supports:

• Feasibility/Innovation Funding

Up to 60% of the cost of undertaking a feasibility study on an innovative new product or service may be considered subject to a maximum of €20,000.

• Priming (Start Up) Grant Aid

Our Priming Funding is designed to assist a micro-enterprise within the first 18 months of start-up. It covers 50% of eligible costs, subject to a maximum contribution of €80,000.

• Business Expansion Grant

Our Business Expansion Funding is designed to assist a microenterprise that has been trading for over 18 months. It covers 50% of eligible costs, subject to a maximum contribution of €80,000.

Progress: In 2020, 32 Feasibility, Business Start Up and Expansion grants have been approved €769,630 funding creating a projected 81 jobs over the 3-year period.

BREXIT

The Brexit Readiness Checker develops a personalised report to help businesses prepare for Brexit.

Customs Training

Customs change is coming, and the workshops help businesses prepare for this change. Hundreds of local businesses have participated in the workshops in 2020 with further monthly

Workshops commencing on January 13th.

Brexit Stimulus Package

Department of Business, Enterprise and Innovation has announced an additional budget allocation of €8 -10m to the border LEOs in 2020 as a stimulus measure to mitigate any Brexit related slowdown. Six programmes supporting local businesses are at advanced planning with tendering completed or underway. The programmes of support will include a Scaling Programme, a Green Energy Programme, a Retail Programme, an Export Programme, an Innovation Programme and a Scaling Programme.

Measure 2: Capability Development

The Local Enterprise Office provides a broad suite of training,

management development, mentoring and peer-learning programmes all aimed at increasing the capability of owner managers and their key internal staff. During COVID 19 many of these Programmes have moved online and are in huge demand.

These include:

Profitnet

Profitnet is a highly successful business development and support programme which has benefited 180 Donegal businesses to date. The programme runs for a period of up to 18 months and involves monthly group meetings with peer business owners, which are facilitated to ensure there is an exchange of innovative and creative business solutions. The Engineering Profitnet meeting has hosted 8 online meetings since the COVID -19 restrictions have been put in place.

Training

Over 2800 people have attended a range of tailored training programmes in 2020 to date including online courses on Preparing for the Return to Work Post COVID 19-Key Considerations for Business, Start your Own Business, Preparing for Brexit, Getting your Business Online.

<u>Gateway to Growth International Export Programme</u> – Led by Derry City and Strabane District Council and Donegal County Council, the programme comprises of export workshops, one to one reviews and a North West Trade Mission financed by The Executive Office and the Irish Government. Two programmes were delivered in 2020.

Technical Study for Marine Development Works at Killybegs Harbour-The Study commenced in July with the contract awarded to ByrneLooby Ltd. The draft report was received in December 2020.

AMBITION - Pre-Accelerator for Women

An exciting new programme to develop female entrepreneurship in Donegal –has commenced. AMBITION is a pre-accelerator programme run by Local Enterprise Office Donegal, in partnership with NDRC, which sources and builds digital startups to invest in and work with. The AMBITION programme was open to female founders, entrepreneurs, or those with a strong start-up idea, who have links to

Donegal. The business idea with the most potential will be awarded €10,000. 41 applications were received by the closing date and 11 Female led teams, 3 of which are Donegal Diaspora participated on the 6 week pilot programme. The Final Showcase and announcement of the €10,000 award winner was held online on 10 December 2020. Rachel Craig, EU Remote Jobs, a member of the Donegal Diaspora living in Barcelona was announced as the overall winner.

Under the Service Level Agreement between Enterprise Ireland on behalf of the Department of Business, Enterprise and Innovation, a key area of activity of the local Authority/Local Enterprise Office is the promotion of an enterprise culture and entrepreneurship within the county. Since the creation of the Regional Plan, we have had thousands of jobs created in the region, significant enterprise highlights (page 2) and have benefited greatly from Regional and Border funding (page 7). For the next iteration of the plan, COVID-19 has brought an equal challenge of capitalising on a unique opportunity to promote the Northwest in a post COVID world whilst also supporting our businesses through this unprecedented environment.

NORTHWEST 2019/2020 Enterprise Highlights

REMOTE WORKING TREND

2020 has focused workers on quality of life, affordability and the potential of remote working. As a region we are well positioned to capitalize on these trends post COVID through the support of our regional agencies.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The region is becoming better connected with the forecast completion date of the N4 road upgrade Q4 2021. The National Broadband Rollout Plan is underway with Sligo being surveyed first in the region. The process of applying for a technological university for the Connacht Ulster Alliance (CUA) of GMIT, LYIT and IT Sligo is underway.

