In relation to the follow ups from the last Municipal District Meeting, Mr Sheerin noted these had been carried out as agreed.

CORPORATE SERVICES

2025 Schedule of Meetings

Mr Sheerin noted the Schedule of Meetings for 2025 was included in the circulated meeting pack.

Bundoran Waterworld CLG (4 No. Elected Members or their Nominees)

The Members agreed to defer the filling of the remaining position to the January Municipal District meeting.

HOUSING SERVICES

Staff Changes

Mr Sheerin acknowledged and thanked Caroline Britton (Staff Officer) and Barry Gallagher (Clerk of Works) for their work over the last number of years, wishing them well in their new posts. He welcomed Evelyn Sharpe to the position of Staff Officer.

Casual Vacancies

Mr Sheerin referred to the circulated Housing Report, taken as read. He advised the number of casual vacancies is now reduced to one, with a number of new/acquired units in Carnvalley and 2 houses at Clareden Drive expected to be dealt with in the early new year. Cllr Naughton welcomed the reduction in casual vacancies, noting it was the lowest he'd seen recorded, acknowledging the work of Mr Sheerin and his team. Mr. Sheerin paid tribute to the Housing Team for the progress in this area.

Changes to Grant Scheme

Mr Sheerin advised of new regulations and changes to the grant scheme effective for applications made after 1st December 2024, suggesting holding a workshop to go through the main changes, including increased income thresholds to qualify, renewed focus on means testing the owner as opposed to the applicant etc. He noted that applicants who have applied under the old scheme (pre 1st December 2024) can withdraw their application and apply under the new scheme if it is more beneficial to them. He advised the current 80/20 split between Council and Department will increase to 85/15, however the grant is financial assistance towards costs, therefore applicants will still need to contribute towards the overall costs. Members noted income limits and grants amount have increased.

Housing Capital

Ms T Quinn referred to the circulated Housing Capital Report, taken as read. She noted tenders for Laghey Development are currently being assessed, expected commencement onsite early January 2025 and the Road Safety audit consultant has been appointed for the site.

Derelict/Dangerous Buildings

Cllr Naughton raised concerns on the number of derelict and dangerous buildings throughout the County, citing they are eyesores and dangerous adding the €10k budgeted for 2025 is not adequate. Cllr Jordan noted that Limerick County Council are using CPO's to purchase derelict buildings and put them back in use. Mr Sheerin

advised the €10k budget is to be used for minimum safety measures required to leave the property safe. He suggested working in collaboration with the Regeneration Team to discuss powers for dereliction, possible CPO of derelict buildings etc, suggesting holding a workshop to discuss further. Cllr Brogan also supported using the CPO process to help to to deal with derelict buildings with a view to helping town and villages and the provision of social housing.

Flooding – Clareden Drive

Cllr Brogan suggested the Council consider flooding mitigation measures through flood proof doors and windows at the two houses purchased at Clareden Drive, Donegal Town as they are in a flood risk area. In response to same, Mr. Sheerin advised he would ask technical staff to consider same and noted that these two particular house have not yet been flooded as they are at a higher level that those that were flooded in this are before.

Electoral Register

Cllr McMahon asked that a letter is sent to the Department to review how the electoral register is currently being managed, he stated a number of people did not get polling cards which led to the low turnout at the recent general election. Mr. P Sheerin agreed to send correspondence to convey the views of the Members.

MDD/134/24 ROADS / TRANSPORTATION SERVICES REPORT

Mr Sweeney provided follow up on issues raised at the previous meeting:

- Arrangements for the Roads Workshop on the 22nd October 2024.
- This workshop proceeded as scheduled.
- Arrangements for Donegal Town Congestion Meeting on the 24th October 2024.
- This public meeting proceeded as scheduled.
- Provide clarifications on the Part 8 timelines.
- The Feasibility and Options Report (F&OR) for the Dunkineely Safety Scheme was submitted to the TII's Road Safety Inspection Engineer for consideration and approval on 30/10/2024

The various stages associated with the delivery of this project are:

- 1. The TII's Road Safety Inspection Engineer is currently assessing the F&OR
- 2. TII approve the F&OR.
- 3. Funding will be allocated at this point from the TII to deliver the works subject to approval of F&OR.