ECONOMIC CLUSTERS

The regions clusters are developing — Killibegs Marine cluster and Border Regions Manufacturing Cluster initiative has been funded through the Regional Clustering Fund; the Cyber Ireland NW Chapter was launched Nov 2020. Tech Northwest, ICT/Fintech Group and the Atlantic MedTech Cluster are gaining momentum.

JOBS CREATION

In 2019/2020 IDA, Enterprise Ireland and LEO clients announced 1000+ new jobs in the region, Over the life of the plan, the regions employment is up ~5%

FUNDING AWARDED

The NW has been successfully awarded €14,3million in funding through the REDF and BEDF funds (Refer to page 7 for funding award). In recent weeks, jobs resulting from these funding rounds have been announced,











The Regional Skills Forum has established itself as a single point of contact in the region to help employers connect with a range of training or education supports. In the absence of face-to-face contact due to COVID-19, the RSF has facilitated online engagement including an innovative employment engagement form available on the Regional Skills Forum website. EXPLORE (a program to address basic digital skills gaps) will be delivered in 2021 and will continue to address the need for enhanced digital skills amongst at risk sectors. Subject to a successful pilot, it is hoped that DigiECO will be rolled out in the North West region in 2021. IT Sligo offered 20 courses in the areas of STEM funded by HEA under the Springboard+ 2020 programme. They experienced a 40% increase in the number of Springboard places, LYIT were initially allocated 308 free places on Springboard+ courses. They also received additional funding for 10 postgraduate programmes and 13 modular upskilling programmes as part of the Government July Stimulus Provision,

in early 2021. — an online employer/employee jobs portal. Additionally, there will be a facility for partners e.g. IDA, EI, local authorities to access high level data. This data will be useful for attracting new investment into the region.

If relevant they may form part of the next Enterprise Plan.



The Rosses Men's Shed Winners in the National Upcycling Competition



County Donegal Men's Shed wins at this year's National Upcycle Challenge with "Thomas the Tank Engine"

- The Upcycle Challenge was set by <u>mywaste.ie</u> and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
- There were Nine Winners in total across nine different categories.

Rosses Men's Shed from Donegal, who bought the railway back to Donegal in the form of "Thomas the Tank Engine" and an old oil tank were among the nine worthy winners of this year's national *Upcycle Challenge 2020*.

The Upcycle Challenge was set by mywaste.ie and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

It invited participants to use their imagination to create something new and useful out of old unwanted and discarded items or material.

As many as 259 entries were received from individuals, community organisations, Men's Sheds and schools across the country. A total of eight category winners were decided by a judging panel, who also chose three finalists for a People's Choice Award.

During November, the public voted for the three finalists on mywaste.ie social media platforms. The Irish public decided the winner to be Ann McKenna from County Monaghan who upcycles the clothes of people who died to make memorial bears for their loved ones.

Men's Shed Category

Rosses Men's Shed, Co. Donegal - Brought the railway back to Donegal in the form of "Thomas the Tank Engine" made from an old oil tank and some pallets. The result is the ideal playhouse/train for children and the young at heart.

Pat Bonner, Rosses Men's Shed, Co. Donegal: "Railways unfortunately disappeared from Donegal in the 1960's, so we decided to try and recreate and build our own 'Thomas The Tank Engine' as a reminder of those days. It may sound like a childish proposition but as they say, 'Adults are just children at heart.....but with a few more wrinkles'. "The inspiration for the project came from a Shed members better half. She decided to brighten up their back garden by painting a Thomas the Tank Engine face on their oil tank."

Congratulating the winners **Sinead Ni Mhainnin Waste Prevention Officer with the Connacht Ulster Waste Management Planning Office** said this year's applications were of a very high standard making the judging process very difficult.

"The *Upcycle Challenge* is a collaboration between the EPA and the regional waste management offices under the umbrella of mywaste.ie. This year, as in other years, we challenged ourselves to get the nation thinking about reuse. The challenge helped create awareness of how we can reuse everyday objects by upcycling and repurposing them, as well as allowing people and groups to share their creativity with a wider audience. This year we also became acutely aware how important these projects were to a lot of people during the weeks and months of the pandemic.

"Many entrants shared with us how working on these projects helped to sustain them during the lockdown and proved to be a useful exercise in managing mental health. We are therefore delighted with the positive impact these projects have on our environment and the well-being of the community at large."