- 4. DCC Progress Preliminary Design Report (PDR) including details design, Stage 1 Road Stage Audit, Quality Audit and submit to TII.
- 5. TII approve PDR.
- DCC to progress the Part 8 planning for the works, ie briefing to the members, public consultation, briefing to Members at MD level before seeking Part 8 approval at plenary level.
- 7. Council approves the Part 8
- 8. DCC carry out a Stage 2 Road Safety Audit on the detailed design (which may include any observations made during the Part 8 process subject to design team consideration).
- 9. Progress with the Works
- Investigate the possibility of extending double yellow lines near the side entrance at the Permanent TSB. The area in question is on private lands but the Area Office will speak to the landowner to see if the double yellow lines being sought can be provided.
- Seek a meeting with TII to discuss dangerous junctions. The Road Design office and Road Safety Engineer are happy to facilitate a workshop with the Members and have asked for a date to be arranged.
- Provide the property owner at Clyhore with new sandbags.

These sandbags were provided.

 Progress the Christmas Lights allocations for Bundoran and Donegal Town.

The agreed allocations have been processed.

 Report the faulty streetlights and seek confirmation on the workforce numbers within Electric Skyline who will be operating in Donegal.

Electric Skyline have 1 supervisor and 4 electricians working on public lighting maintenance in the County. These electricians move around the County to wherever needed.

Note also there is a 14-day timeframe to resolve faulty lights but in some instances the fault may be more complex than simply replacing the lantern head and in these instances the contractor is to provide an update to the DCC team and advise of the fault, the reason why the timeframe will be exceeded and a likely timeframe for resolution. Electric Skyline also carries out patrols across the county to detect faulty lights along with reports from the public and elected members

The Dunkineely Safety Scheme

Cllr Boyle asked if An Garda Siochana could continue to keep –a presence at this location while we are waiting on the scheme to be delivered as it is slowing traffic down in the area. Mr Sweeney advised that this was discussed at the last collision prevention meeting with An Garda Siochana and they were asked to continue monitoring the area until the scheme is delivered.

Flooding Response

Cllr Kennedy mentioned that some of the property owners at Bridge Street in Killybegs that were affected by the flooding as a result of Storm Bert arranged their own dehumidifiers and asked for these to be covered by the Council.

Mr Sweeney advised that anyone who got their own dehumidifier should go back to where they hired it and ask them to send the bill to the Donegal County Council. Mr Sweeney also appealed to landowners to access their properties and ensure trees are in good condition or take necessary measures to make them safe especially along public roads and waterways.

Street Lighting

Cllr McMahon asked if there is an emergency contact when there is a problem with street lights at the weekend. Mr Sweeney advised there is a 14 day timeframe to resolve faulty lights, given the extent of the public lighting network in the County and lights are constantly being replaced. In relation to strategic lights, Mr Sweeney will enquire if they can be responded to quicker.

Eircom

Cllr McMahon suggested a meeting with Eircom, as there is a Pole at Lissacholly edging onto the road which has not been taken away, a sunk manhole at West End Bundoran and a damaged cover at the Handball Alley with a cone on top for over 6 months. Cllr Brogan agreed communications with the public and Councilors needs to be established. Mr Sweeney advised Uisce Éireann, Eir & ESB are responsible for their own covers/chambers, however if there are dangerous poles or manholes, they can be reported to him and he'll follow up with whoever is responsible.

Paddy McAteer

Cllr Kennedy acknowledged the work done by Mr Paddy McAteer in the Killybegs Roads Area and wished him well in his new role. Cllr Boyle reiterated this. Minutes of the Meeting of the Municipal District of Donegal on 10th December 2024

Crossing at Bruckless

Cllr Boyle noted his concerns relating to the crossing at Bruckless, stating it is an accident waiting to happen. Mr Sweeney stated the Council are working with NTA, who have done preliminary designs for a bus stop and shelters at this location and the crossing is being considered as part of this design. The lighting there is good and the area is within the 40kph speed zone and we would welcome anything that can be done to help make the crossing point safer.

Section 183 – Disposal of Lands at Sminver, Ballyshannon

Mr Sweeney advised there was a minor error on the area quoted on the Disposal of lands at Sminver, Ballyshannon which has been corrected and Members noted the amended Section 183 circulated with the Agenda.

On the proposal of Cllr McMahon, seconded by Cllr Naughton, the Section 183 – Disposal of Lands at Sminver, Ballyshannon Members confirmed their agreement to the amended Section 183 Notice which would be an item on the Agenda for the next meeting of the Plenary Council for consideration.