Due to public health restrictions, this year's Upcycle Challenge Award ceremony will take the form of a video shared on <u>mywaste.ie</u> social media channels showing the skills, creativity and ingenuity of all nine winners and their projects. Each winner will also receive an equal share of the €6,750 prize fund.

| Activity / Project Title | Open Water Swimming |

| Project Description/ Activity | Open water swimming has become increasingly popular in Donegal since the Covid-19 pandemic closed swimming pools/gyms and travel restrictions for normal recreation was restricted. Many discovered the physical and mental health benefits from open water swimming, on their doorsteps. |
| | Many people describe the feeling of intense satisfaction after plunging into cold water. It leaves the body tingling all over and helps clear the mind of worries and anxieties. Year-round swimmers are adamant that the sea has the potential to alleviate the effects of a number of physical ailments including arthritis, chronic pain and lots more. |
| | When to Swim in Open Water It is important to start in the summer when the water temperature in Ireland is somewhere between 14° and 18° degrees Celsius. The sensible way to acclimatise to cold water is to swim in it regularly. You can gradually extend the time of your stay in the water with practice. Get out if you are not feeling comfortable, and never set time goals for staying in the water. When entering the water, throw some water down the back of your neck to help prepare your body for the cold water immersion; this helps reduce the risk of cold shock or in extreme cases heart attacks. |
| | Water Temperatures Sea water Temperatures can vary from approximately 5° in the Winter to 25° Celsius in a heat wave. Freshwater temperatures can vary approximately 1° in the Winter to 27° Celsius in a heat wave. |
| | Check the weather forecast and tides You should always look at the wind and weather forecasts, then check the time and type of tides. Spring tides are more hazardous as they cause stronger rip currents on beaches and increase the risk of stranding. Use local knowledge to identify the location of the rip currents on your beach, or bathing area. It is much safer to swim on a rising tide than on a falling tide. Use an App on your phone, websites online or newspapers for further real time information about tides, e.g. tides near me. |
| | At low water you are more likely to slip or fall on surfaces with algae on them both in fresh and salt water. |
| | At High Water you may not be aware of hidden rocks or obstacles underwater. Seek local knowledge before entering the water. |
| | |

Never swim alone

Due to the unpredictable nature of our temperate climate, the sea can change very quickly, so never swim alone. If you swim alone and you get into difficulties, you are more than likely going to drown. Heed the advice given by regular swimmers. If they are not getting into the water as they feel conditions are too dangerous, then you should not enter the water. If you do get in to difficulty then remain calm, try and float or tread water, until you can either continue swimming or you are rescued by a passer-by.

Make sure you can be seen

It is essential that you wear bright yellow/pink swimming caps which are conspicuous to other water users in your vicinity. It is recommended you also use a bright tow float for visibility so that other Aquatic users can see them. Some swimmers can be naïve when it comes to their vulnerability in the water — be aware of other water users in the area nearby, particularly boats and jet skis. Depending on their speed, they can pose a real threat to you in the same way any vehicle would on the open road.

Alcohol and water never mix

Do not consume alcohol before you enter open water, 3 in 10 people who drown have consumed it. Alcohol severely reduces your ability to swim and respond to risks as it impairs your judgement. Similarly, while it might be appealing, do not attempt to swim in open water the day after drinking alcohol.

Warm up fast

Listen to your body and do not let yourself get too cold in the water. It is also important to understand that your body will react differently to the cold on different days. If you are tired, developing a cold or flu or have had a few drinks the night before you might start to feel colder, faster than usual when you are in the water. Tailor the length of your swim to how you are feeling on a given day.

Post-swim it is important to warm up as quickly as possible. Once you get out of the water you can continue to cool for approximately 20-30 minutes. This means that your deep body or core temperature will be cooler 20-30 minutes after your swim than when you got out of the water. Get dry and dressed in warm layers of clothing as quickly as possible. Warm drinks are also a great way to bring your body temperature back to normal. Bring a flask of your favourite hot drink with you.

In tandem with the above construction programme, the Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available.

2. House Acquisition Programme

Donegal County Council has acquired, or is in the process of acquiring, properties under the House Acquisition Programme. In the Inishowen Municipal District during 2018-2020 a total of 31 properties have been purchased under this programme. There are an additional 6 property acquisitions currently progressing through conveyance.

In advance of letting acquired properties, the Council carries out improvement works in order to ensure that high quality, sustainable homes are provided to individuals and families throughout the county.

3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council's turnkey acquisition process is continuing throughout the county. This competitive dialogue procurement process will result in a major capital investment in social housing, with the initial projects in the county now complete. This is a very effective mechanism enabling the Council to feed into the design of the proposal so as to ensure that the end product is suitable for the needs of social housing tenants.