Section 183 – Disposal of Lands at Drumduff, Inver

Members noted the Section 183 notice circulated with the Agenda. On the proposal of Cllr Jordan, seconded by Cllr Kennedy, the Section 183 – Disposal of Lands at Drumduff, Inver, Members confirmed their agreement with same. Members noted that the Section 183 Notice would be an item on the Agenda for the next meeting of the Plenary Council for consideration.

MDD/135/24 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES REPORT

Mr McCrystal referred to the circulated Report, taken as read, highlighting the Buy Donegal marketing campaign, Donegal Tech Advocates Even, the Turning of sod for the start of enabling works at Lifford, opening up an opportunity site, expected to be completed in quarter 2 of 2025.

Mr McCrystal advised work is ongoing on a Donegal Tourism brochure for 2024, a new Donegal Gold Brochure and planned representation at the Holiday World Show in Dublin in January 2025. He highlighted the success of nighttime economy events and the Donegal Enterprise awards celebrating the best in Donegal Businesses in 2024.

Cllr Jordan thanked the staff of Economic Development for their work especially in relation to the buy Donegal promotion over the previous

weekend, he commended Donegal County Council for its role in promoting the businesses of Donegal.

Cllr McMahon congratulated Ballyshannon Chamber of Commerce on the fantastic display of 100 Christmas Trees in St Annes Church, the proceeds of which will purchase new bells for the Church. He asked that the Council send out a letter of congratulations to all involved, which was agreed.

Cllr Naughton referred to the Council's budget and thanked the executive of Donegal County Council for taking time out for consideration, he stated now is not the time to impose increase on businesses, as many of businesses are under pressure so he is delighted the Council are working with the people.

Cllr Kennedy thanked the Economic Directorate for their good work throughout the year, stating it is very valuable and has received great feedback.

MDD/136/24 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES REPORT

Litter & Waste

Ms Bogan referred to the circulated Report, taken as read. She highlighted that Donegal County Council were selected with two other Local Authorities to run a Free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day, which was held in Letterkenny Recycling Centre with almost 400 customers on the day with very positive feedback. She highlighted the Anti-Dumping initiative, teaming up with the #LoveDonegal Day campaign, household doorstep surveys, Irish Farm Film Producers Group – farm plastic recycling days where over a thousand tonne of plastics was collected.

Cllr McMahon requested a workshop with the Environment Section to discuss what can be done to deal with litter/illegal dumping. He noted legislation passed for CCTV to be installed at bottle banks and strategic areas, but this has not yet happened. He advised he is in discussions with Mr Sweeney regarding roadside cleanups on the Ballyshannon – Belleek and Bundoran to Ballyshannon roads, including health & safety implications/ traffic management, insurance required etc. Ms Bogan agreed to organise a workshop with the Council's Waste team.

Climate Action

Ms Bogan referred to the number of projects being funded under Strand 1 of the Building Low Carbon Communities and the Shared Island Community Climate Action (in partnership with Northern Ireland). Minutes of the Meeting of the Municipal District of Donegal on 10th December 2024

Flood Relief Schemes

Ms Bogan noted the status of flood relief schemes at Lifford, Ballybofey & Stranorlar, Buncrana & Ramelton.

Flooding at Pettigo

Cllr McMahon noted Pettigo was not mentioned in the list of flood relief schemes, citing a number of businesses had experienced flooding recently and suggested a joint meeting with Water Services in Northern Ireland to discuss a remedy. He asked for a workshop be arranged with all the representatives to discuss this.

Cllr Jordan advised John Feely is bringing a motion forward relating to the Pettigo Flooding, to the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council meeting the following day.

Cllr Naughton recalled a meeting with the OPW four years ago, with councillors from Fermanagh & Omagh District Council (Enniskillen DEA) where a guarantee was given that something would be done, however this never materialised. He suggested a meeting with Jim Casey (OPW) is required. He added hedge cutting only taking place twice yearly means there are more branches in rivers, which contributes to the flooding.

Flooding at Killybegs

Cllr Boyle thanked Staff of Donegal County Council for all their efforts in Killybegs, noting trees and debris still needs to be cleared out. He praised the Fire Service for the work they carried out to save the buildings.

Cllr Kennedy noted this is the third time Killybegs has been flooded and this will continue to happen unless a solution is found. She added the businesses and residents are delighted with the support they were given.

Cllr Jordan commended the staff of the Council and emergency services for their work at Killybegs. In the aftermath of Storm Darragh, he noted the dangerous conditions under which the ESB had to work under, to restore services so quickly for businesses and householders. He thanked the Water Section for restoring the Water after Storm Darragh. He welcomed Minister O'Donnell coming to Killybegs, and stated this scheme needs to be fast tracked, noting it is ongoing for 18 months and has multiple phases to go through, with little sign of respite for homeowners and businesses.

Ms Bogan agreed to relay these concerns (Pettigo and Killybegs) to the Senior Executive Engineer and Flood team and ask them to follow up directly with the Councillors. Mr Martin acknowledged the events of 23rd November 2024, advising that while storms are monitored closely, what happened in Killybegs was not predictable. He acknowledged the work of emergency services and the clean-up, citing the closing date of 9th January for applications to the humanitarian relief scheme. He confirmed funding will be provided for dehumidifiers. Mr Martin acknowledged the work of those who responded on the day, including Roads, Fire Services and Housing who were on-site on the day, the response from DSP, DET and Minister O'Donnell who visited Killybegs in a bid to get the scheme moving to progression. He advised a meeting will take place (Council & OPW staff) to discuss interim mitigation measures and the long-term scheme required.

Proposal to Lease property at Donegal PSC (Section 183)

Ms Bogan asked to note the Section 183 notice from the Council's Property Management Section, regarding the leasing of property at Donegal PSC to Uisce Éireann. Members noted that this Section 183 notice would be an agenda item on the Agenda for the Plenary Council meeting in January 2025.

Public Toilets, Donegal Town

Cllr Naughton stated the public toilets in Donegal Town are not fit for purpose and things are moving too slowly to resolve this issue. He noted there is nothing in the budget for public toilets and requested a proposal on how to resolve this issue is brought to the January meeting.

Cllr Boyle agreed, adding there are no public disabled toilets in the town, and suggested that the HSE building could provide a fob to disabled users out of hours, if this could be arranged.

Cllr Kennedy suggested the HSE Building is too far from the town centre, she noted at a previous SPC meeting, it was proposed to seek an agreement with a Hotel in the town centre, to provide toilet facilities which the Council would subsidise, and asked Ms Bogan to discuss with Director Michael McGarvey, to see if any progress can be made on this.

Ms Bogan to follow up on this and revert to the Councillors.

Murvagh Walk

Cllr Naughton commended the Environment Section and Coilte for the outstanding work done at Murvagh, stating it was very much needed in the area.

Farm Plastic Recycling.

Cllr Brogan noted the price of plastic disposal has increased a lot. Ms Bogan advised the Council are not involved with the charging of fees, but would seek clarification from IFFPG regarding same and revert to Cllr Brogan.

MDD/137/24 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING SERVICES

Mr Doherty referred to the circulated Report, taken as read, highlighting the Community Trails Plan, Donegal Youth Council elections, CLÁR 2024 launch with Measure 1 open at the moment.

Donegal Craft Village

Cllr Naughton asked Mr Doherty if a workshop could be organised with the Craft Village residents, to discuss their concerns in relation to fencing, painting, vacant units etc. He advised there are 14 businesses there and they want support and direction from the Council.

Mr Doherty confirmed he is in discussions with Mr McCrystal regarding the Craft Village and will organise a meeting as soon as possible.

Sliabh Liag

Cllr Naughton requested a meeting in relation to Sliabh Liag to discuss visitors fees.

Mr Doherty confirmed that he has committed to a workshop on Sliabh Liag and will be sitting down in the coming months to discuss the implication of the bye laws there.

Planning

Ms A Quinn noted the reports circulated with the Agenda and confirmed Planning clinics resumed in person, with dates published on the new Council website. She advised the Development Contribution Scheme is going to be put forward at the next Plenary meeting. She advised Casual Trading workshops will be setup in January, with proposals to be brought to the Plenary meeting.

2. House Acquisition and Buy and Renew Programme

The construction works are near complete on 2no. 3 bed properties in Donegal Town. An ESB connection and any other minor works are to be finished to allow for the allocation of these properties in January 2025.

The Council has commenced the conveyancing process for a Tenant-in-situ acquisition in Donegal Town.

3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

The Council has a current county-wide turnkey acquisition process open, which will remain open until the 30th of September 2026. ETenders (reference RFT 2461070) refers, where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions are currently being accepted and must be made in accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation.