In order to safeguard the nature of the process and bearing in mind the commercial sensitivities of the process as well as the extent of the approvals required, the Council will continue to provide Elected Members with detailed information of the proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval (i.e. stage 4). Notwithstanding this approval, proposals are subject to contract.

In this regard, PJ McDermott has recently completed a turnkey development at Heathhill, Newtowncunningham. This development has delivered a total of 19 no. social housing units comprising 6 no. 4 bedroom units and 13 no. 3 bedroom units. Phase I of the development (containing 10 units) completed Q2 2020 and Phase II (containing 9 units) has recently completed in Q4 2020. The development was officially opened by Minister Darragh O'Brien, TD on the 6th of August 2020. The Area Housing Office has completed the letting process and the new tenants enjoy high quality sustainable homes in a convenient location.

Departmental approval has also been obtained to proceed with a turnkey acquisition at Convent Road, Carndonagh. The development will be delivered by GDC (Irl) Ltd. and will comprise of 58 houses/apartments. The Developer has commenced works on site and Council officials are working with VP McMullin Solicitors to progress the conveyance process.

Council officials are continuing to dialogue with Developers with regard to additional valid proposals for Inishowen Municipal District in Carndonagh, Buncrana and Moville. Members will be fully informed of these proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval.

4. Single Rural Dwellings (SRD)

Progress is continuing in respect of a proposed SI cottage at Malin following Part 8 approval at the July 2020 Plenary Council Meeting. The project was tendered on the 11th of October 2020 and the transfer of land to the local authority, as required under this process, will take place in parallel.

5. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively seeking lands in towns where there is a social housing need where there are currently no viable housing delivery options. Offers to acquire land have been made in a number of towns and Members will be kept informed on the outcome of same.

An advertisement has recently been placed on the Council's website and encompasses all towns and villages in the county. Interested parties are invited to submit an expression of interest for parcels of land, derelict sites and existing buildings in line with guidance outlined in the advertisement. The Area Housing teams are now in the process of reviewing the submissions received to assess viable options for social housing purposes.

DONEGAL COUNTY COUNCIL PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO STANDING ORDERS REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL IN HOLDING REMOTE MEETINGS

Insert new Standing Order No. 90 as follows -

"90. Remote meetings

(1) This Standing Order applies to remote meetings of the Council which consist of a conference between some or all of the Council members who are not all in one place but each of them is able (directly or by means of electronic communications technology) to speak to each of the others and to be heard by each of the others as provided for by Section 29 of the Civil Law and Criminal Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2020 and the designation of the Council for the purposes of that Section by the Civil Law and Criminal Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2020 (Section 29) (Local Authorities) (Designation) Order 2020 – SI No. 445 of 2020.

(2) In this Standing Order –

- (a) "Remote meeting(s)" shall be construed in accordance with paragraph (1) above and cognate words and phrases such as "remotely", "remotely attending", "remote access", "remote participant" etc. shall be construed as referring to access to a meeting by means of electronic communications technology.
- (b) References to members attending physically at a meeting means attendance in the same room as the Meetings Administrator.
- (c) References to a meeting shall be to a remote meeting unless otherwise qualified.

(3) Meetings may be held at -

- the Council Chamber, or other Council buildings
- an external venue used to accommodate meetings of the Council
- one or more Council buildings or rooms, linked remotely
- an electronic, digital or virtual location, web address or a conference call telephone number
- a combination of the above to provide for physical and/or remote attendance by elected members

Management of Remote Meetings

- (4) Members should notify the Meetings Administrator in advance if they intend to attend the meeting remotely.
- (5) Any member participating in a meeting remotely must, when they are speaking, be able to be heard and seen by all other members in attendance, and the remote participant must, in turn, be able to hear and see those other members participating.
- (6) The Cathaoirleach will at the outset, and on any reconvening of a meeting, call a roll call of remotely attending members and ensure that they can hear and see those in attendance. Any member participating remotely should also confirm at the outset and at any reconvening of the meeting that they can hear and see the proceedings. Members should inform the Meetings Administrator or other person designated by him if they lose connection.
- (7) The attendance of all members at the meeting whether physically or remotely will be recorded by the Meetings Administrator.
- (8) The normal quorum requirements for meetings generally as set out in Standing Orders 12-15 will also apply to a remote meeting. Members attending physically and remotely will together constitute a quorum.
- (9) Each member participating remotely has personal responsibility to ensure and confirm to the Meetings Administrator, that there are no other persons present with him/her who are not entitled to be either hearing or seeing consideration of such items, and/or recording the proceedings contrary to Standing Order No. 62.