Proposals are being accepted for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units in towns or villages throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

Council staff are currently engaging with a number of Developers in the Donegal MD. Information and guidance are being provided on an individual basis to Developers to guide them through the process. This is a competitive tender process and therefore, specific details can only be shared upon receipt of a final tender.

Separately, Members are aware of a further turnkey proposal at Drumrooske, Donegal Town for 35 units. Contracts have been signed and the Developer, AMPCO Builders Co. Ltd. has commenced works. The development will be completed in 2 phases with Phase 1 comprising 25 units and Phase 2 comprising 10 units.

4. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available. In the Donegal MD, the following provides an update:

- 1. An offer to acquire lands in Ballyshannon has been agreed, subject to contract and availability of utility connections.
- 2. Additional lands are being considered across Donegal MD and Members will be informed of same upon the Council progressing to make offers to acquire.

Inward Investment Brochure

The Economic Development team are currently progressing work to develop a new brochure promoting the value proposition for inward investment in County Donegal and highlighting County Donegal as a great place to live, work, study and do business. This brochure will be available in print and digital format.

Inward Investment/Relocation Marketing Campaign

Donegal County Council is working with marketing agency BigO on a new marketing campaign promoting Donegal as a great place to live, work, study, invest and do business. The campaign will include a new hero video, short videos/reels, social media and website promotion of County Donegal. The campaign will start to roll out in early December, with a launch event to take place in advance. Details to be confirmed soon. This campaign will be a follow-on campaign building upon the success of the previous #MovetoDonegal relocation campaign.

Donegal Emigrants Working Lives in Scotland: The Economic Development Team alongside DCC Culture Division hosted events in Edinburgh and Glasgow to explore the stories of Donegal Emigrants who worked in Scotland and commemorating the ordinary people from the Irish community who contributed to Scottish communities and industry that has often been overlooked or considered too ordinary to be recorded. The series of events was very successful with a high turn out from the Irish community in both cities capturing a variety of important and unique stories of our cultural heritage. Plans are ongoing to expand this project further to mark the 850th birthday of Glasgow with support from the Irish Consulate Service.

#BuyDonegal: The #BuyDonegal / #CeannaighDúnnanGall campaign ran for four weeks, from November 25th to December 20th. During this time, we hosted two live radio broadcasts with Highland and Ocean FM, highlighting the diverse array of exceptional businesses throughout the county. Additionally, we shared weekly features on social media to amplify these businesses online.

Donegal Tech Advocates: Donegal County Council, in collaboration with regional stakeholders, developed and launched the Donegal Tech Advocates group in April 2024. The focus of this group is to promote, grow and empower the dynamic and innovative tech sector across the county. The third Donegal Tech Advocates event took place in Donegal ETB Letterkenny with the theme "The Opportunities and Challenges for Tech in Donegal" which saw three companies present on their experiences and resources utilised for upskilling their staff. The final event takes place on the 28th of November hosted by Optum.

Business Concierge Service

Board and Corporate Governance

The Board of Donegal 2040 DAC is continuing to meet on a regular basis to progress a range of areas including the below.

Update on Projects:

ALPHA Innovation is an initiative of *Donegal 2040 DAC*, supported by *Donegal County Council's Economic Development Unit* and *Enterprise Ireland*. It was set up to accelerate and enable ambitious individuals, SME businesses, startups & scaleups to innovate and build globally ambitious ventures across the county.

Donegal businesses take part in Go-To-Market Lab in Boston

Entrepreneurs from the North West City Region, will prepare for scaling their start-ups and refine their Go-To-Market export strategy. This program is tailored for high-growth enterprises poised to expand internationally. While in the US, founders will be based in the renowned *Cambridge Innovation Centre (CIC)*, where they will have the opportunity to stress-test their business models with US experts and sharpen their value propositions.

Participation is fully funded, and qualifying companies can claim up to 50% off flights and accommodation subject to meeting the conditions of Donegal LEO.

Alpha Innovation Centre and Beta Business Centre

Current Status: Enabling works / Demolition works on site completed. Main construction contract to be tendered. Estimated project completion date: Q4 2026, subject to funding.

Remote Working Hub Carrigart:

US Trade Mission 2024 & Golden Bridges

The US Trade Mission took place from 11th to 15th November 2024 and was a very successful trade mission that incorporated both meetings and events showcasing the North West City Region.

This year's North West City Region delegation included representatives from both Donegal County Council and Derry City and Strabane District Council, with both the Mayor of Derry City and Strabane District Council, Cllr. Lillian Seenoi Barr and Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council, Cllr. Niamh Kennedy attending along with Chief Executives, John G. McLaughlin and John Kelpie, Directors of Service and Heads of Departments and Kevin Sexton of Alpha Innovation. Representatives from the North West Tertiary Education Cluster along with representatives from Udarás na Gaeltachta also attended.

The objective is to raise the profile of the North West City Region in the US and promote the region's value proposition for inward investment and deliver the Pathfinder II programme supporting businesses who wish to scale into the US market.

US Trade Mission Activities 2024:

- On 11th November, the delegation attended a welcome reception at the Donegal Philadelphia Association Diaspora Centre where there was an opportunity to build relationships with the Diaspora and raise awareness of the value proposition of the NWCR from an economic development perspective.
- Organised through our membership of the IABCN (Irish American Business Chamber and Network) in Philadelphia the delegation attended a reception at Philadelphia City Hall hosted by Mayor Parker's Chief of Staff, Pierre-Olivier on 12th November. This was an opportunity to strengthen the economic relations between Philadelphia and the NWCR.
- A visit to Project HOME, an initiative of Sister Mary Scullion took place on 12th November. This project looks at housing, employment, medical care and education for those who are homeless.
- The delegation travelled to Villanova University on 12th November, where the Mayor and Cathaoirleach took part in a panel discussion on 'women in leadership' moderated by Professor

of Politics, Cera Murtagh. This was followed by a meeting with Dr. Anthony Green, MedTech/Innovation expert at Benjamin Franklin Technology Centre.

- On Wednesday 13th November, the delegation travelled to Boston and attended a State House reception hosted by Senator Nick Collins where they discussed opportunities to collaborate with the NWCR. A visit to JFK library followed.
- On Thursday 14th November, the delegation participated in a NWCR business breakfast discussion moderated by Invest NI Chair, John Healy and co-hosted by the Irish Consulate and British Consulate offices in Boston. This was followed by a 'Speaker Series' event hosted by the Irish Consul General, Sighle Fitzgerald. This included a discussion with the Mayor and Cathaoirleach moderated by Mary Murphy, Irish Institute, Boston College covering a range of topics highlighting the benefits of investing in the NWCR.
- On the afternoon of 14th November, the Mayor/Cathaoirleach, Chief Executives and Directors of Service met with Governor Maura Healey at the State House to discuss the NWCR in terms of FDI, Diaspora, key sectors and to discuss collaboration opportunities between the US and the NWCR.
- The NWCR Irish Consulate evening reception and presentation of the Golden Bridges Awards took place on 14th November.
- The annual Golden Bridges Conference took place on 15th November 2024, and this included several panel discussions on the economic opportunities in the NWCR.
- Pathfinder II is a programme designed to support businesses who wish to enter the US market. It is as a result of collaborative partnership between Donegal County Council and Derry City & Strabane District Council under the North West Strategic Trade and Investment Programme 2024. 6 businesses participated in Pathfinder II in 2024.

INTERREG Europe Project

Green Hydra

The Green Hydra project focusing on the barriers and opportunities around innovation in hydrogen as a renewable energy source kicked off in April 2024. The scope of this project is to improve national, regional or local policies for involving SME's across the whole hydrogen value chain. The first in person partner Steering Committee meeting took place in Ravenna, Italy on 18th and 19th September and this included a capacity building workshop focused on 'Understanding the green hydrogen value chain', a study visit to Marina di Ravenna Energy and Sea Research Centre and SAPIR port terminal to see how other regions are working with green hydrogen as a renewable energy source.

The first Regional Multistakeholder meeting will be held in Colab Letterkenny on Thursday January 23rd at 1030 to look at the Hydrogen Landscape in Ireland and areas for collaboration in Donegal. 
Information Services (IS)

National Broadband Plan

The rollout of the NBP continues in County Donegal. This is a government investment of €128m into the telecommunications infrastructure in the county, bringing fibre broadband to every premises in the Intervention Area.

The Letterkenny, Creeslough, Termon, St. Johnston, Bunbeg, Fintown and small Island deployment areas are complete and actively connecting customers.