Meeting Procedures

- (10) The Meetings Administrator will coordinate the facilitation of the meeting. An appropriate official designated by him will assume responsibility for controlling the conferencing technology employed for remote access and attendance, and to administer the member interaction, engagement and connections on the instruction of the Cathaoirleach.
- (11) Members should allow sufficient time to establish a connection prior to the commencement of the meeting to allow themselves and the Meetings Administrator the opportunity to test the connection.
- (12) The Cathaoirleach, at the beginning of the meeting will explain the protocol for remote members' participation:
 - (a) Confirm details of the Council Meeting which is being held remotely e.g.
 "This is the 202 ordinary meeting of Donegal County Council"
 - (b) Advise that the attendees' microphones should be muted unless the Cathaoirleach indicates that they may speak.

- (c) Set out that Members or Officials must notify the Cathaoirleach if they wish to contribute.
- (d) In accordance with Standing Order No. 62 that recording of the meeting is prohibited.
- (13) In accordance with Standing Order 45 the Cathaoirleach is the sole judge of order in the Council and has power to deal with any matter not covered by Standing Orders. The Cathaoirleach will therefore have the power to adjudicate on any issue that arises in relation to the introduction of the facility for remote meetings by this Standing Order but will at all times strive to ensure so far as possible that members attending remotely enjoy the same level of participation and rights as those attending physically at a meeting.

Voting

- (14) A vote taken remotely in accordance with this Standing Order constitutes a valid vote towards the decision of the Council. All voting at a remote meeting shall be by way of roll call vote with every member being called upon to vote individually and their vote will then be recorded by the Meetings Administrator.
- (15) Where a member loses connectivity during a vote, every effort will be made to re-establish a connection. During this time, the voting roll call will continue. If a connection has not been restored by the end of the roll call, the member will be contacted and a period of five minutes will be allowed for him/her to vote by telephone call to the Meetings Administrator and confirmed by speaking to the Cathaoirleach and subject thereto, the vote will be recorded accordingly.

Leaving a Remote Meeting

(16) Members leaving the meeting are required to make every effort to inform the Cathaoirleach by appropriate means that they are exiting the meeting to ensure there is a Quorum remaining and so that it is not presumed to be a loss in connectivity.

Declaration of Interests

(17) Any Member participating in a remote meeting who declares a disclosable pecuniary or other beneficial interest, under Part 15 of the Local Government Act 2001, in any item of business that would normally require them to leave the room, must also leave the remote meeting, advising the Cathaoirleach and members at the time of departure and this shall be recorded in the minutes. Their departure will be confirmed by the Meetings Administrator, who will invite the relevant Member to re-join the meeting at the appropriate time. Their time of return shall be recorded in the Minutes.


Attendance of Public and Media at a Remote Meeting (Section 45(3) Local Government Act 2001 – 2014)

- (18) Members of the public and media may be present at a remote meeting but must maintain silence and observe any directions given by the Chair or by any employee in attendance.
- (19) Members of the media and public should give prior notice of joining a meeting remotely. To manage numbers and attendance, the meetings administrator will utilise electronic invitations compatible with the platform in use. Attendance numbers may be limited by the technology being utilised for the meeting.

MEETINGS IN COMMITTEE

- (20) In line with the provisions of Section 45 of the Local Government Act 2001, the Council may by resolution decide to meet in committee for the whole or part of the meeting concerned.
- (21) Should the Council elect to meet in Committee for some or all of the meeting the Meetings Administrator or person designated by him will ensure that there are no members of the public or media in remote attendance or remotely accessing the meeting or are able to hear or see the proceedings once the exclusion has been agreed by the meeting.
- (22) Where the Council has by resolution decided to meet in committee for the whole or part of the meeting concerned, each member participating remotely has personal responsibility to ensure and confirm to the Meetings Administrator, that there are no other persons present who are not entitled to be either hearing or seeing consideration of such items, and/or recording the proceedings contrary to Standing Order No. 62.
- (23) Remote attendance at in committee meetings will be recorded by the Meetings Administrator and confirmed by roll call with Members confirming their attendance and that there are no other persons present who are not entitled to either hear or see consideration of such items and are not recording same contrary to Standing Order No. 62.
- (24) For the avoidance of doubt where a member attending a meeting remotely loses connection for any period of time, the meeting may continue and nothing done during such period will be invalidated by the absence of the member's connection including where a vote is held during such period but this does not affect the member's entitlement to vote provided it is done as provided for in paragraph 15 above.