These deployment areas cover 14,373 premises or 43% of the Intervention Area. Network build is in progress in the 5 deployment areas of Carndonagh, Buncrana, Moville, Bundoran, Ballyshannon, totalling 8,786 premises or 26% of the IA. Surveying is complete in the Ardara, Killybegs, Arranmore & Tory Island deployment areas covering 3,609 premises or 11% of the IA. Surveying is now underway in the Donegal and Pettigo Deployment areas of 3,424 premises, or 10% of the IA. 3,207 premises, or 9% of the IA, in the deployment area of Ballybofey/Stranorlar are at survey pending stage. NBI are currently planning Active Equipment Module builds on the islands to connect to the mainland. 

BUNDORAN WATERWORLD REFURBISHMENT

1. Background

Bundoran Waterworld (BWW) complex is wholly owned by Donegal County Council and is managed through an Appendix 8 company, Bundoran Waterworld Company Limited By Guarantee. The Directors on this Board include five Council nominees, four by the elected members and one by the Chief Executive, as well as 3 local business representatives.

Turnover for the financial year ending 31^{st} December 2023 was €988,000, an increase of €105,000 on the previous year. Staff numbers include 3 full time, permanent staff year-round and which for 2024 saw the employment of 42 seasonal staff, with the season generally running from Easter to the end of August each year. The centre is largely self financing, requiring a modest contribution of €9,439 from the Council in 2023 to allow it to trade on a break even basis, a reduction from the still modest €18,841 required for the 2022 trading year.

The Center is acknowledged by businesses in the Bundoran and surrounding areas as the critical tourism product infrastructure that draws and holds day-visitors and longer stay tourists in the area, thus supporting the core hospitality industry that Bundoran is based upon. This is evidenced in the most recently completed financial year accounts where 69,441 visitors contributed to the turnover figure of €988,000 at the centre itself. The bulk of activity takes place in the July & August periods each year but the facility's opening in the Easter to June period supports wider footfall to Bundoran during this shoulder season period.

The inclement weather experienced during Summer 2024, was negated somewhat by this wet-weather facility that allowed visitors to experience a critical tourism product. It is widely acknowledged by businesses themselves that BWW was a saviour for many ancillary providers in Bundoran during Summer 2024, with footfall that would not have occurred otherwise.

2. Introduction to Investment Requirement

Opened initially in 1991, the centre is now approaching 34 years of activity. While there has been an ongoing minor capital investment programme, a number of areas of infrastructure are reaching obsoletion/end of life or are no longer fit for purpose to meet visitor expectations. These can largely be categorized into two areas of work, namely;

- Extension and refurbishment of changing village and associated works and
- Installation of new Air Handling Unit (AHU) in pool area.

Both of these investments are critical in their own right, the changing village to

increase capacity and thus turnover, as well as to modernize the facilities to current day expectations. The AHU in the pool area is the original installed at initial build and is a mission critical piece of infrastructure in that, should it fail, the centre cannot open (such an instance occurred recently in another leisure centre in Ireland). It was originally intended to leave the AHU replacement until later but inspections which took place associated with the Changing village project led to the conclusion by Council engineers, as advised by external advisors, that there was a critical necessity for its early replacement.

In that context two tenders were commenced in Q4 2024 for the procurement of contractors to deliver the necessary works.

3. <u>Project Description</u>

a) Changing Village and associated works

The project consists of the extension of the entrance area to include a new reception and viewing area, the extension and refurbishment of the changing area to include the supply and installation of new cubicles, lockers, showers, toilets, tiling and other miscellaneous items at Waterworld as indicated in the contract documentation.

The works shall primarily consist of the following:

- Removal of existing cubicles
- Removal of existing lockers (to be safely stored for future use)
- Removal of existing floor tiling and tile skirting
- Removal of sanitary ware (existing showers to be safely stored for future use)
- Installation of new tiling
- Installation of new cubicles
- Installation of existing lockers
- Installation of new sanitary ware
- Disabled access upgrade
- Upgrading ventilation system
- Redirecting of existing electrical and drainage services affected by works.
- Reconfiguration of first floor layout
- Extension to front elevation
- All plumbing, electrical and builders work associated with the above.

Miscellaneous Works:

The works will/may involve working adjacent to and around existing services including: - ESB & Eircom cables.

The tender assessment process for this has been completed and an agreed tender in the sum of €1,836,181 excl. VAT has been received. Associated consultancy and design costs for these works, previously procured, amount to €59,700 excl. VAT.

b) Air Handling Unit in Pool Area

The project consists of the replacement of the existing Pool Hall AHU sections with a new efficient system incorporating a heat recovery block with bypass, new EC fans, recirculation damper and low temp LPHW heating coil to future proof to be capable of operating with future heat pump technology integration.

The works shall primarily consist of the following:

- Removal of the existing pool hall AHU sections.
- Temporary support of the existing ductwork while new fan sections are installed internally.
- Supply, installation and commissioning of new Heat recovery block with bypass, new EC fans, recirculation damper and low temp LPHW heating coil to future proof for potential Heat Pump integration.
- Builders work to include groundworks for relocating 2 No. Inspection Chambers.
- Ground preparation for concrete raft to support external Heat recovery block.
- Structural steel support interlinking ductwork between internal and external AHU sections.
- Creating and making good new and old openings in the existing cladding on the north & west facades of the building.
- Modification and reconnection to existing internal ductwork and painted to match existing.
- New BMS controller for AHU to integrate on to existing BMS.
- All plumbing & electrical works associated with the above.

Miscellaneous Works:

The works will/may involve working adjacent to and around existing services including: - ESB & Eircom cables.

The tender assessment process for this is nearing completion with a tender sum of €379,352 excl. VAT. Associated and mandated consultancy costs for this project amount to €66,390.

The nature of some of the works allow for grant application funding from SEAI through its pathfinder programme. There is a confidence from engagement with the required energy consultants for this scheme that it is grant eligible and in that context it is estimated that a capital grant in respect of the incorporated energy efficiency contributing investments in the amount of approximately €350,000 will be realized.

4. <u>Council contribution required & proposed funding source.</u>

The net contribution required from the Council for both projects, taking account of grants and without allowing any further contingency costs, is therefore \pounds 1,991,623.

It is proposed, subject to the agreement of the members, to reassign a portion of a €4m approved, but not assigned capital loan, approved in May 2022, to co-finance this.

This came about as a result of the Council ring-fencing at that time, based upon best understandings, a sum of €4m co-financing required for the Council's public lighting programme. In the intervening period, a significant portion of the public lighting retrofit programme has been achieved through annual maintenance programmes (funded from own-resources), with future works to be funded in-part by external grants and in-part through the annual maintenance programme. There will be a need to continue to invest in the county's public lighting infrastructure. However, it is not expected that there will be a requirement to fund these works through borrowing in the immediate term.

In that context, the Council is asked to approve of the reassignment of a proportion of this unrequired €4m loan in the sum of €1,991,623 to cover the co-financing costs of these two projects.

Ireland is undergoing an epidemic related to loneliness and social isolation within the population as a whole, with some 20% of the general population reporting to be lonely in an EU survey carried out in 2022.

The traditional sense of 'community' prevalent amongst rural farmers for many generations has suffered a significant decline in the past 20 years due to increased machinery use, intensive farming schedules, off-farm employment, health issues, technology, and the changing demographics of the group. This has led to a spike in isolation, loneliness, and hidden mental health challenges. Donegal Volunteer Centre in partnership with Healthy Donegal is aiming to promote personal and community development, upskilling and social network development in farmers aged 55+ who are only working/living on the farm and have no off-farm employment and who lack other social outlets.

Foroige **Civic Play Project** Healthy Donegal in partnership with Foróige works to enable young people to involve themselves consciously and actively in their personal development and in the development of society. Using outdoor recreational areas - 'Earn Zone' sites identified as part of Healthy Donegal's Civic Dollars Project, this project aims to help participants Build self-esteem and confidence through challenging experiences, Develop the ability to manage personal and social relationships, Participants recently took part in a one day Be Wild Be Free Forest skills workshop at a specially designated camp at Ards Friary Forest and Beach. Response:	The Members are advised that Department of Agriculture Food and the Marine has published "A Guide for Landowners to Managing Roadside Trees" and the advice noted in same is that the trees on your land are your property and as a landowner you are responsible for their care. Ensure that you are aware of the full legal extent of your land ownership. Land ownership normally extends to the centre of the road; therefore, it is the landowner not the local authority who is responsible for the trees and hedges beside the road. Also, the Roads Act 1993 requires owners or occupiers of land to take all reasonable steps to ensure that trees or other vegetation on their land are not a hazard to persons using a public road. Local authorities may issue notices to landowners requesting them to maintain or cut back trees or hedges.
